## **OFFENSIVE**

# Anthony Lawrence, San Diego Junior (RS) | Quarterback La Mesa, California

Lawrence threw a career-high six touchdowns in San Diego's 63-10 PFL victory at Jackson-ville, Saturday. He needed only three quarters to toss his six scores on 18-of-24 passing for 268 yards. Lawrence found three wide receivers for his six touchdowns, tossing two to each. It was the fifth six touchdown outing by a FCS quarterback this season and the second by a PFL signal caller in 2017. Lawrence's 251.3 pass efficiency rating was the ninth best in the FCS this season.

## **DEFENSIVE**

# **Sean Lynch, Drake**Senior | Defensive Back Hawthorn Woods. Illinois

Lynch intercepted a pair of passes to help Drake win a PFL defensive battle, 19-14, at Marist, Saturday. His first interception stopped a Marist drive just before it entered Drake territory in the second quarter. Lynch's second pick came in the fourth quarter and halted the Red Foxes at the Drake 15-yard line. He also had a game-high 11 tackles (eight solo). Lynch's lone tackle for loss also provided a pivotal stop, coming on 4th-and-1 at the Drake 23-yard line and forcing a turnover on downs to start the second quarter.

# **SPECIAL TEAMS**

# Danny Donley, Drake Junior | Kicker Tulsa, Oklahoma

Donley was responsible for 13 points in Drake's 19-14 PFL victory at Marist, Saturday. He connected on all four of his field goals, becoming one of seven kickers in the FCS this season to go perfect while making four or more field goals. Donley connected on kicks of 20, 30, 27 and 22 yards in addition to making his lone PAT try. He is the first Bulldogs kicker to make four field goals in a game since Billy Jenssen in 2011.

#### OTHER TOP PERFORMANCES

- WILLIE BARNETT, LB (Marist) Posted three tackles for loss and assisted on a sack as part of a nine-tackle outing against Drake.
- DREW BEVELHIMER, K (Butler) Finished with 13 points in Butler's win against Campbell, making all three of his field goals and all four PATs.
- JACK FLATAU, P (San Diego) Posted the FCS' third-best punting performance this season, averaging 55.3 yards on three punts at Jacksonville, including a 71-yard punt that was the 15th longest in the FCS.
- JONNY MESSINA, K (Stetson) Had eight of Stetson's points at Morehead State, hitting a pair of field goals and two PATs.
- ISAAK NEWHOUSE, SAF (Butler) Had an interception, two pass breakups, a fumble recovery and eight tackles in Butler's win against Campbell.
- **LAWSON PAGE, QB (Morehead State)** Led Morehead State to a come-from-behind win at Stetson, finishing the game with 324 total offensive yards with 25-of-34 passing for 221 yards and three touchdowns while adding 103 rushing yards on 16 carries, including a touchdown on the ground.
- TYLER PHELPS, QB (Davidson) Scored a touchdown with his arm and with his legs against Dayton, amassing 247 total offensive yards. He ran for 57 yards on five carries and completed 18-of-39 passes for 190 yards.
- SAM SCHRADER, RB/QB (Butler) Did a little bit of everything in Butler's win against Campbell, rushing for 94 yards in two scores on 18 carries, completing an 11-yard touchdown pass and catching a pass for three yards.
- DJ TINSLEY, DB (Stetson) Notched two tackles for loss, including a sack, as part of a 12-tackle (10 solo) performance at Morehead State.
- TUCKER YINGER, RB (Dayton) Ran for 135 yards on 14 carries, scoring twice, in Dayton's win at Davidson. It was his sixth 100-yard rushing performance in eight games this season.

# **NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL**

**PFL's 25TH CAMPAIGN |** The 2017 season marks the 25th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2017 NCAA FCS Championship.

**SAN DIEGO EXTENDS PFL RECORD** | San Diego posted its 17th consecutive PFL victory with a Week 8 win at Jacksonville State. The Toreros broke their own record of 15 consecutive wins set from 2005-07.

**TOREROS PETERSEN LEADS THE CHARGE** | San Diego defensive lineman Jonathan Petersen continues to be a force, entering Week 9 among FCS leaders in sacks (3rd, 1.50 per game), forced fumbles (1st, 0.71 per game) and tackles for loss (5th, 1.80). Among FCS active career leaders, he ranks No. 1 in total sacks (0.83) and forced fumbles (0.33) per game as well as No. 2 in both career sacks (35.0) and tackles for loss per game (1.46).

**FEAR THE KICK RETURNERS** | The PFL boasts four kick returners that have proven to be dangerous in 2017. Morehead State's Jaunyea Tarver (1st, 895 yards), Valparaiso's Bailey Gessinger (9th, 656), Dayton's Christian Searles (13th, 591), Davidson's Williams Wicks (19th, 493) and Butler's Cam Cooper (29th, 458) are each ranked among the FCS Top 30 in Combined Kick Return Yardage (punt and kick returns).

**RUSHING LEADERS** | The PFL's youth has run rampant in 2017, with Davidson freshman running back Wesley Dugger currently ranked sixth nationally at 103.0 yards per game while Campbell redshirt freshman quarterback Daniel Smith is eighth nationally (101.1 ypg). And proving age has its worth, Dayton senior running back Tucker Yinger rounds out a trio of PFL runner in the FCS Top 10 with his 101.5 yards per game (seventh in FCS).

**FLYERS TO THE BLOCK** | Dayton has blocked five kicks through the season's first half, ranking fourth among all FCS teams. Redshirt freshman Matt Clifford has blocked two kicks in 2017, one of only four FCS defenders to block multiple kicks.

**OPPORTUNISTIC CAMELS, RED FOXES AND HATTERS** | Campbell is one of eight FCS squads with four or more defensive touchdowns this season, ranking second with four. Marist was joined by Stetson among a group of 42 FCS teams with multiple defensive scores this season, both getting two TDs from their defense.

**STINGY BULLDOGS** | Butler has not given opponents many opportunities to create off turnovers, committing just four giveaways in 2017 – the third fewest among FCS programs. The Bulldogs rank 12th among FCS teams in turnover margin (+1.25).

**DOLPHINS DO RUN** A look at the NCAA FCS team leaders reveals Jacksonville's offense is the subdivision's No. 5 rushing offense, averaging 281.7 yards per game on the ground. The Dolphins rank seventh in rush attempts (369) and 13th in yards per rush (5.34).

**CAMELS DEFEND THE AIR** | Campbell has picked off a FCS best 16 passes through Week 8 and are ranked No. 4 among FCS teams in pass efficiency defense (99.86) as well as No. 5 in scoring defense (14.9 ppg).

**MARIST'S JOHNSON 1ST TO RETURN KICK FOR SCORE** | Marist's Mekhai Johnson became the first PFL return specialist to return a kickoff for a touchdown in 2017, turning in the score against Jacksonville in Week 4. He was one of only 13 FCS players to return a kick for a touchdown in the season's first four weeks.

**RETURNS TO THE HOUSE** | Four of the nation's return men to take a punt back for a touchdown reside in the PFL. Stetson's JJ Henderson, Davidson's Austin Wells, Dayton's Christian Searles and Campbell's Jaquan Brooks have each put six on the board after fielding a punt in 2017.

**PRIEST LEADS SCORING RECEIVERS** | San Diego's Justin Priest leads all PFL receivers with eight touchdowns this season, ranking sixth among FCS wideouts.

**DAYTON'S CHAMBERLIN BREAKS MENTOR'S MARK |** Dayton head coach Rich Chamberlin notched his 56th PFL victory in his 75th league game, Oct. 7, when the Flyers defeated Drake. He broke the PFL record for coaching victories set by his former head coach Mike Kelley, who posted 55 league wins (71 games) during his storied career. They are the only two coaches in PFL history to record 50 league wins.

SIX PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALISTS | Campbell kicker/punter Brian Stryffeler, Davidson quarterback Taylor Mitchell, Dayton linebacker Jack Crain, Marist running back Marcellus Calhoun, San Diego nickelback Max Michaels and Stetson tight end Austin Tyrrell were among 181 semifinalists for the Campbell Trophy which recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation and is prominently displayed inside its official home at the New York Athletic Club.

**SMITH PUNTS WAY TO NATIONAL HONOR** | Dayton junior kicker Sean Smith became the second PFL athlete to earn national weekly honors, Oct. 8, when he was named the STATS FCS Special Teams Player of the Week. His 43.0 yards per punt against Drake saw five of his seven tries downed inside the Drake 20-yard line and two booming for more than 50 yards.

#### WOODS FIRST PFL ATHLETE TO EARN NATIONAL HONOR |

Campbell running back Montel Goods became the first Pioneer Football League athlete to earn a weekly national honor in 2017, earning STATS FCS National Freshman of the Week, Monday. His three touchdown outing moved him atop the PFL leaderboard in rushing touchdowns this season, his five scores matching Valparaiso's Cody Boxrucker with both ranked 11th among FCS runners.

**NEW NAME FOR BUTLER HOME FACILITY** | The longtime home for Butler football received a new name in September when the Butler Bowl was renamed the Sellick Bowl in honor of longtime supporters Winstan and Jacqueline Sellick. The renaming was in recognition of a \$9.4-million gift from their estate to the university, shared among the athletics department, the Lacy School of Business and the university.

**FIVE PFL ALUMNI ON NFL ACTIVE ROSTERS |** The opening week of NFL action saw five PFL alumni listed on NFL active rosters. Marist alumni Terrence Fede (Miami) and Jason Myers (Jacksonville) returned to their teams for 2017. Drake's Eric Saubert (Atlanta), San Diego's Jamal Agnew (Detroit) and Stetson's Donald Payne (Jacksonville) are the league's newest alumni to make an NFL roster in 2017.

**EIGHT FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRE-SEASON SQUAD** | San Diego, the defending PFL Champion, returns four First-Team All-PFL selections among its seven preseason picks, including quarterback Anthony Lawrence. Dayton, last season's PFL runner up, had two returning first-team selections on the team while Campbell and Marist return one first-teamer each.

**SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL |** For the seventh consecutive year, the University of San Diego has been picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. San Diego, which won the 2016 regular-season title then advanced to the second round of the FCS Championship, again received the coaches' nod to win the 2017 PFL title. The Toreros were chosen just ahead of Dayton in polling that was dominated by the two teams. San Diego and Dayton combined to receive all available first-place votes and also claimed all but two of the possible second-place votes.

**DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK HITS 460 GAMES |** The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to Dayton, which extended the streak to 460 games in its Week 4 loss against Morehead State. That streak includes 265 games as a FCS member, which ranks fourth all-time among FCS programs. Montana holds the FCS' longest streak without being shutout at 373 games which dates back to 1989. On the FBS side, Florida holds the nation's longest streak of games without being shutout at 364, dating back to the 1988 season. The Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

**TWO PFL ALUMNI SELECTED IN 2017 NFL DRAFT** In a milestone moment for the Pioneer Football League, Drake tight end Eric Saubert and San Diego defensive back Jamal Agnew were each selected in the fifth round of the 2017 NFL Draft. The PFL was one of five Division I FCS conferences to have two players selected in the draft. The PFL joined the Colonial Athletic Association, Big Sky Conference, Missouri Valley Football Conference and the Southwestern Athletic Conference with two selections while the entire FCS saw 15 players drafted.

SAN DIEGO'S LAWRENCE NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST | San Diego junior quarterback Anthony Lawrence, a nominee for the 2016 Walter Payton Award Watch List a year ago, is one of 22 players on the 2017 preseason watch list for the 2017 STATS FCS Walter Payton Award. As a sophomore, he helped the Toreros to an undefeated league record and then an FCS playoff win over Cal Poly that was the first in PFL history. Lawrence ranked fourth in the FCS in completion percentage (67.6) and eighth in passing efficiency rating (155.0) while throwing for 2,998 yards and 25 touchdowns against eight interceptions

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. San Diego junior offensive lineman Daniel Cooney was a second-team selection while teammate senior defensive lineman Jonathan Petersen was joined on the third team by Drake punt returner Terry Wallen.

FIVE PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Three Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 146 nominees from across the country for the 26th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Isaak Newhouse (Butler), Ryan Samuels (Davidson) and Lawrence Dickens (Marist) were nominated for the 2017 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

**TOREROS CHARGE TO 2016 FCS OPENING ROUND WIN |** San Diego became the first PFL team to win a game in the Division I Football Championship with its 35-21 victory at Cal Poly, last season. The Toreros win came in just the fourth season of the PFL's automatic bid into the championship.

# **PFL ACTIVE WIN STREAKS**
