**GAME #10:** The USD Toreros (7-2, 6-0 PFL), under the direction of fifth year head coach **Dale Lindsey**, play their final regular-season road game this Saturday, November 11th, at Davidson College (2-7, 0-6 PFL). Game time is 9:00 a.m. (Pacific) from Richardson Stadium. A link to the video stream (\$5.95 fee) can be found at usdtoreros.com and davidsonwildcats.com. The game will also be broadcast on ESPN 1700AM with Jack Cronin providing the play-by-play. A win on Saturday would clinch the outright PFL title and the league's AQ for the 2017 NCAA Division I FCS Playoffs. USD's win over Davidson claimed a share of the 2017 PFL title, making this the fourth-straight season the Toreros have claimed at least a share of the PFL title and it is their ninth title all-time.

**FOOTBALL TICKETS:** Single game home ticket prices for football include the following: reserved seating (\$15), general admission (\$10 adult, \$5 high school student or under). USD faculty and staff receive up to four free general admission tickets (available upon request). The Toreros provide an excellent Family Four Pack for \$48; this comes with four general admission tickets, four hot dogs, four sodas and one popcorn. Group tickets for general admission only seats are \$7 (10 to 19 people), and \$5 for groups of 20 or more. Additionally, all military personnel (with proper ID) can receive a complimentary ticket for all Torero home football games.

**SERIES RECORD:** This will be 13th meeting between USD and Davidson with the Toreros owning a 10-2 series advantage... USD has won the last five meetings including last year's 52-3 win on October 8, 2016 at Torero Stadium.

**A LOOK AHEAD:** USD returns to Walter J. Zable Field at Torero Stadium to take on the Marist Red Foxes on November 18th (2:00 p.m.). It will be Senior Day with a pre-game ceremony for those seniors playing in their final home game.

**TOREROS STREAKING:** With last Saturday's 45-15 win over Drake, the Toreros have now won a PFL record nineteen consecutive Pioneer Football League games... That mark ranks second among FCS programs with Jacksonville State owning 30 straight victories.

**PETERSEN SETS TORERO ALL-TIME SACK RECORD:** Senior defensive end **Jonathan Petersen** (Poway, Calif.) tallied three sacks against Drake this past weekend to become the program's all-time leader with 38 career sacks. The previous USD record was held by Eric Bakhtiari (35, 2004-2007). Petersen, who is a candidate on the STATS FCS Buck Buchanan Award Watch List, needs five more sacks to set a new all-time FCS mark of 43. The current mark of 42.5 sacks is held by James Cowser (Southern Utah, 2012-15) who accomplished his record over 48 games. The Buchanan Award, first awarded in 1995 and presented to the FCS defensive player of the year, has sent past winners such as Dexter Coakley, Rashean Mathis, Jared Allen, Arthur Moats and Kyle Emanuel on to the NFL. Petersen currently ranks first amongst all FCS players in sacks (1.33 per game; 12 total for -92 yards), tackles for loss (1.9 per game; 17 total for -104 yards) and forced fumbles (0.56 per game, 5 total)... Petersen entered the 2016 campaign as USD's all-time leader in forced fumbles with 10. Already with five this season, he has extended that total to 15. Among FCS active career leaders, he ranks No. 1 in sacks (0.86) and forced fumbles (0.32) per game as well as career sacks (38.0). Petersen is No. 2 in tackles for loss per game (1.50).

## Head Coach Dale Lindsey - 5th Season

San Diego introduced Dale Lindsey as its new head football coach on December 29, 2012. Lindsey became the Toreros' 13th head coach and replaced Ron Caragher who was hired as head coach at San Jose State University. Lindsey enters the Davidson game with a career record of 43-12 (78.2 winning percentage). He has guided the Toreros to four straight PFL championships (2017, 2016, 2015 & 2014), and to the program's two postseason trips to the NCAA Division I FCS Playoffs.

**Coach Lindsey joins The Dan Sileo Show on The Mighty 1090AM every Friday at 8:50 a.m. (Pacific) to preview Saturday's game.**

Over the past four-plus seasons the Toreros have taken care of business in home games, going 26-2 with a perfect 19-0 PFL mark.

In 2016, USD, which finished with a national ranking of No. 19 (STATS FCS Top-25), defeated Cal Poly 35-21 in the first round of the playoffs becoming the first PFL school to win a playoff game in the FCS Playoffs. For the second time in three years Lindsey was named the PFL Coach of the Year and a Eddie Robinson Award Finalist for FCS Coach of the Year.

In 2015 he guided the Toreros to an overall record of 9-2 (6-0 home), including a share of the PFL Championship with its 7-1 record. USD opened the season by playing its first-ever FBS opponent in San Diego State before 48,785 fans at Qualcomm Stadium. Following a tough one-point road loss at Dayton, the Toreros closed out the year strong with six straight victories.

Lindsey directed the 2014 squad to its first ever NCAA Division I FCS Playoff spot as the Toreros finished 9-3 overall and won the PFL Championship with a 7-1 record. For his efforts Lindsey was named PFL Coach of the Year and a 2014 Eddie Robinson Award Finalist for FCS Coach of the Year. He guided the 2013 USD football program in his rookie year to an 8-3 overall record with the team winning its final four contests and seven of its final eight.

Lindsey returned to USD's staff in 2012 where he was the program's defensive coordinator. The Toreros finished the season with an overall record of 8-3 and earned a share of the Pioneer Football League title with Butler and Drake with 7-1 records. The Toreros won their final six games, and among 121 FCS teams in the country, USD ranked 14th in scoring defense (19.27), 15th in rushing defense (120.0) and 19th in pass efficiency defense (114.56).

From 2009-2011 Lindsey was at New Mexico State University where he was assistant head coach and linebackers coach. Prior to NMSU, he spent his first season with the USD staff in 2008, where he was the Torero linebackers coach. That season Lindsey helped the 9-2 Toreros' defense hold its opponents to just 18.9 points a game and 322 yards of total offense per contest.

Lindsey owns a wealth of football experience as a former NFL player and coach. His resume includes over 30 years of football coaching at the high school, college and professional ranks. Most recently with the Washington Redskins (2004-06), Lindsey also spent time on the San Diego Chargers staff as defensive coordinator (2002-03) and linebackers coach (1992-96).

From 1992-96, Lindsey was the linebackers coach on the Chargers' defensive staff that helped guide the team to a pair of AFC West titles (1992 and 1994), three play-off appearances (1992, 1994 and 1995) and one AFC Championship (1994). Lindsey also spent time with the Chicago Bears, New England Patriots, Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Green Bay Packers.

Lindsey played both linebacker and fullback for two years at Western Kentucky, helping the 1963 Hilltoppers to a 10-0-1 mark and the Tangerine Bowl Championship. Overall, the two Topper teams (1963-64) he played on went 16-3-2. A two-time All-OVC pick, he earned All-America honors as a linebacker in 1964 and was named to the all-time OVC Team in 1988. A Bowling Green (Ky.) High product, he was drafted by the Cleveland Browns (in the seventh round) and by the New York Jets of the American Football League (sixth round) in 1965 and went on to play nine seasons at linebacker for the Cleveland Browns (1965-73).

In 2008, Lindsey was inducted into the Kentucky Athletic Hall of Fame in Louisville, Kentucky. Lindsey and his wife, Eva, reside in Rancho Bernardo, and have five children - Blan, Jennifer, Kim, Johnny and Derek.



# SAN DIEGO FOOTBALL TORERO TIDBITS...

---

\* USD Football is in its 55th season of play, and 25th season as a member of the Pioneer Football League... San Diego is second for most PFL titles with nine (Dayton leads with 12)... The Toreros have won six of the past seven PFL championships (2017\*, 2016, 2015c, 2014, 2012c, 2011c) and eight overall when adding in titles from 2007c, 2006, 2005. Note: \*Currently a share of the PFL title.

\* Under head coach **Dale Lindsey's** watch, the Toreros are now 26-2 overall in home games at Torero Stadium, including a perfect 4-0 mark this season. Coach Lindsey has yet to drop a home PFL contest in four-plus seasons (19-0 record) and the Toreros have now won 30 straight league home games and a PFL record 19 consecutive PFL contests. Lindsey, a two-time PFL Coach of the Year and two-time FCS Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year candidate, is 43-12 overall (78.2 winning percentage). Coach Lindsey has a weekly radio spot every Friday at 8:50 a.m. (Pacific) on the Dan Sileo Show on The Mighty 1090AM.

\* Three Toreros have received prestigious preseason recognition... Junior QB **Anthony Lawrence** is on the STATS FCS Walter Payton Award Watch List that is given to the top FCS player at the end of the year... Junior left tackle **Daniel Cooney** was named to the STATS FCS All-America Second Team and senior DE **Jonathan Petersen** was named to the STATS FCS All-America Third Team.

\* **Anthony Lawrence** earned his second PFL Player of the week honor following the Jacksonville game. He earned his first award this season after the Butler game when he was tabbed the PFL Co-Offensive Player of the Week. In the two games combined he tossed 11 touchdowns. He was also selected an Amateur Star of the Month for September by the San Diego Hall of Champions. Through nine games he has completed 179-of-267 passes (67.0%) for 2,274 yards and 25 touchdowns with just one interception. In FCS ranks, he is tied for third in passing TDs (25), 4th in passing efficiency (168.7), 17th in passing yards (2,274) and 18th in passing yards per game (252.7). His three-year totals include 613-of-926 passing (66.2%) for 7,964 yards and 73 touchdowns (4th all-time at USD).

\* Freshman running back **Emilio Martinez** (Salinas, Calif.) is first among PFL players in kickoff returns (25.8; #14 FCS) and is second in all-purpose yards per game (141.8; #8 in FCS). He ranks fourth in the PFL in total rushing yards (781 yards; #19 FCS). Junior **Joseph Binda Jr.** has also turned in some solid runs this season with 271 yards (4.6 ave.) and 5 rushing touchdowns.

\* Lawrence has two reliable seniors when looking down field... **Justin Priest** leads the squad with 52 receptions for 793 yards (15.2 ave.) and 9 touchdowns, and tight end **Ross Dwelley** has hauled in 34 balls for 430 yards (12.6 ave.) and 7 touchdowns.

\* Including Petersen, season defensive leaders include safety **Colton Giorgi** (50 tackles, 1 fumble recovery), LB **Kim Mahoney** (49 tackles, 2 breakups, 3 quarterback hurries, 2 forced fumbles and 3 fumble recoveries), NB **Max Michaels** (48 tackles, 5 tackles for loss, 1 interception, 2 breakups, 3 quarterback hurries) and safety **Ray Clark** (45 tackles, 3 tackles for loss). Senior CB **Kishan Patel** recorded his second interception of the season with his 21-yard return against the Drake Bulldogs this past Saturday.

\* The Toreros rank in eleven FCS top-10 areas - #1 tackles for loss allowed (3.11), #2 passes had intercepted (2), #3 third down conversion (51.7%), #3 turnovers lost (7), #4 team passing efficiency (167.24), #5 rushing defense (75.0), #5 sacks allowed (0.67), #7 completion percentage (66.7%), #7 fewest penalties per game (4.33), #8 red zone defense (65.4%), and #8 scoring offense (36.8).

\* From the more than 1.1 million high school football players across the country, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) announced the names of five outstanding individuals as the recipients of the 2017 NFF Chapter Scholar-Athlete Awards. USD freshman fullback **Brandon Micale** (Arvada, CO) was selected for the west region for this honor. He will be a guest in New York on Dec. 5 for the awards luncheon, and the five 2017 recipients will attend the 60th NFF Annual Awards Dinner, also at the New York Hilton Midtown, as honored guests where they will meet many of the game's greatest legends and current college stars.

\* Senior LB **Max Michaels** (Poway, Calif.) was a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, announced by the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame. He was one of 181 semi-finalists for the award that recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation. Michaels carries a 3.95 grade-point average in his major of Accountancy.

\* "**Mr. Torero**" - Including his four seasons as a wide receiver for the Toreros from 1979-1983, **Mike Rish**, Senior Offensive Administrative Assistant, is now in his 39th year with the USD football program. Incredibly, he has missed only one game out of a possible 405 games to date during his run... He missed the team's 31-28 road win at UC Santa Barbara during the 1984 season to attend a family wedding... This Saturday's game vs. Davidson will be his 345th consecutive game and 405th overall out of 406. An amazing streak.

\* Since the start of the 2005 season the Toreros have combined for an overall record of 107-36 (74.8 winning percentage), and a PFL mark of 72-15 (82.7 winning percentage)... USD's overall home record on Walter J. Zable Field at Torero Stadium during this run is 66-19 (77.6 winning percentage)... Including the last five home wins of the 2004 campaign, the Toreros strung together a school record 28 straight home victories (2004-2008).

\* Former Torero Jamal Agnew (San Diego, Calif.), now on the active roster for the Detroit Lions, electrified an ESPN national audience on Monday Night Football (Sept. 18) when he returned a 4th quarter punt against the New York Giants for 88 yards and a TD. The return came at a crucial moment for the Lions, which were leading 17-10 at the time, extending their lead to two touchdowns, 24-10, and the game's final score. He was named the NFC Special Teams Player of the Week. On Sunday (Oct. 15) he did it again, this time for 74 yards against the New Orleans Saints, becoming just the 5th Lions player to return two punts for a TD in the same season.

\* This week's opponent, the Davidson Wildcats, own an overall record of 2-7 (0-6 PFL)... This past weekend they dropped a 42-29 decision to Campbell, currently the second place team in the PFL... Season leaders include HB Wesley Dugger (940 yards rushing, 7 TDs), WR William Hicks (41 receptions for 605 yards, 4 TDs), QB Tyler Phelps (118-for-222 for 1,257 yards, 5 TDs), LB George Hatalowich (58 tackles, 7 TFL) and DT Bryce Perry-Martin (4 tackles, 12 TFL, 5 sacks)... Head Coach Paul Nichols in in his 5th season at the helm.
