

OFFENSIVE

Montel Goods, Campbell

Freshman (RS) | Running Back Pittsboro, North Carolina

In his first career start, Goods put together the PFL's second-best rushing performance of 2017 in a 38-0 PFL win against Morehead State, Saturday. He carried the ball 27 times for 193 yards and three touchdowns, averaging 7.1 yards per carry. Goods scored the game's first touchdown on a three-yard carry to start the second quarter. He then had seven carries on a 12-play drive that was capped by his two-yard dash. He capped the day with a three-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. It was the second-best rushing performance by yardage in the PFL this season, trailing only Davidson freshman Wesley Dugger's 196-yard outing.

DEFENSIVE

Carlos Merritt, Campbell Senior (RS) | Defensive Back Union City, Georgia

Merritt notched six tackles and picked off a pass to lead Campbell's defense to a shutout of Morehead State, 38-0, in Saturday PFL action. His interception helped seal the shutout as he picked off a pass in the end zone to deny a touchdown late in the third quarter. Merritt also had six tackles and led Campbell with four solo stops. It was the first shutout suffered by Morehead State since 2010, ending a streak of 71 games without being shutout.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Dimitrios Latsonas, Valparaiso

Sophomore | Kicker Westmont, Illinois

In a game decided by three points, Latsonas' perfect kicking performance proved pivotal in Valparaiso's 27-24 PFL victory against Stetson, Saturday. He made field goals of 34 and 30 yards, improving to 6-for-6 on field goals this season. Latsonas' 34-yarder put Valparaiso ahead 10-0 in the first quarter and his 30-yard boot extended that lead to 20-6 in the second frame. He also converted all three of his PATs and averaged 60.7 yards on his six kickoffs.

OTHER TOP PERFORMANCES

- **JAMAL ADJAMAH, RB (Jacksonville)** Adhamah needed just four carries to amass a 141-yard rushing performance, highlighted by touchdown runs of 53 and 69 yards in the first quarter that were both the only plays of there respective scoring drives.
- DREW BEVELHIMER, K (Butler) Bevelhimer connected on all three of his field goal tries, including efforts from 42 and 43 yards, and tacked on a lone PAT.
- JEREMIAH GHOLSTON, SAF (Marist) Gholston intercepted a pass and returned it 59 yards for a touchdown to help extend a Marist first-quarter lead.
- **GRANT KRAEMER, QB (Drake)** Kraemer put together a string of 11 consecutive completed passes as part of a 27-for-40 passing effort for 329 yards and two touchdowns in a win against Butler.
- **COLIN McGOVERN, QB (Stetson)** McGovern helped Stetson rally back from a fourth-quarter deficit, completing 8-of-9 passes for 69 yards on a late drive. He finished the day completing a PFL season-high 35 passes for 383 yards, threw two touchdowns and a two-point conversion.
- **JONNY MESSINA, K (Stetson)** Messina connected on 3-of-4 field goals, including a 42-yard boot, and executed a perfect on-side kick to give the Hatters a late chance to score in a loss at valparaiso.
- JJ NUNES, DB (Valparaiso) Nunes intercepted a pass to help the Crusaders seal their PFL win against Stetson, Saturday, while also posting three tackles.
- **JIMMY SEEWALD, QB (Valparaiso)** Seewald posted a league-best 173.2 pass efficiency rating during the week, completing 19-of-29 passes for 254 yards and passing for three touchdowns
- TREVOR SMITH, K (Davidson) Smith hit on each of his three field goal attempts, including a long of 39 yards, and averaged 64.0 yards on four kickoffs.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

PFL's 25TH CAMPAIGN | The 2017 season marks the 25th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2017 NCAA FCS Championship.

SIX PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALISTS | Campbell kicker/punter Brian Stryffeler, Davidson quarterback Taylor Mitchell, Dayton linebacker Jack Crain, Marist running back Marcellus Calhoun, San Diego nickelback Max Michaels and Stetson tight end Austin Tyrrell were among 181 semifinalists for the Campbell Trophy which recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation and is prominently displayed inside its official home at the New York Athletic Club.

WOODS FIRST PFL ATHLETE TO EARN NATIONAL HONOR | Campbell running back Montel Goods became the first Pioneer Football League athlete to earn a weekly national honor in 2017, earning STATS FCS National Freshman of the Week, Monday. His three touchdown outing moved him atop the PFL leaderboard in rushing touchdowns this season, his five scores matching Valparaiso's Cody Boxrucker with both ranked 11th among FCS runners.

NEW NAME FOR BUTLER HOME FACILITY | The longtime home for Butler football received a new name in September when the Butler Bowl was renamed the Sellick Bowl in honor of longtime supporters Winstan and Jacqueline Sellick. The renaming was in recognition of a \$9.4-million gift from their estate to the university, shared among the athletics department, the Lacy School of Business and the university.

OPPORTUNISTIC CAMELS AND RED FOXES | Campbell and Marist are among a group of just 25 FCS teams with multiple defensive touchdowns this season. The Camels three defensive scores (two interceptions, one fumble) has them tied for second among FCS teams, behind North Carolina A&T (five defensive touchdowns). Marist has two defensive touchdowns (one interception, one fumble) and is tied for fifth among FCS squads.

OH, THAT DOLPHIN PASSING | Jacksonville enters Week 6 of the 2017 campaign ranked No. 4 among FCS teams in team passing efficiency, boasting a 175.50 rating. The Dolphins have seven touchdowns and 541 yards on 5949 pass attempts this season while throwing only two interceptions on the campaign. They lead a pack of five PFL teams – Valparaiso (31st), Drake (36th), San Diego (39th) and Morehead State (50th) – ranked among the FCS Top 50 in the category.

QUARTET OF KICK RETURNERS TO FEAR The PFL boasts three kick returners that have proven to be dangerous in 2017. Morehead State's Jaunyea Tarver (6th, 497 yards), Valparaiso's Bailey Gessinger (13th, 416), Dayton's Christian Searles (16th, 416) and Butler's Cam Cooper (20th, 339) are each ranked among the FCS Top 20 in Combined Kick Return Yardage (punt and kick returns).

MARIST'S JOHNSON 1ST TO RETURN KICK FOR SCORE | Marist's Mekhai Johnson became the first PFL return specialist to return a kickoff for a touchdown in 2017, turning in the score against Jacksonville in Week 4. He was one of only 13 FCS players to return a kick for a touchdown in the season's first four weeks.

RETURNS TO THE HOUSE | Three of the 23 FCS return men to take a punt back for a touchdown reside in the PFL. Davidson's Austin Wells, Dayton's Christian Searles and Campbell's Jaquan Brooks have each put six on the board after fielding a punt in 2017.

HIGGINBOTHOM, PRIEST LEADS RECEIVERS | Morehead State's Jaren Higginbothom and San Diego's Justin Priest each have five receiving touchdowns this season, ranking eighth among FCS athletes in the category.

WILDCATS' DUGGER RUNNING WILD | Davidson freshman running back Wesley Dugger has motored to a quick start, compiling 431 rushing yards in his first four collegiate games. His 107.8 rushing yards per game ranks 12th among all FCS runners this season and ranks second among all rookie runners.

PFL TRIO LEADING FCS IN TACKLERS FOR LOSS | Campbell's Emmanuel Olenga is one of the FCS' leaders in tackles for loss, averaging 2.0 stops behind the line of scrimmage. Stetson's Jeb Boudreau and San Diego's Jonathan Petersen are both averaging 1.7 tackles for loss, ranking 17th among FCS defenders.

OLENGA, PETERSEN AMONG SACK LEADERS | In addition, Olenga is one of three PFL tacklers to rank among the FCS Top 10 in sacks, his 1.30 sacks per game ranking fourth in the subdivision. Petersen's 1.0 sacks per game also ranks 11th nationally.

LASTONAS STILL PERFECT ON FGs | Valparaiso sophomore Dimitrios Lastonas (6-for-6) is one of only 13 kickers who have not missed a field goal in 2017.

FIVE PFL ALUMNI ON NFL ACTIVE ROSTERS | The opening week of NFL action saw five PFL alumni listed on NFL active rosters. Marist alumni Terrence Fede (Miami) and Jason Myers (Jacksonville) returned to their teams for 2017. Drake's Eric Saubert (Atlanta), San Diego's Jamal Agnew (Detroit) and Stetson's Donald Payne (Jacksonville) are the league's newest alumni to make an NFL roster in 2017.

EIGHT FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRE- SEASON SQUAD | San Diego, the defending PFL Champion, returns four First-Team All-PFL selections among its seven preseason picks, including quarterback Anthony Lawrence. Dayton, last season's PFL runner up, had two returning first-team selections on the team while Campbell and Marist return one first-teamer each.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | For the seventh consecutive year, the University of San Diego has been picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. San Diego, which won the 2016 regular-season title then advanced to the second round of the FCS Championship, again received the coaches' nod to win the 2017 PFL title. The Toreros were chosen just ahead of Dayton in polling that was dominated by the two teams. San Diego and Dayton combined to receive all available first-place votes and also claimed all but two of the possible second-place votes.

DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK HITS 458 GAMES | The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to Dayton, which extended the streak to 458 games in its Week 4 loss against Morehead State. That streak includes 263 games as a FCS member, which ranks fourth all-time among FCS programs. Montana holds the FCS' longest streak without being shutout at 371 games which dates back to 1989. On the FBS side, Florida holds the nation's longest streak of games without being shutout at 362, dating back to the 1988 season. The Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

TWO PFL ALUMNI SELECTED IN 2017 NFL DRAFT In a milestone moment for the Pioneer Football League, Drake tight end Eric Saubert and San Diego defensive back Jamal Agnew were each selected in the fifth round of the 2017 NFL Draft. The PFL was one of five Division I FCS conferences to have two players selected in the draft. The PFL joined the Colonial Athletic Association, Big Sky Conference, Missouri Valley Football Conference and the Southwestern Athletic Conference with two selections while the entire FCS saw 15 players drafted.

SAN DIEGO'S LAWRENCE NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST |

San Diego junior quarterback Anthony Lawrence, a nominee for the 2016 Walter Payton Award Watch List a year ago, is one of 22 players on the 2017 preseason watch list for the 2017 STATS FCS Walter Payton Award. As a sophomore, he helped the Toreros to an undefeated league record and then an FCS playoff win over Cal Poly that was the first in PFL history. Lawrence ranked fourth in the FCS in completion percentage (67.6) and eighth in passing efficiency rating (155.0) while throwing for 2,998 yards and 25 touchdowns against eight interceptions

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team.

San Diego junior offensive lineman Daniel Cooney was a second-team selection while teammate senior defensive lineman Jonathan Petersen was joined on the third team by Drake punt returner Terry Wallen.

FIVE PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Three Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 146 nominees from across the country for the 26th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Isaak Newhouse (Butler), Ryan Samuels (Davidson) and Lawrence Dickens (Marist) were nominated for the 2017 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

TOREROS CHARGE TO 2016 FCS OPENING ROUND WIN | San Diego became the first PFL team to win a game in the Division I Football Championship with its 35-21 victory at Cal Poly, last season. The Toreros win came in just the fourth season of the PFL's automatic bid into the championship.
