OFFENSIVE

Jimmy Seewald, Valparaiso Sophomore | Quarterback Livonia, Michigan

Seewald overcame both the opposing defense and Mother Nature, passing for three touchdowns in Valparaiso's 49-15 PFL victory against Marist, Saturday. Playing in heavy rain and in a game suspended twice by lightning, Seewald completed 17-of-28 passes for 262 yards and three touchdowns. He gave the Crusaders a first-quarter lead when he took advantage of an offside call, completing a 70-yard touchdown pass to Parker Fox on the free play. After a second half Marist touchdown, Seewald led Valparaiso on two touchdowns within two minutes of each other, completing a 38-yard strike to Griffin Norberg and a 37-yard pass to Bailey Geissinger.

DEFENSIVE

Jonathan Petersen, San Diego Senior | Defensive End

Senior | Defensive En Poway, California

Petersen was strikingly efficient with three sacks, including two strip sacks, as San Diego rolled to a 56-27 PFL victory against Morehead State, Saturday. He finished the day with three tackles, each for a sack and one of the fumbles he forced was recovered by San Diego and later turned into a touchdown. Petersen had two sacks on one drive in the second quarter, the second of the pair resulting in a forced fumble at the MSU 29-yard line. Early in the third quarter, his third sack disrupted a Morehead State drive on first-and-goal and the Eagles would not score.

SPECIAL TEAMS

JJ Henderson, Stetson Freshman (RS) | Punt Returner Tampa, Florida

Henderson posted an 81-yard punt return for a touchdown in Stetson's 28-17 PFL victory against Davidson, Saturday. The punt return was the first in Stetson history that wasn't the result of a blocked punt. Henderson finished the day with 82 yards on three punt returns (27.3 yards per return). It was part of a solid day for the redshirt freshman who also played defensive back for the Hatters and finished with six tackles and four pass breakups as Stetson snapped a seven-game PFL losing streak.

OTHER TOP PERFORMANCES

- AARON BLOCKMON, WR (Campbell) Had just four receptions, but two were for touchdowns as he also had 74 receiving yards at Dayton.
- PETER DELATOUR, DE (Marist) Blocked a 20-yard field goal try at Valparaiso and had three tackles as well as a half-tackle for loss.
- WESLEY DUGGER, RB (Davidson) Rolled up 160 yards on 27 carries at Stetson, it was his third 100-yard rushing performance this season.
- GEORGE HATALOWICH, LB (Davidson) Posted a career-best 12 tackles (six solo) and had 2.5 tackles for loss as well as a pass breakup at Stetson.
- EMILIO MARTINEZ, RB (San Diego) Rushed for three touchdowns on nine carries, amassing a career-best 139 yards against Morehead State.
- RAY MILLER, LB (Campbell) Finished with eight tackles (six solo) and had three tackles for loss as Campbell held an opponent below 10 points for a third consecutive week in a win at Dayton.
- ALEX NG, P/HOLD (Valparaiso) Overcame heavy rain and a pair of high snaps to post average 39 yards on five boots against Marist, including a 53-yarder and two downed inside the 20-yard line.
- **DILLON SCARGLE, DB (Valparaiso)** Had a hand in two fourth-quarter takeaways, including returning a fumble for a touchdown to seal the win against Marist. Also had an interception and a pass breakup along with three tackles.
- SAM SCHRADER, RB (Butler) Needed just 10 carries to accumulate 74 yards and score three touchdowns against Jacksonville. He also completed a 41-yard pass to set up the Bulldogs first touchdown.
- CHRISTIAN SEARLES, CB (Dayton) Saved a touchdown with a fumble forced in front of the goal line, one of his two fumbles forced to go along with six tackles and two pass breakups against Campbell.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

PFL's 25TH CAMPAIGN | The 2017 season marks the 25th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2017 NCAA FCS Championship.

SAN DIEGO BREAKS PFL RECORD | San Diego posted its 16th consecutive PFL victory with a Week 7 win against Morehead State. The Toreros broke their own record of 15 consecutive wins set from 2005-07.

DOLPHINS NOT DEAD YET | Jacksonville may have suffered its first PFL loss at Butler in Week 7 but it may still have a say in the eventual PFL title. League leaders San Diego and Campbell will play the Dolphins over the next two weeks. If the Dolphins win both, they would take the lead in the league title race. However, if both San Diego and Campbell escape with wins then the league's tiebreaker may be called into action at week's end.

DAYTON'S CHAMBERLIN BREAKS MENTOR'S MARK | Dayton head coach Rich Chamberlin notched his 56th PFL victory in his 75th league game, Oct. 7, when the Flyers defeated Drake. He broke the PFL record for coaching victories set by his former head coach Mike Kelley, who posted 55 league wins (71 games) during his storied career. They are the only two coaches in PFL history to record 50 league wins.

FLYERS TO THE BLOCK | Dayton has blocked five kicks through the season's first half, ranking second among all FCS teams behind only South Carolina State (7). Redshirt freshman Matt Clifford has blocked two kicks in 2017, one of only four FCS defenders to block multiple kicks.

OPPORTUNISTIC CAMELS AND RED FOXES | Campbell and Marist are among a group of just 25 FCS teams with multiple defensive touchdowns this season. The Camels are second among FCS programs with four defensive scores (two interceptions, two fumbles). Marist has two defensive touchdowns (one interception, one fumble) and is tied for 12th among FCS squads.

STINGY BULLDOGS | Butler has not given opponents many opportunities to create off turnovers, committing just three giveaways in 2017 – the third fewest among FCS programs. All three of the Bulldogs turnovers have been passes intercepted as they are the only FCS team without a fumble lost.

DOLPHINS DO RUN | A quick look at the NCAA FCS team leaders reveals Jacksonville's offense is the subdivision's No. 3 rushing offense, averaging 305.8 yards per game on the ground. The Dolphins rank sixth in rush attempts (331) and 12th in yards per rush (5.54). Jacksonville has two runners ranked among the FCS Top 100 in yards per game and four ranked among the Top 150.

CAMELS DEFEND | Campbell has picked off a FCS best 16 passes through Week 7 and are ranked No. 4 among FCS teams in both pass efficiency defense (97.00) and scoring defense (11.7 ppg) as well as No. 4 in scoring defense (11.7 ppg). Those Top 10 rankings are due largely to its No. 2 ranking in third-down defense (24.0%) and owning the nation's best red-zone defense, which has allowed opponent's just eight scores in a meager 16 opportunities.

TOREROS PETERSEN LEADS THE CHARGE | San Diego defensive lineman Jonathan Petersen continues to be a force, entering Week 8 leading all FCS tacklers with 1.50 sacks per game and ranking second in tackles for loss per game (2.10). Among FCS active career leaders, he ranks No. 1 in total sacks per game (0.85) and forced fumbles (14) as well as No. 2 in both career sacks (35.0) and tackles for loss per game (1.50).

RUSHING LEADERS | The PFL's youth has run rampant in the season's first half, as Campbell redshirt freshman quarterback Daniel Smith leads the league with 117.2 yards per game (4th in FCS). Davidson freshman running back Wesley Dugger is 6th nationally at 105.8 yards per game. And proving age has its worth, Dayton senior running back Tucker Yinger rounds out a trio of PFL runner in the FCS Top 15 with his 96.7 yards per game (14th).

QUARTET OF KICK RETURNERS TO FEAR The PFL boasts four kick returners that have proven to be dangerous in 2017. Morehead State's Jaunyea Tarver (1st, 752 yards), Valparaiso's Bailey Gessinger (3rd, 656), Dayton's Christian Searles (22nd, 442) and Butler's Cam Cooper (34th, 394) are each ranked among the FCS Top 40 in Combined Kick Return Yardage (punt and kick returns).

MARIST'S JOHNSON 1ST TO RETURN KICK FOR SCORE |

Marist's Mekhai Johnson became the first PFL return specialist to return a kickoff for a touchdown in 2017, turning in the score against Jacksonville in Week 4. He was one of only 13 FCS players to return a kick for a touchdown in the season's first four weeks.

RETURNS TO THE HOUSE | Four of the 32 FCS return men to take a punt back for a touchdown reside in the PFL. Stetson's JJ Henderson, Davidson's Austin Wells, Dayton's Christian Searles and Campbell's Jaquan Brooks have each put six on the board after fielding a punt in 2017.

HIGGINBOTHOM, PRIEST LEADS RECEIVERS | San Diego's Justin Priest leads all PFL receivers with six touchdowns this season, ranking 13th among FCS wideouts.

SIX PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALISTS | Campbell kicker/punter Brian Stryffeler, Davidson quarterback Taylor Mitchell, Dayton linebacker Jack Crain, Marist running back Marcellus Calhoun, San Diego nickelback Max Michaels and Stetson tight end Austin Tyrrell were among 181 semifinalists for the Campbell Trophy which recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation and is prominently displayed inside its official home at the New York Athletic Club.

His 43.0 yards per punt against Drake saw five of his seven tries downed inside the Drake 20-yard line and two booming for more than 50 yards.

WOODS FIRST PFL ATHLETE TO EARN NATIONAL HONOR |

Campbell running back Montel Goods became the first Pioneer Football League athlete to earn a weekly national honor in 2017, earning STATS FCS National Freshman of the Week, Monday. His three touchdown outing moved him atop the PFL leaderboard in rushing touchdowns this season, his five scores matching Valparaiso's Cody Boxrucker with both ranked 11th among FCS runners.

NEW NAME FOR BUTLER HOME FACILITY | The longtime home for Butler football received a new name in September when the Butler Bowl was renamed the Sellick Bowl in honor of longtime supporters Winstan and Jacqueline Sellick. The renaming was in recognition of a \$9.4-million gift from their estate to the university, shared among the athletics department, the Lacy School of Business and the university.

FIVE PFL ALUMNI ON NFL ACTIVE ROSTERS | The opening week of NFL action saw five PFL alumni listed on NFL active rosters. Marist alumni Terrence Fede (Miami) and Jason Myers (Jacksonville) returned to their teams for 2017. Drake's Eric Saubert (Atlanta), San Diego's Jamal Agnew (Detroit) and Stetson's Donald Payne (Jacksonville) are the league's newest alumni to make an NFL roster in 2017.

EIGHT FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRE- SEASON SQUAD | San Diego, the defending PFL Champion, returns four First-Team All-PFL selections among its seven preseason picks, including quarterback Anthony Lawrence. Dayton, last season's PFL runner up, had two returning first-team selections on the team while Campbell and Marist return one first-teamer each.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | For the seventh consecutive year, the University of San Diego has been picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. San Diego, which won the 2016 regular-season title then advanced to the second round of the FCS Championship, again received the coaches' nod to win the 2017 PFL title. The Toreros were chosen just ahead of Dayton in polling that was dominated by the two

teams. San Diego and Dayton combined to receive all available firstplace votes and also claimed all but two of the possible second-place votes

DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK HITS 460 GAMES | The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to Dayton, which extended the streak to 460 games in its Week 4 loss against Morehead State. That streak includes 265 games as a FCS member, which ranks fourth all-time among FCS programs. Montana holds the FCS' longest streak without being shutout at 373 games which dates back to 1989. On the FBS side, Florida holds the nation's longest streak of games without being shutout at 364, dating back to the 1988 season. The Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

TWO PFL ALUMNI SELECTED IN 2017 NFL DRAFT | In a milestone moment for the Pioneer Football League, Drake tight end Eric Saubert and San Diego defensive back Jamal Agnew were each selected in the fifth round of the 2017 NFL Draft. The PFL was one of five Division I FCS conferences to have two players selected in the draft. The PFL joined the Colonial Athletic Association, Big Sky Conference, Missouri Valley Football Conference and the Southwestern Athletic Conference with two selections while the entire FCS saw 15 players drafted.

SAN DIEGO'S LAWRENCE NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST |

San Diego junior quarterback Anthony Lawrence, a nominee for the 2016 Walter Payton Award Watch List a year ago, is one of 22 players on the 2017 preseason watch list for the 2017 STATS FCS Walter Payton Award. As a sophomore, he helped the Toreros to an undefeated league record and then an FCS playoff win over Cal Poly that was the first in PFL history. Lawrence ranked fourth in the FCS in completion percentage (67.6) and eighth in passing efficiency rating (155.0) while throwing for 2,998 yards and 25 touchdowns against eight interceptions

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. San Diego junior offensive lineman Daniel Cooney was a second-team selection while teammate senior defensive lineman Jonathan Petersen was joined on the third team by Drake punt returner Terry Wallen.

FIVE PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Three Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 146 nominees from across the country for the 26th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Isaak Newhouse (Butler), Ryan Samuels (Davidson) and Lawrence Dickens (Marist) were nominated for the 2017 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

TOREROS CHARGE TO 2016 FCS OPENING ROUND WIN | San Diego became the first PFL team to win a game in the Division I Football Championship with its 35-21 victory at Cal Poly, last season. The Toreros win came in just the fourth season of the PFL's automatic bid into the championship.
