CO-OFFENSIVE

Anthony Lawrence, San Diego

Junior (RS) | Quarterback La Mesa, California

Lawrence tied his career high with five touchdown throws in San Diego's 38-17 PFL victory against Butler, Saturday. He completed 26-of-39 passes without throwing an interception, passing for 367 yards to finish with an impressive 188.0 pass efficiency rating. Lawrence was responsible for all five Torero touchdowns in the game, throwing scoring strikes of 5, 9, 4, 13 and 23 yards to three different receivers.

Rylan Wells, Jacksonville

Senior (RS) | Quarterback Tega City, South Carolina

Wells also was responsible for five touch-downs in Jacksonville's 44-37 PFL victory at Marist. Earning his second straight PFL weekly honor, he passed for two touchdowns and ran for three in the victory. Wells completed 10-of-14 passes for 154 yards and ran 12 times for 92 yards and added a two-point conversion toss on the Dolphins final touchdown.

DEFENSIVE

Carlos Merritt, Campbell Senior (RS) | Defensive Back Union City, Georgia

Merritt picked off two passes and returned one for a touchdown in Campbell's 49-21 PFL victory at Stetson, Saturday. His interception return for a score capped the Camels' 28-point first quarter and proved to be the eventual game-winning score. Merritt's second pick came later in the first half and stopped a Stetson drive before it could reach midfield. He led Campbell in tackles, finishing with nine stops (six solo) and was credited with a half tackle for loss.

CO-SPECIAL TEAMS

Javier Arce-Ramirez, Jacksonville

Sophomore (RS) | Kicker Madrid, Spain

Arce-Ramirez hit two field goals and scored 10 points in Jacksonville's 44-37 PFL victory at Marist, Saturday. The sophomore kicked field goals of 22 and 31 yards in the first half to help the Dolphins nose out to a 13-3 lead. He also converted on each of his four PATs.

Mekhai Johnson, Marist

Freshman | Kick Returner Dorchester, Massachusetts

Johnson scored the PFL's first touchdown on a kick return, to help Marist climb back into the contest before falling 44-37 to Jacksonville, Saturday. His 90-yard kickoff return in the second quarter helped the Red Foxes get back within four points, 13-9, in the second quarter. He had a good day as the Marist returner, finishing with 140 return yards on three kickoffs – his 46.7 yards per return the best in the PFL this season.

OTHER TOP PERFORMANCES IN WEEK 4

- JEROME BROOKS, LB (Morehead State) Brooks was credited with three tackles for loss and seven tackles (three solo) in the Eagles win against Dayton.
- KAMA KAMAKA, NB (San Diego) Kamaka was busy in San Diego's win against Butler, finishing with five tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, an interception and a pass breakup.
- **GRANT KRAEMER, QB (Drake)** Kraemer's 445 passing yards were 11 shy of breaking the Drake passing record and were the fifth-most passing yards in the FCS this season as he led Drake to a victory against Valparaiso.
- **JONNY MESINA**, **P/K (Stetson)** Mesina booted a 66-yard punt as part of a five-punt day that saw him averaged 42.4 yards per punt, placing two inside the 20-yard line.
- THOMAS OPORTO, LB (Jacksonville) Oporto picked off a pass and had a team-best 13 tackles (seven solo) to pace the Dolphins defense in a win at Marist.
- LAWSON PAGE, QB (Morehead State) Page equalled his career high with four touchdown tosses in Morehead State's win against Dayton, completing 24of-37 passes for 309 yards.
- DONALD PARHAM, TE (Stetson) Parham led all PFL receivers with 157 reception yards on nine catches in Stetson's loss to Campbell.
- PACE TEMPLE, WR (Butler) Temple caught nine passes for 155 yards and two touchdowns in Butler's loss at San Diego. He ammassed 110 yards in the game's first 20 minutes en route to his fifth career 100-yard receiving outing.
- DANIEL SMITH, QB (Campbell) Smith's 179 rushing yards were the most ever by a Campbell quarterback and he passed for another 188 yards in Campbell's win against at Stetson. He finished with 367 offensive yards and was responsible for four touchdowns (two passing, two rushing).
- SEAN SMITH, P (Dayton) Smith averaged 42.4 yards per punt, placing two inside the 20-yard line in Dayton's loss at Morehead State.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

PFL's 25TH CAMPAIGN | The 2017 season marks the 25th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2017 NCAA FCS Championship.

OH, THAT DOLPHIN PASSING | Jacksonville enters Week 5 of the 2017 campaign ranked No. 2 among FCS teams in Passing Efficiency, boasting a 189.20 rating. The Dolphins have six touchdowns and 487 yards on 49 pass attempts this season while throwing only one interception on the campaign. They lead a pack of five PFL teams – Morehead State, Valparaiso, Drake and San Diego – ranked among the FCS Top 50 in the category.

PATIENT FLYERS | Dayton is the least penalized team in the FCS after four weeks, averaging just 2.75 penalties per game. They are also ranked fourth in fewest penalty yards per game, averaging only 31.25 penalty yards.

CRUSADERS SURGING | Valparaiso's offense has enjoyed a resurgence in 2017, its 443.3 total yards per game ranking 21st among FCS programs and leading the PFL. The Crusaders ran up 450 offensive yards against Montana in Week 1 before tacking on 511 offensive yards against Duquesne and another 518 against Trinity International. Valparaiso averaged just 300 offensive yards per game last season, ranking 106th among FCS teams.

TRIO OF KICK RETURNERS TO FEAR | The PFL boasts three kick returners that have proven to be dangerous in 2017. Morehead State's Jaunyea Tarver (6th, 376 yards), Dayton's Christian Searles (11th, 348) and Butler's Cam Cooper (14th, 339) are each ranked among the FCS Top 15 in Combined Kick Return Yardage (punt and kick returns) after four weeks.

MARIST'S JOHNSON 1ST TO RETURN KICK FOR SCORE | Marist's Mekhai Johnson became the first PFL return specialist to return a kickoff for a touchdown in 2017, turning in the score against Jacksonville in Week 4. He was one of only 13 FCS players to return a kick for a touchdown in the season's first four weeks.

RETURNS TO THE HOUSE | Three of the 19 FCS return men to take a punt back for a touchdown reside in the PFL. Davidson's Austin Wells, Dayton's Christian Searles and Campbell's Jaquan Brooks have each put six on the board after fielding a punt in 2017.

HIGGINBOTHOM, PRIEST LEADS RECEIVERS | Morehead State's Jaren Higginbothom and San Diego's Justin Priest each have five receiving touchdowns this season, ranking fourth among FCS athletes in the category.

WILDCATS' DUGGER RUNNING WILD | Davidson freshman running back Wesley Dugger has motored to a quick start, compiling 377 rushing yards in his first three collegiate games. His 125.7 rushing yards per game ranks eighth among all FCS runners this season and it leads all rookie runners with a minimum of 20 rushes to their credit.

BOXRUCKER SCORING ON THE GROUND | Valparaiso sophomore running back Cody Boxrucker is getting the job done on the ground, as one of only 11 runners with five or more touchdowns this season.

PFL QUARTET LEADING FCS IN TACKLERS FOR LOSS | Davidson's Bryce Perry-Martin enters Week 5 ranked fourth among all FCS tacklers with 2.2 tackles for loss per game. He is one of four PFL defenders ranked among the Top 10 in tackles for loss with Stetson's Jeb Boudreaux, Morehead State's Jerome Brooks and Campbell's Emmanuel Olenga each averaging 2.0 tackles for loss per game – each fifth-most in the FCS.

OLENGA A SACK LEADER | In addition, Olenga is one of three PFL tacklers to rank among the FCS Top 10 in sacks, his 1.38 sacks per game ranking third in the subdivision.

LASTONAS STILL PERFECT ON FGs | Valparaiso sophomore Dimitrios Lastonas (4-for-4) is one of only 17 kickers who have not missed a field goal in 2017 after four weeks.

FIVE PFL ALUMNI ON NFL ACTIVE ROSTERS | The opening week of NFL action saw five PFL alumni listed on NFL active rosters. Marist alumni Terrence Fede (Miami) and Jason Myers (Jacksonville) returned to their teams for 2017. Drake's Eric Saubert (Atlanta), San Diego's Jamal Agnew (Detroit) and Stetson's Donald Payne (Jacksonville) are the league's newest alumni to make an NFL roster in 2017.

EIGHT FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRE- SEASON SQUAD | San Diego, the defending PFL Champion, returns four First-Team All-PFL selections among its seven preseason picks, including quarterback Anthony Lawrence. Dayton, last season's PFL runner up, had two returning first-team selections on the team while Campbell and Marist return one first-teamer each.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | For the seventh consecutive year, the University of San Diego has been picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. San Diego, which won the 2016 regular-season title then advanced to the second round of the FCS Championship, again received the coaches' nod to win the 2017 PFL title. The Toreros were chosen just ahead of Dayton in polling that was dominated by the two teams. San Diego and Dayton combined to receive all available first-place votes and also claimed all but two of the possible second-place votes.

DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK HITS 458 GAMES | The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to Dayton, which extended the streak to 458 games in its Week 4 loss against Morehead State. That streak includes 263 games as a FCS member, which ranks fourth all-time among FCS programs. Montana holds the FCS' longest streak without being shutout at 371 games which dates back to 1989. On the FBS side, Florida holds the nation's longest streak of games without being shutout at 362, dating back to the 1988 season. The Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

TWO PFL ALUMNI SELECTED IN 2017 NFL DRAFT | In a milestone moment for the Pioneer Football League, Drake tight end Eric Saubert and San Diego defensive back Jamal Agnew were each selected in the fifth round of the 2017 NFL Draft. The PFL was one of five Division I FCS conferences to have two players selected in the draft. The PFL joined the Colonial Athletic Association, Big Sky Conference, Missouri Valley Football Conference and the Southwestern Athletic Conference with two selections while the entire FCS saw 15 players drafted.

SAN DIEGO'S LAWRENCE NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST | San Diego junior quarterback Anthony Lawrence, a nominee for the 2016 Walter Payton Award Watch List a year ago, is one of 22 players on the 2017 preseason watch list for the 2017 STATS FCS Walter Payton Award. As a sophomore, he helped the Toreros to an undefeated league record and then an FCS playoff win over Cal Poly that was the first in PFL history. Lawrence ranked fourth in the FCS in completion

first in PFL history. Lawrence ranked fourth in the FCS in completion percentage (67.6) and eighth in passing efficiency rating (155.0) while throwing for 2,998 yards and 25 touchdowns against eight interceptions.

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. San Diego junior offensive lineman Daniel Cooney was a second-team selection while teammate senior defensive lineman Jonathan Petersen was joined on the third team by Drake punt returner Terry Wallen.

FIVE PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Three Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 146 nominees from across the country for the 26th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Isaak Newhouse (Butler), Ryan Samuels (Davidson) and Lawrence Dickens (Marist) were nominated for the 2017 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

TOREROS CHARGE TO 2016 FCS OPENING ROUND WIN | San Diego became the first PFL team to win a game in the Division I Football Championship with its 35-21 victory at Cal Poly, last season. The Toreros win came in just the fourth season of the PFL's automatic bid into the championship.
