### THE GAME

• The Drake University football team hosts Davidson on Saturday at 1 p.m. for the first time since 2011 when the Bulldogs routed the Wildcats 51-14.

• Saturday's contest is the ninth meeting between Drake and Davidson and the first between the programs since 2014. The Bulldogs lead the series, 7-1, and are 4-0 at Drake Stadium.

• The Bulldogs are coming off hard fought road 19-14 win at Marist last week and improved to 4-3 overall and 3-1 in Pioneer Football League play. Davidson fell to Dayton, 48-22, last week, extending its losing streak to four games and its PFL skid to 12 games. The Wildcats' last win over a FCS team was also their last PFL win as they beat Stetson in their 2015 season finale.

• Senior quarterback Grant Kraemer took a few lumps during non-conference play, but has used those lumps to get out to a stellar start in conference play. Over the last four games, Kraemer is averaging 276 yards passing while completing more than 56 percent of his passes; compared to averaging 216 yards and 58 percent in the first three games of the season. He missed most of the second-half in last week's win over Marist due to injury but was on his way to another 300-yard performance as he threw for 144 yards and completed 12-of-19 passes.

• Heading into the season, head coach Rick Fox knew the potential of his young receiving group had and they have shown what they are capable of. The Bulldogs' trio of wide receivers—sophomore Mitch McFarlane and juniors Devin Cates and Steven Doran—rank in the top-15 in receiving yards in the PFL. McFarlane is leading the group with 33 receptions for 523 yards and three touchdowns, but will most likely miss the rest of the season due to injury. Doran has also caught three touchdowns to go with his 26 receptions for 375 yards, while Cates has tallied 23 catches for 321 yards and two touchdowns.

• The Bulldog defense has proven to be one of the best in the PFL. In conference play, the Bulldogs have only allowed seven touchdowns in four games and lead the PFL in total defense (312.8 ypg.), first downs (66), third-down conversion (33.9%) and sacks (9).

• The Wildcats are led by freshman running back Wesley Dugger, who leads the PFL with an average of 103 yards rushing per game and is averaging more than five yards per carry.

## DONLEY AND LYNCH EARN PFL WEEKLY HONORS

- Danny Donley and Sean Lynch earned their first-career weekly Pioneer Football League honors, the league announced on Sunday, Oct. 22.
- Donley was named PFL Special Teams Player of the Week as he was responsible for 13 points in the Bulldogs' 19-14 PFL victory against Marist on Saturday. He connected on all four of his

field goals, becoming one of seven kickers in the FCS this season to go perfect while making four or more field goals. Donley connected on kicks of 20, 30, 27 and 22 yards in addition to making his lone PAT try. He is the first Bulldogs kicker to make four field goals in a game since Billy Jensen in 2011.

• Lynch was awarded PFL Defensive Player of the Week as he intercepted a pair of passes to help Drake win a PFL defensive battle. His first interception stopped a Marist drive just before it entered Drake territory in the second quarter. Lynch's second pick came in the fourth quarter and halted the Red Foxes at the Drake 15-yard line. He also had a game-high 11 tackles (eight solo). Lynch's lone tackle for loss also provided a pivotal stop, coming on 4th-and-1 at the Drake 23-yard line and forcing a turnover on downs to start the second quarter.

## BULLDOGS ANNOUNCE HISTORICAL CHINA TOUR

The agenda is expected to include a public celebration of American football, including youth football clinics; volunteer service work; visits to the U.S. Embassy, Forbidden City, and Des Moines' "sister city" of Shijiazhuang; and a challenging hike along the Great Wall of China.

#### KRAEMER HAS CAREER-DAY

• Senior Grant Kraemer recorded a career-high 28 completions and 445 yards passing in the Bulldogs 38-11 win over Valparaiso (Sept. 23). Kraemer was 11 passing yards away from breaking Mike Grejbowski's 47-year-old record of 455 yards.

#### KRAEMER TIES PROGRAM RECORD

• Senior Grant Kraemer threw six touchdown pass to lead the Bulldogs past Southwestern (Kan.) 55-14 on Sept. 9. Kraemer's six touchdown passes tied Ira Vandever's performance against San Deigo in 2002.

#### STRENGTH IN THE TRENCHES

• The Bulldogs' defensive and offensive line returned nine players that have at least 12 career starts, led by five 2016 all-PFL selections.

• Fifth-year seniors Mack Marrin, Tanner Evans, Ximi Asani and senior Nathan Clayberg have a combined 69 starts. Marrin, who is a three-time all-PFL selection, leads the quartet with 32 career starts. Evans, who is the team's top returning tackler, and Clayberg were honorable mention all-PFL selections last year as well.

• Offensively, Ryan Lemke, Jordan Lewinsky, Grant Snow and Payson Wick have a combine 71 starts under their belts. Lemke and Wick, who were named team captains, are coming off honorable mention all-PFL honors last season.

#### WALLEN EARNS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN HONORS

• Coming off finishing second in 2016, punt returner Terry Wallen was named third-team STATS FCS Preseason All-America in July.

• Last year, he finished with a 14.8-yard average per punt return. Wallen returned 16 punts for 236 yard to earn All-Pioneer Football honorable mention honors.

#### BATTLE AGAINST THE MVFC

• The Bulldogs will play two MVFC opponents, South Dakota and South Dakota State, during the non-conference portion of the schedule for the first time since 2007.

• The last time Drake defeated an MVFC foe was in 2007 in a season opening victory at Illinois State.

• Drake hosting South Dakota in to open the season is the first time MVFC team has come to Drake Stadium on Week 1 since Northern Iowa came away with a 48-7 win over the Bulldogs in the 2006 opener.

## THE LAST MEETING

DES MOINES, Iowa – Propelled by 606 yards of total offense, the Drake University football dominated both sides of the ball in a 51-14 win over Davidson on Saturday afternoon at Drake Stadium to extend its Pioneer Football League home win streak to 18 games.

Drake (3-3, 2-1 PFL) scored on its first five possessions of the first half and never slowed down in its fifth-straight win over Davidson (1-6, 0-3 PFL).

The Bulldogs' offensive onslaught was keyed by a season-high 343 rushing yards thanks to Conley Wilkins' (Overland Park, Kan.) 110 yards and three touchdowns. The 100-yard performance was the second of the sophomore's career. Gary Scott, Jr. (Forsyth, Ill.) added 83 yards on the ground.

Despite being overshadowed by the running game, Matthew Denning (Wichita, Kan.) caught four passes for 125 and his first two career touchdowns. Both of those touchdown passes came from Andy Rice (Stevens Point, Wis.) who was 11-of-15 passing for 216 yards and three scores before leaving the game in the third quarter.

Defensively, the Bulldogs surrendered a scant 163 total yards and were only on the field for 54 snaps as Davidson mustered 10 first downs with eight of them coming after the contest had been decided. Michael VanKat (Omaha, Neb.) and the defensive line helped keep Davidson on its heels all afternoon as he registered two of the team's four sacks and three of its seven tackles for loss.

Davidson had a pair of defenders finish with 11 tackles as Ricky Tkac and Matt Casey attempted to slow the Bulldogs' offense.

The Bulldogs jumped out to a 30-0 halftime lead in thoroughly controlling both sides of the ball with 320 total yards of offense to Davidson's 34 in the opening half. Able to run the ball at will, the offense eclipsed its previous season high rushing total with 182 rushing yards in the half and scored on its first five possessions of the game.

Wilkins had 77 of those early yards and a pair of touchdowns to lead the first-half attack with T.J. James (Des Moines, Iowa) adding 73 yards on 14 carries.

The Bulldogs wasted little time in getting on the scoreboard as Wilkins scored on the team's sixth play from scrimmage on an 18-yard burst through the defense. The 6-play, 64-yard drive was ignited by a 29-yard Rice to Menard strike to get into Davidson territory. The ensuing drive saw Denning record his first career touchdown as he snagged a pass in the endzone from a scrambling Rice from the Davidson 29-yard line.

The defense's ability to control Davidson and only allow two first downs in the half continually set the offense up with prime field position, thanks in large part to three first-half sacks.

The Bulldogs' lone long drive of the half spanned 96 yards on 18 plays and ended with Wilkins darting into the endzone from the 4-yard line to put Drake up 21-0. The following drive culminated with Keegan Gallery's (Stillwell, Kan.) first career touchdown on a 10-yard pass from Rice. Benjamin Tesson (Fenton, Mo.) added a 25-yard field goal in the final minutes of the half to add to the Bulldogs' lead.

The second half was more of the same as Drake scored on its fourth play from scrimmage on Denning's second touchdown catch of the day, a 27-yard reception from Rice to go up 37-0. That quick 87-yard drive that lasted 2:40 was primed by a 51-yard completion to Michael Hudson (Urbandale, Iowa).

Davidson answered with its first score as a 59-yard kickoff return from Austin Wells gave the Wildcats solid field position. Five plays later quarterback John Cook hit Jeffrey Keil for a 4-yard touchdown to break up the shut out.

That score did little to shift any momentum as Drake's James carried five times for 35 yards on the next drive, engineered by quarterback Cody Thibault (Lone Tree, Colo.), before diving in from the 3-yard line to put Drake up 44-7. One the first play of the fourth quarter, Wilkins added his final score of the day on a 33-yard run to account. Midway through the quarter, Davidson tacked on a touchdown on a 5-yard Keil rush before the Bulldogs salted away the game with 11 rushes in its last two possessions to prevail in convincing fashion.

DES MOINES, Iowa – The Drake University football team couldn't overcome a quick start by visiting South Dakota as the Coyotes topped the Bulldogs, 77-7, in the 2017 season opener Saturday at Drake Stadium.

"South Dakota played a great game and for a first game, they played a flawless game. We didn't play disciplined, poised football. We made a lot of mistakes in every phase of the game and we can't do that against a good team like South Dakota. So we are going to come back, work hard, get better and move forward," said Drake head coach Rick Fox.

The Coyotes wasted little time getting out to an early lead, scoring the game's first touchdown in less than two minutes into the contest. South Dakota didn't slow down as it jumped out to a 28-0 lead in the first quarter.

The Bulldogs saw their offense show what it could do on their first drive of the second quarter. Senior quarterback Grant Kraemer helped orchestrate the 11-play 80-yard scoring drive by completing three passes for 45 yards. Senior running back Tyler Updegraff capped off the drive with a one-yard touchdown run, cutting Drake's deficit to 28-7.

USD's fast paced offense never slowed down in the first half as it scored on eight of its nine first-half possessions to take a 56-7 halftime lead. Chris Streveler led the Coyotes' offense, completing 17-of-24 passes for 248 yards and five touchdowns. The dual-threat quarterback also rushed for 53 yards.

The Bulldogs couldn't get anything going offensively in the second half. The Coyotes used a pick-six and took advantage of good field position to tack on two more touchdowns in the final two quarters for a final score of 77-7.

DES MOINES, Iowa - Senior quarterback Grant Kraemer tied the program record with six touchdown passes to lead the Drake University football team past Southwestern College (Kan.), 55-14, Saturday night at Drake Stadium.

Kraemer's six touchdown passes tied Ira Vandever's performance against San Deigo in 2002. Kraemer ended up throwing for 313 yards and completed 20-of-27.

"Grant did a great job. He managed the offense really well, he didn't force it and that's what you got to do, especially as a mature quarterback," said Drake head coach Rick Fox. "We've got a nice young group of receivers and it was good for them to have some success tonight and feel that, because we think that group looks pretty good moving forward."

Sophomore Mitch McFarlane led the young receiving corps with seven catch for 152 yards and three touchdowns. Fellow sophomore Daeonte Calvert caught four passes for 45 yards.

The Bulldogs wasted little time to get on top of the Moundbuilders as Kraemer completed 66-yard touchdown pass to McFarlane on the second play of the game.

The Bulldogs were put in exceptional field position to start the second-quarter because of Cooper Christiano's first career interception that ended the opening quarter.

On the first play of the second-quarter, Kraemer found Devin Cates in the middle of the end zone for his first career touchdown catch and put Drake up 14-0.

The Bulldogs' offense was put in good field position again, but this time courtesy of the special teams. Cates got his hand on SC's Mario Esparza punt, resulting in a 17-yard punt and putting DU's offense on Southwestern's 42-yard line.

Kraemer and company took full advantage of the short field as Kraemer threw a 14-yard touchdown pass to senior Cole Neary to extend Drake's lead 21-0.

On the Bulldogs' next possession, Kraemer orchestrated six-play 65-yard scoring drive, which was capped off by a 25-yard touchdown pass to McFarlane.

The Moundbuilders managed to get on the broad late in the second-quarter and then took advantage of a Bulldog miscue in the final minute to cut their deficit to 28-14 at halftime.

“We love playing these guys, because South Dakota State is such a good program. It helps raise our level of play to go against a program like this. They deserve the ranking they have and we wish them the best moving forward. We hope to continue this series in the future,” said Drake head coach Rick Fox. “We were much better today than we were two weeks ago against South Dakota in terms of reducing the mental mistakes against a high-quality opponent. DES MOINES, Iowa – An outstanding second-half defensive performance and over 500 yards of total offense propelled the Drake University football team past Valparaiso, 38-13, Saturday at Drake Stadium in its Pioneer Football League opener.

The Bulldog defense put on the clamps on the Crusaders in the second-half as it only allowed 57 yards of total offense in the final two quarters. Drake limited Valpo, who averaged over 400 yards of total offense, to just 294 yards for the entire game and forced three turnovers.

“The way our defense plays, it took us some time to adjust but man were they lights out in the second-half. That’s Drake defense and that’s what we expect from them,” said Drake head coach Rick Fox. “I thought our defensive backs played really well, but in the second-half our defensive line just wore them down and took over the lines of scrimmage and that’s what we’ve got to have from those guys.”

Drake recorded a season-best 567 yards of total offense. Senior quarterback Grant Kraemer paced the offense with a career-high 28 completions for a career-best 445 yards passing. Sophomore Mitch McFarlane led the receivers with seven catches for 118 yards, while senior Connor Ostrander also hauled in seven passes for 73 yards. Juniors Devin Cates and Steven Doran each recorded a touchdown while totaling 70 and 84 receiving yards, respectively.

“Grant did a great job and honestly it was all set up from our offensive line by not allowing a sack today. They gave him time back there and Grant did a great job managing the offense. That’s what we need him to do, because then his skills and our playmakers come out when he does that,” said Fox.

The Crusaders struck first using a nine-play 75-yard touchdown drive on the game’s opening possession.

The Bulldogs answered right back as Kraemer capped off the 11-play 74-yard drive with a two-yard touchdown run.

On Drake’s next possession, Kraemer completed 32-yard touchdown pass to Doran to put the Bulldogs up 14-6.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. – The Drake University football team used a strong start to earn a 27-16 victory at Butler Saturday afternoon.

After missing his first attempt, Grant Kraemer went to complete his next 11 passes for 172 yards, including two touchdowns in Drake's first three drives. With the help of solid protection up front, Kraemer was able to push the ball down field with 10 of his 11 completions going for 10 or more yards.

"Grant did a great job today. If Grant keeps working the offense, man he is going to make us move, because he can throw the ball around," said Drake head coach Rick Fox. "As long as he keeps doing that and we can accentuate our playmakers and our offensive line plays well, we are going to be alright."

Tyler Updegraff plunged into the endzone to cap off Drake's first drive, giving the Bulldogs a 7-3.

Drake's defense then held Butler to another field goal to hold on to a 7-6 lead.

Then it took less than two minutes for Drake to extend its lead, 14-6 as Kraemer found Steven Doran streaking down the middle of the field for a 28-yard touchdown pass.

Kraemer then extended Drake's lead 21-6 with a 15-yard touchdown pass to Connor Ostrander, who ended his day with five catches for 80 yards, midway through second-quarter.

Drake went into the half with a 21-13 lead after Butler managed to score near the end of the second-quarter.

For the second-straight game, the Bulldog defense was lights out in the second-half. Drake limited Butler to just 67 yards of total offense, five first downs and three points.

"The defense played a gutty performance. I'm so proud of the guys, Coach (Todd) Stepsis and the staff on the adjustments they made during the game," said Fox.

Drake's offense opened the second-half with its fourth scoring drive of the game when Danny Donley drilled a 19-yard field goal to put the Bulldogs ahead 24-13.

DES MOINES, Iowa – Four turnovers proved to be too much for the Bulldogs, as the Drake University football team fell to Dayton, 20-10, Saturday at Drake Stadium.

The Bulldogs managed to take a 3-0 lead near the end of the first-quarter after the drive stalled on Dayton's eight-yard line. Danny Donley drilled a 25-yard field goal to put Drake on top.

The Bulldogs had a chance to extend their lead early in the second-quarter, but Drake came up empty when the Flyers blocked a 21-yard field goal attempt. Then with less than two and a half minutes left in the opening half, Dayton's quarter back Alex Jeske, who made his first start of the season after missing the first five games of the season due to an injury, drove the Flyers down deep into Bulldog territory. Drake's defense held strong and limited the Flyers to a field goal to tie the score, 3-3, heading into the half.

The Flyers opened the second-half with a five-play 75-yard touchdown drive to take a 10-3 lead. Later in the third-quarter, Dayton took advantage of Drake's first turnover as Jeske completed a 29-yard touchdown pass to Ryan Skibinski to put the Flyers up 17-3.

Drake committed another turnover early in the fourth-quarter, but the Bulldog defense held strong and forced the Flyers to miss a field goal. Drake's offense used the momentum from the defense's stop to put together a nine-play 80-yard scoring drive which was capped off by a one-yard touchdown run by Grant Kraemer, cutting the Bulldog deficit to 17-10.

After the Bulldog defense managed to force the Flyers to another three-and-out, Drake's Terry Wallen fumbled the punt return with Dayton recovering the loose ball on Drake's 24-yard line.

With the Flyers looking to go up two touchdowns, Drake's defense once again came up with another big red zone stop and held Dayton to another field goal as the Flyers extended their lead to 20-10 with just over five minutes left to play. Dayton went on to record two interceptions in the final five minutes to seal the 20-10 victory.

Grant Kraemer was on his way to another 300 yards passing game but suffered an injury in the Bulldogs first possession of the third-quarter and ended his day completing 12-of-19 passes for 144 yards. Junior Sam Hefner stepped right in and helped the Bulldogs hold on to their lead as he recorded a career-best 94 yards passing and completed 8-of-14 attempts.

Defensively, Sean Lynch led the squad with a game-high 11 tackles and two interceptions. Mike Maize recorded six stops including 1.5 for a loss, while Tanner Evans paced the defensively line with two sacks.
