On May 10, 2017, Davidson College Athletic Director Jim Murphy announced the hiring of Gayle Coats Fulks as the head coach for the Wildcat women's basketball program. She is the 12th head coach in the program's 38-year history.

Quick Highlights...

- Spent the last five years at Wake Forest as an assistant coach, primarily working with the guards and wing players, and was the program's recruiting coordinator.
- She was integral in recruiting, helping the Demon Deacons put together ranked recruiting classes each year on staff.
- She was recognized as one of WBCA's Thirty Under 30 honorees after fourth season at Wake Forest. The award is given annually to up-and-coming coaches 30 years old and younger, to recognize their involvement in community service, mentorship and impact on others' professional manner and attitude as well as association involvement.
- During tenure at Wake Forest, the Demon Deacons earned back-to-back post-season bids to the Women's NIT in 2016 and 2017, reaching the second round both seasons.
- Coached two ACC All-Freshmen Team members and a pair of ACC First and Second Team picks during time at Wake.
- Graduated from Fairleigh Dickinson in 2007, where she was a four-year letterwinner for the Knights.

Coach History...

Coats Fulks came to Davidson from Wake Forest University, where she spent the five years as an assistant coach under Jen Hoover. The last two years (2015-16 & 2016-17) Wake Forest earned at-large bids to the Women's NIT, reaching the second round both seasons during Coats Fulks tenure.

During the 2016-17 season, the Demon Deacons went 17-16 overall and earned a win over Bethune-Cookman in the first round of the WNIT before falling to Middle Tennessee State to end their season. Guard Alex Sharp became the second student-athlete under Coats Fulks to be named to the Atlantic Coast Conference All-Freshman Team, joining fellow teammate Ariel Stephenson who garnered the award a year ago from the Blue Ribbon Panel and the league's coaches.

In addition to helping the Demon Deacons to consecutive NIT appearances the last two seasons, Coats Fulks was recognized during the 2015-16 campaign as one of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's (WBCA) Thirty Under 30 honorees. The award is given annually to up-and-coming coaches 30 years old and younger, to recognize their involvement in community service, mentorship and impact on others' professional manner and attitude as well as association involvement.

While on the bench for head coach Hoover for five seasons, Coats Fulks assisted in all aspects of the program, from academics to recruiting, where she served as an integral part to the Demon Deacons putting together ranked recruiting classes each year on staff.

In her first season with the Deacs, she helped guide one of the top-scoring backcourts in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Point guard Chelsea Douglas led the team in scoring at 14.6 points per game, while Lakevia Boykin was right behind her at 14.4 points. The two combined to make 134 three-pointers on the season, with Douglas' 72 ranking as the third-most for a single-season in school history.

Coats Fulks joined the Wake Forest staff after one season as an assistant coach at UNC Greensboro in 2011-12. With the Spartans, Coats Fulks assisted with academics, recruiting, scouting, game preparation and practice planning, along with player development. She also served as the team's academic liaison.

Coats Fulks broke into the coaching ranks at Longwood University, where she was on staff from 2007-11. In her first season with the Lancers, they went 16-13, notching the program's best win total in its Division I era at the time.

Prior to her first collegiate job, Coats Fulks served as the Assistant Video Coordinator during the 2007 season for the WNBA's New York Liberty, where she assisted with scouting reports and film exchange.

A four-year letterwinner at Fairleigh Dickinson, Coats Fulks was a co-captain and member of the Northeast Conference All-Academic squad. She graduated in 2007 with a Bachelor of Science degree in business management.



2016-17 Highlights:

- Award the team's Wildcat Award as well as the Captain's Award with Kayla Seymour.
- Named to the A-10 Commissioner's Honor Roll for the Spring semester.
- Had another strong year in third season with averages of 13.7 points and a team-best 7.4 rebounds per game.
- Became the 19th Wildcat to reach 1,000 points, Jan. 7, at Duquesne with a double-double in 18 points and 11 rebounds.
- Tallied six double-doubles on the season, pushing career total to 19.
- The forward hit the double-digit mark in points 19 times overall and has 64 for three-year career so far.
- Of those 19, five of them were 20-point outings, including a career-high 28 points on a personal-best 12-for-20 shooting and pulling down

a season-best 14 rebounds to go with a block and three steals in 40 minutes of action at Charlotte, Dec. 21.

- In Davidson's season opener at No. 22 Michigan State, filled the box score with five points and team highs of seven rebounds, three blocks and three steals, with the three steals giving her 100 for her career.
- Reached double digits for first time with a 13-point outing at Western Michigan.
- Named to the Cancan Challenge's All-Riviera Division Team after averaging 15.5 points and five rebounds a game against Toledo and Idaho State. Scored a season best 16 points against ISU, hit 6-of-16 field goals to go with a 4-for-4 showing at the charity stripe while pocketing three steals.
- Reached the double-digit mark with 14 points and added eight rebounds (season-high five on offense) to pace the team in both categories vs. UNCW, Nov. 30.
- Had first double-double of the season with 12 points and 10 rebounds, while matching season-best with three blocks at ETSU, Dec. 3.
- Recorded sixth straight double-figure scoring game with a season-high 19 points on a season-best 9-of-17 shooting while adding six rebounds, four assists, three steals and a block.
- Reached the 20-point mark for the first time with a career-high tying 25 points, canning a personal-best 11 field goals, to go with eight rebounds (reached 500-mark) in a season-best 38 minutes during Davidson's 71-61 win at home vs. Furman, Dec. 18.
- Recorded second double-double with impressive outing at Charlotte, Dec. 21, dropping in a career-high 28 points, on a personal-best 12-for-20 shooting and pulling down a season-best 14 rebounds to go with a block and three steals in 40 minutes of action.
- Earned second straight double-double at home vs. Mercer with a 12-point, 13-rebound (season-high 11 on defense) effort.
- Drained 10-of-15 shots on way to third 20-point outing of the season with a team-high 23 points to go with six rebounds in Davidson's A-10 opener vs. Saint Louis, Dec. 31.
- Had a 19-point effort at Fordham, Jan. 4, hitting 8-of-17 shots for 11th straight double-digit scoring game and added seven rebounds.
- Picked up fifth double-double of the year, 18th of career, with a 14-point, 13-rebound effort at home against UMass, while adding a pair of assists and blocks.
- Had second straight double-double, sixth of the season, leading the Wildcats with 21 points and 10 rebounds to go with a season-high three steals at George Washington, Jan. 15.
- Scored in double figures for the 15th straight game with a 14-point outing and pocketed a career-best six steals in helping guide Davidson to its first A-10 win, Jan. 18.
- Reached the 20-point mark for the fifth time with 22 points and set a new personal-best with nine steals, two off the school record, at home vs. La Salle.
- Saw personal-best 16-game double-figure scoring streak end with a nine-point outing, but did add six rebounds to reach the 600 mark for career, two blocks and three steals at St. Bonaventure, Jan. 25.
- Had a solid-around game in a win at UMass, Feb. 4, scoring eight points, pulling in 10 rebounds, dishing out four assists, blocking two shots and pocketing a pair of steals.
- Capped off junior season with team bests of 15 points and eight rebounds at Fordham in the first round of the A-10 Championship.

- Reached the double-figure mark in points 19 times and had 13 total games of double-digit rebounds.
- Second on the team in scoring at 11.6 points and had a team-best 8.2 rebounding average.
- Ranked third in rebounding in the A-10, while also ranking fifth in defensive rebounds per game (5.7).
- 246 rebounds was tied for seventh-most in a Wildcat single season.

The freshman was clutch in the final minute hitting the tying and game-winner buckets to give the 'Cats the victory.
- Registered second double-double in a row with 14 points and 10 rebounds (season-high six on offense) in a 67-62 home win vs. Mount St. Mary's.

- Tallied sixth double-double of the season at home vs. Rhode Island, scoring a team-high 18 points on 9-of-18 shooting and pulling in a game-best 12 rebounds in 34 minutes.
- Recorded eighth double-digit rebounding game vs. Richmond, pulling in a game-high 12.

The 2016-17 season marked Davidson women's basketball program's third year in the Atlantic 10 as they finished up the program's 38th year.

Individually, the senior trio of Rachel Piles, Kayla Seymour and Melanie Ransom finished out their careers with nice senior seasons.

Below are just a few of the Wildcat highlights throughout the campaign.

Preseason Honors For Latt

The annual Atlantic 10 Women's Basketball media day saw junior Mackenzie Latt earn preseason honors. The rising junior was named to the preseason third team, the first program's first player to earn preseason honors.

First Time Opponents

Davidson's non-conference schedule had four new opponents it faced for the first time in program history. The 'Cats faced Western Michigan on the road, then UCF at home before taking on Toledo and Idaho State at the Cancun Challenge.

It's the most first-time opponents Davidson faced in a year since it took on 10 during the 2014-15 season, the 'Cats first year in the Atlantic 10.

Latt Named to the All-Riviera Division Team at Cancun Challenge

For her outstanding two games at the Cancun Challenge, Mackenzie Latt was named to the All-Riviera Division Team. The junior averaged 15.5 points and five rebounds a game vs. Toledo and Idaho State. She scored a season-high 16 points against the Bengals in Davidson's final game of the holiday tournament.

Cancun Challenge

For the first time in the program's history, the Wildcats traveled outside the United States as they took part in the Cancun Challenge, Nov. 24-25.

Davidson faced Toledo and Idaho State for the first time, dropping both contests. Against the Rockets, Latt paced the team with a game-high 15 points, while freshman Andrea Robinson crashed the glass for a game and season-high 12 rebounds.

The following day vs. Idaho State, Davidson's valiant comeback effort fell just short against Idaho State in a 70-58. Trailing by as many as 20 (45-25) in the third quarter, Davidson twice got within single digits but a late 9-0 run by the Bengals halted the Wildcats' efforts. Mackenzie Latt again paced the Wildcat attack with a season-high 16 points, 14 of which came in the last two quarters when the 'Cats were making their comeback. Fellow junior Chloe Johnson netted a season-high 13 points, draining 3-of-5 shots from downtown.

Latt and Speight Strike Again, Pace 'Cats to Win vs. Furman

For the second game in a row, the pair of Mackenzie Latt and Kianna Speight helped carry Davidson to a win, scoring

25 and 20 points, respectively, in a 71-61 triumph at home vs. Furman, Dec. 18. The duos point totals each tied their career highs. The win was Davidson's seventh in the past nine meetings vs. the Paladins and 15th in the last 21 overall.

Latt finished the game canning a career-high 11 field goals on 17 attempts and added a team-best eight rebounds. Speight's five three-pointers were a career high and she set a new personal best with seven rebounds.

Justine Lyon gave Davidson three double-digit scorers with 12 points and matched Speight with seven boards. Rachel Piles came off the bench to pull in six rebounds and pocket a career-best four steals, while Chloe Johnson dished out a career-high nine assists.

Davidson as a team had 19 helpers on their 26 made field goals. In addition, the Wildcats' point totals of 24 and 28 in the first and fourth quarters were season bests, while it set a team season best with seven blocks and tied a season high with 45 rebounds.

Welcome to the 1,000-Point Club

Junior Mackenzie Latt became the latest Wildcat to reach 1,000 points, Jan. 7, at Duquesne. Latt is the 19th player in program history to hit the special mark after she nailed a long jumper in the second quarter for her 1,000th and 1,001 career points. She went on to finish with 18 points, while adding 11 rebounds for her fourth double-double of the season.

It marks the 10th year in the past 11 that a Wildcat has scored 1,000 points for their career. Last year saw Dakota Dukes reach the milestone to become the 18th player.

Under head coach Michele Savage, it is her sixth 1,000-point scorer she has coached.

Seeing Double

Mackenzie Latt, who 11 times as a freshman recorded a double-double for the fifth-most in a Wildcat single season since 1992-93, picked up her sixth double-double of the season at George Washington, Jan. 15, to push her career total to 19. She finished with a 21 points to go with 10 rebounds.

Davidson Nets First A-10 Win of Season

Sophomore Justine Lyon hit the 20-point mark for the third time this year and junior Chloe Johnson hit the go-ahead bucket to help lead Davidson to its first Atlantic 10 win of the season with a 58-54 decision over visiting George Mason, Jan. 18.

Tied at 54-all with 53 seconds left, Johnson drove down the lane with the shot clock running down and hit a layup with 26 ticks left for a 56-54 lead. The 'Cats

added two free throws to seal up the win.

Lyon drained 9-of-17 shots on her way to a game-high 22 points. Mackenzie Latt finished with 14 points, seven rebounds and a career-best six steals, while Johnson added nine points.

Lyon, 'Cats Down UMass on the Road For Second A-10 Win

Sophomore Justine Lyon scored a career-high 34 points and Davidson secured its second Atlantic 10 win by holding off UMass in a 63-59 road win, Feb. 4.

Lyon topped her previous career best from earlier this season by four points, scoring 20 of her 34 in the first two quarters, and helped seal the win by scoring eight of Davidson's final 10 points in the last two minutes. She finished a career-best 9-of-12 from the charity stripe, all coming in the last quarter, while shooting 11-for-20 from the floor overall with a trio of three-balls.

Davidson led for over 35 minutes of the game, holding off the Minutewomen after they tied the game at 43-all in the fourth quarter by using a quick 7-2 run to go up five and never looked back.

Lyon Reaches 30 Again

Justine Lyon's stellar sophomore campaign continued as the sophomore reached the 30-point mark for the second time this season, going off for a career-high 34 points at UMass, Feb. 4. She hit for 20 of those points in the first and second quarter combined. Lyon tied her career-high with 11 made field goals on 20 attempts and set a personal best at the charity stripe by going 9-for-12, all coming in the fourth quarter.

The pair of 30-point outings is the first time dating back to 1992-93, when the women's basketball program was restarted, that a player had twice reached that mark in a single season. Jennifer O'Brien had three 30-point games spanned over four seasons (1996-2000). The last player to hit for 30 points in a season was Dakota Dukes at Wofford, March 2, 2014.

Outstanding Week Gives Lyon A-10 Co-Player of the Week

Justine Lyon was honored by the Atlantic 10 by being named the co-player of the week, Feb. 6. She shared her first collegiate weekly honor with George Washington's Caira Washington. It was also Davidson's first-ever weekly honor in its three years in the A-10.

The Durham, N.C., native had a stellar week in leading Davidson to a 1-1 record, averaging 28 points and 4.5 rebounds a game, while shooting a solid 54.3 percent. She also canned 5-of-13 three-balls and went 13-for-20 at the charity stripe, while adding three assists, two blocks and four steals.

Johnson Dishes Out 10 Dimes, 'Cats have Season-high 25

Junior Chloe Johnson led an unselfish effort at home Feb. 11 in a win vs. Rhode Island by dishing out a career-high 10 assists, while Davidson as a team had a season-best 25 on 30 made field goals.

Behind the senior trio of Rachel Piles, Melanie Ransom and Kayla Seymour, Davidson picked up a 74-64 Senior Day win over visiting Rhode Island, Feb. 11. It was the Wildcats' first win of the all-time series as well.

Piles hauled in a team-high seven rebounds to go with a block and three steals. Ransom in her first career start scored eight points and dished out three assists, while Seymour hit a personal-best 4-of-9 shots for a season-high eight points and assisted on four other baskets.

Davidson pulled away with a 15-6 run that spanned the final 2:10 of the third quarter and went to the 6:17 mark in the fourth quarter. Capping the rally off was six straight points by Ransom to turn a 50-43 lead into a 65-49 advantage.

Davidson Caps Home Slate With Thrilling Second Straight A-10 Win

Davidson erased a nine-point fourth-quarter deficit and junior Saadia Timpton hit the game-winner with 14.6 seconds left to give the Wildcats a thrilling 52-51 win in their home finale against Fordham, Feb. 14. It was the Wildcats' second straight win at home vs. Fordham, while also collecting its second consecutive Atlantic 10 overall and at home.

New Season Highs Set in Win Over the Rams

In Davidson's win over Rhode Island, Feb. 11, a 74-64 victory at home, it hit a few new team season highs. The Wildcats 27-point outing in the second quarter topped its previous high by four, while they hauled in a game-high 47 rebounds.

In addition, the 'Cats were very unselfish with the ball, dishing out 25 assists on 30 made field goals to top its previous high of 20 assists vs. High Point. Finally, they used the fast-break to their advantage, matching a season-high with 20 points, which was set vs. High Point earlier this season.

Another 20-Point Outing for Lyon

Sophomore Justine Lyon registered her ninth 20-point outing this year going off for a game-high 25 points at VCU, Feb. 21. The sophomore scored 11 of her points in the four quarter.

Eight of her 20-point outings have come in league games this season. Three times she has gone off for 22 points in games against Fordham, George Mason and Dayton.

It was a new era for most of Davidson College sports as it moved to the Atlantic 10 for the 2014-15 after a 74-year run in the Southern Conference (1936-88, 1991-2013).

"Davidson is thrilled to join the Atlantic 10 Conference to compete alongside some of the most dynamic Division I student-athletes in the country," Quillen said. "Our athletic teams – from men's basketball to women's lacrosse, from men's swimming to women's tennis – are ready for this new opportunity and we have the greatest confidence they will succeed."

According to most recent NCAA graduation rates, the Atlantic 10 ranked second among all Division I conferences, with 90 percent of their student-athletes graduating.

"The Atlantic 10 is a conference that gives Davidson the opportunity to be associated with and compete against institutions with significant profiles, both academically and athletically, while we continue to establish our national brand. This is a great opportunity to use athletics to further the goals and objectives of the college as we enhance the experience of our students," said Director of Athletics Jim Murphy.

The geographic footprint of the Atlantic 10 Conference covers eight different states and the District of Columbia for a total population of 75.3 million people (2010 Census).

The move allows 19 of Davidson's 21 sports to compete in the A-10, with the exception of football and wrestling. Football will remain in the Pioneer Football League which hosts non-scholarship programs, while wrestling will seek to continue its affiliation with the Southern Conference.

SARAH WOMACK PARHAM, INDUCTED IN 1996-97

Parham, Director of Psychosocial Club House, Catawba County Mental Health Services, became the first women's basketball player to be inducted into the Davidson Hall of Fame. She set 18 school records in her four-year career from 1977 through 1980 and she's the only female athlete whose jersey is retired. When she graduated in 1980, Womack's school records included most career points (1,249) and rebounds (601). Ranking ninth in career points, she's the all-time leader in points per game (16.7) and is third in made field goals (556). She holds the single-game record for attempted field goals (32) and ranks third in points per game for a single season at 19.1. She received the Rebecca Stimson Award in 1980 as the college's most outstanding female athlete.

ELIZABETH A. TANNER, INDUCTED IN 1997-98

Beth Tanner was the 1978 recipient of the Rebecca Stimson Award for her accomplishments in women's basketball and field hockey. A standout guard on the basketball team, Tanner graduated in 1978 as the Wildcat's all-time leading scorer in women's basketball with 792 points. Tanner also held single-game (10 against Guilford) and season (67 in 1976) records in assists, and the season record holder for steals with 60. Tanner averaged 11.3 points per game in her career from 1974 through 1978. She also at one time shared the single-game record for field goal percentage with .818 (9 for 11) against Catawba in 1974.



JENNIFER R. ROOS, INDUCTED IN 2004-05



A three-sport athlete at Davidson, Jennifer Roos excelled at whatever she did. She was an outstanding field hockey player during some of the squad's best seasons, earning the Stimson Award as Davidson's top female athlete to cap her career. As a freshman, she was named the team's defensive MVP. The following year, only one person was honored as the team MVP, and she earned it each of her final three seasons. Roos, a defender, scored nine goals and had one assist as a sophomore, the best offensive output of her career. She was named All-Deep South each of her first three campaigns, plus was All-Southeast Region as a junior.

One of the first field hockey players to be awarded a scholarship, Roos was a member of the lacrosse club team that went 12-3 before the sport was elevated to varsity status the year after she graduated. She was also a key player for the women's basketball team in its first season back as a varsity sport during her senior year. She played the point and was one of two players to start all 22 games. Her 77 assists led the team, as did her 64 steals. She also drained a three-pointer at the buzzer to lift the Wildcats to a 64-62 win over Winthrop.

CAROLYN KIRSCH RUMPEL, INDUCTED IN 2007-08

Davidson's first women's basketball player to be named SoCon Player of the Year (1997), Kirsch ranks second all-time in rebounding (878) and ranks sixth in scoring (1,370 points). The native of Heidelberg, Germany, earned first-team All-SoCon honors in 1997 and was named second-team all-league in 1996. She was named to the conference's academic honor roll twice and was a two-time winner of the Wildcat Award, given to the team's most valuable player. Kirsch led the 'Cats to a 29-23 overall record and two top-5 SoCon finishes in her final two seasons.




JENNIFER O'BRIEN, INDUCTED IN 2010-11

Second all-time scorer in school history with 1,510 points when she graduated, Jennifer O'Brien was named first-team All-SoCon in 1998 and 2000, and earned second-team honors in 1999. She was named to the SoCon All-Tournament Team from 1998-2000. O'Brien owns Davidson single-game records in steals and assists. She owns the school all-time marks for assists (588) and steals (368), and ranks in the top-10 in points per game, field goals made, 3-point field goals, 3-point field goal percentage, free throws and rebounds. She won the Wildcat Award for team MVP honors in 1998 and 2000 and the Rebecca Stimson award in 2000. Davidson posted a record of 61-47 during her four-year career.

CAROLYN KIRSCH, 1996-97

Carolyn Kirsch stepped up her level of play as a senior to lead the Southern Conference in scoring (16.3 ppg) and become the first Wildcat to be named SoCon Player of the Year.

The 5-11 guard from Heidelberg, Germany, was also among the league leaders in steals (2.3 spg), field goal percentage (47.7 percent) and rebounding (7.8 rpg) in 1996-97 while guiding Davidson to a then school record 15 wins. She reached the 20-point plateau eight times as a senior, including a team season-best 26-point performance in the 'Cats' 84-65 win over Western Carolina on Jan. 11, 1997.



SOPHIA ALEKSANDRAVICIUS, 2011-12

Sophia Aleksandravicius had a stellar junior campaign, leading the league in rebounding (8.9) and blocks (2.9), while ranking fourth in scoring (13.8), as she was named the SoCon Player of the Year by the coaches. She was also voted the Defender of the Year. Twice Aleksandravicius was named the player of the month during the regular season, while garnering first-team All-SoCon honors on both the coaches and media teams.

The 6-foot-5 forward from Pound Ridge, N.Y., led the Wildcats to a 22-10 record and helped the program capture its first regular season title with a school-best mark of 17-3 in the league. She finished the season scoring in double-digits in 29 games and registering 11 double-doubles.



SOPHIA ALEKSANDRAVICIUS, 2012-13 SoCon ATHLETE OF THE YEAR, 2012-13

Sophia Aleksandravicius, a three-time All-SoCon First Team pick in her career, made program history as she became the first Wildcat to earn a second Southern Conference Player of the Year honor, while also grabbing the Defender of the Year for a second straight season as she took home both awards in 2012-13. The 6-foot-5 forward led the SoCon in scoring (16.5), rebounding (9.9) and blocks (102- 2.9 per game / 10th in the nation), all career highs.

Aleksandravicius' award-winning season was not done there as she was named the SoCon Female Athlete of the Year, becoming the first female at Davidson to earn the prestigious award and the seventh Wildcat overall. In addition, the senior was honored with Davidson College's Rebecca A. Stimson Award for being the top student female-athlete.

Other accolades during her amazing senior campaign included being named the SoCon Player of the Year by CollegeSportsMadness.com and earning first-team honors. The publication named Aleksandravicius to the All Mid-Major Second Team. The senior was also a Full Court Mid-Major All-America Honorable Mention by fullcourt.com. She was a first-team SoCon All-Tournament pick after guiding Davidson to the SoCon Championship game for just the second time in program history. During the regular season, Aleksandravicius was a three-time SoCon Player of the Week honoree, and took home the league's player of the month award in January and February to give her four for her career.

It was a record-setting career for Aleksandravicius, who was a two-time SoCon Player and Defender of the Year, and a three-time All-SoCon First Team member on both the coaches and media teams. During her senior year, she set seven school records, including points (1,878), rebounds (1,143) and blocks (339), while also setting six new single-season Wildcat records. The senior is the only women's player, and just the third basketball player at Davidson, to have over 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds in a career.

The forward also set a single-game blocks record with 10 on her way to collecting the program's first triple-double, Feb. 16, with 20 points, 10 rebounds and 10 blocks in home win vs. Furman.

Aleksandravicius put her name among the greats in the SoCon women's basketball record book during her four years. She finished ranked in the top-10 all-time in: points (10th), scoring (14.8- 9th), field goals (5th), field goal attempts (4th), free throws (9th), free throw attempts (10th), rebounding (4th) and blocks (10- 2nd-best single game, 102- 2nd-best in single season, 339- 1st).

The senior forward wrapped up her stellar career by scoring in double digits 104 times, including 28 20-point outings and a pair of 30-point games. Aleksandravicius registered 56 double-digit rebounding games during her career, with 22 of those coming in the 2012-13 season.

Aleksandravicius led Davidson to its second straight postseason appearance, and third overall, with a trip to the 2013 Women's NIT, where the Wildcats netted the program's first postseason victory. The senior tallied her 50th career double-double, and 20th of the season, with 27 points and 11 rebounds in guiding the 'Cats to a first-round win at Old Dominion, March 21. Her 20 double-doubles ranked 11th in the nation during the season.

The 2006-07 season for the Davidson women's basketball team will go down as one of the best, if not the best ever, in program history.

Twenty-three wins. A 10-game winning streak. A nine-game road winning streak. Eleven road wins in all. Ten home wins. Those were just a few of the many accomplishments that either set a new school record or tied one.

For all their hard work, Davidson put an exclamation point on their season when they found out Monday, Mar. 12, 2007 they would continue their historic season with the team's first-ever trip to postseason play when it earned an at-large bid to the Women's National Invitational Tournament.

It marked the first time ever the women's team had earned a postseason bid. They were part of WNIT history as for the first time, each of the nation's 31 conferences will be represented in the WNIT. The tournament expanded to 48 teams this year to accommodate an automatic berth for each of the conferences.

Davidson's opponent in its first trip to postseason play was the UAB Blazers. The two schools had faced each other just once, back on Dec. 16, 2001.

Playing in their first-ever postseason game, the senior trio of Jessica Mitchell, Brynn Kelly, and Tia Washington looked to

give the Wildcats their first career postseason win. Mitchell did all she could to keep the Wildcats within striking distance, draining a career-high 24 points by tying her career-best with nine field goals made and hit four of the Wildcats' 10 three-pointers. Three of her four three-balls came in the second half, including one with 14 seconds on the clock to bring the Wildcats within one, 78-77. She also matched her season-high with seven assists.

Kelly was the only other 'Cat in double figures as she registered her fourth career

double-double on 12 points and 11 rebounds. Davidson, as a team, hauled in a game-high 46 boards to win the rebounding margin, 46-39.

Trailing by 11 (67-56) with 8:24 left in the game, Davidson started its rally with a three-pointer from Mitchell on the right wing. The shot sparked a 16-5 run over the next five and a half minutes that saw the Wildcats knot things up at 72-all on yet another three-pointer, this time from freshman Alex Thompson on the left side. Junior Danielle Hemerka also canned back-to-back shots from downtown in the run and finished the contest with eight points, four boards and three assists.

A quick 5-0 run, three of the points coming from the Blazers' Diamond Rogers, gave UAB back the lead at 77-72 with just 36 seconds on the clock.

Davidson charged right back, getting a fade-away jumper by sophomore Kelly Gassie and Mitchell's three-pointer that closed the gap to one (78-77). Rogers and Britney Jones sealed the Wildcats' hopes though, hitting three of four free throws in the closing seconds and Mitchell's last-second three-pointer was off target for the final score of 81-77.

The Wildcats did not get many calls their way all evening as the fouls were 20-

11 and UAB stepped to the charity stripe 25 times (16-for-25) compared to Davidson's six trips (5-for-6).

Davidson used the hot hand of Mitchell in the first half to jump out to an early 11-10 advantage. Mitchell was perfect in the first half, draining all five of her shots from the field, including her only shot from downtown, and had two free throws for 13-first half points. The Wildcats as a team started the contest hitting eight of their first 12 shots, including two three-pointers. They finished the half nailing 15-of-29 shots from the floor for 51.7 percent and closed out the game shooting 44.9 percent.

UAB grabbed the lead back, 12-11, on the next possession on a layup from Shi-mena Moore and maintained at least a one-point lead all the way into halftime for a score of 39-36.

Sophomore Mercedes Robinson assisted off the bench during the Wildcats' second-half comeback with all eight her points coming in the second period. She also hauled in nine rebounds and picked up one of Davidson's season-high five blocks.





The Davidson women's basketball team made a return trip to the women's NIT after a record-setting 2011-12 campaign. The Wildcats won their first regular season Southern Conference title with a school-best mark of 17-3, earning the automatic bid into the WNIT. The squad finished with 22 wins, one off the school record, while they rattled off a nine-game winning streak, again one off the 10-game set by the 2006-07 team that made the program's first postseason bid. The Wildcats also set a bench mark with a 12-1 home record at Belk Arena, including a record 9-1 record vs. the SoCon.

The 'Cats took their 22-9 record to Harrisonburg, Va., on Thursday, March 15, for a first-round matchup against the Dukes. It was the first-ever matchup against both teams.

James Madison entered the WNIT with a 24-7 record after reaching the semifinals of the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament. It marked only the second time since 2005 that the Dukes had not advanced to the championship game after winning the last two CAA Championships.

Junior Sophia Aleksandravicius, the SoCon Player of the Year as voted on by the coaches, scored a season-best 25 points and Davidson forced 22 turnovers, but was unable to overcome a 19-7 second-half run by James Madison in falling 64-49 in the

first round of the Women's NIT.

Davidson concluded its season at 22-10, one win away from the school-record, as it made its second-ever postseason appearance. James Madison (25-7) moves on and will play Wake Forest in the second round.

Aleksandravicius finished with 25 points, 17 of them in the second-half when she kept the Wildcats in the game. She added nine rebounds, two assists and two blocks.

Down 24-20 at the break, the junior got Davidson's offense rolling by scoring seven straight points to open the new stanza, and a fastbreak bucket by Jasmine

Calin after she leaked out on the break gave the 'Cats a 29-28 advantage with 14:13 to go. It would be the only lead Davidson had for the game.

JMU would score a quick six points and then continue their run to 10-2 for a 38-31 advantage. The spurt continued all the way out to 19-7 giving the Dukes the lead for good at 47-36 with under five minutes to go.

Lauren Whitehurst led the rally with eight of her 14 total points in the run. The Dukes overall had three reach double figures with Tarik Hislop scoring 15 points and Kirby Burkholder 11, nine of them on treys.

The lead was cut to nine at 49-40 on a layup by Aleksandravicius with 4:23 remaining, but four straight free throws by Hislop pushed the lead back to double digits and the Wildcats got no closer than 10 the rest of the way.

Despite starting the game just 3-for-16 from the field, Davidson stayed within striking distance thanks to its solid defense. The Wildcats forced nine turnovers early and trailed just 7-6 after a driving layin by Sarah Davis.

It became 12-6 after the Dukes' Hislop hit a short jumper, forcing Davidson to call a timeout. The Wildcats though, came right back with two quick buckets from Laura Murray and Aleksandravicius. The 'Cats leading scorer Murray, who came in averaging just under 15 points, was held to seven points for the game.

Aleksandravicius sparked a mini 8-2 run when she rattled off six straight points and Davidson cut a seven-point Duke lead down to one, 21-20, on a Barbara Sitton fastbreak layup off a Murray steal. Davidson ended up causing 14 first-half turnovers and pocketing three steals.

JMU hit its third three-ball of the half for a 24-20 score at the break.

The Davidson women's basketball team made it back-to-back postseason years with a return trip to the women's NIT after a very strong 2012-13 campaign.

The Wildcats entered the first round of the tournament fresh off reaching the Southern Conference title game and were looking to make history with their first-ever postseason win.

Senior Sophia Aleksandravicius led the charge, dominating in the paint with her 20th double-double to pace four Wildcats in double figures and Davidson won the program's first postseason game with an 82-73 victory on the road at Old Dominion in the first round of the Women's National Invitation Tournament Thursday evening at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The two-time Southern Conference Player of the Year Aleksandravicius had 27 points and pulled in 11 rebounds for her 50th career double-double. She went a career-best 11-for-14 from the charity stripe as Davidson hit 20 shots at the line.

Laura Murray (16), Dakota Dukes (season-best tying 15) and Jasmine Calin (season-high 10) also registered double figures in points as Davidson moved to 22-12 on the season.

Barbara Sitton for the second game in a row hauled in double figures in rebounds, pulling in a career-best 11 on the defensive end. She also dished out seven assists and

dravicius and Calin had 11 and eight points, respectively, in the half.

Dukes helped push the lead out 16 (51-35) with six points in the first four minutes of the second half. An Aleksandravicius' and-one play two minutes later gave the Wildcats its biggest lead of the game at 58-40 when she swished home the free throw.

Old Dominion went on a 15-7 run to cut the deficit to 10 (65-55) with 7:48 on the clock. Kelley scored the final seven points of the spurt.

Davidson came right back, pushing its lead out to 74-59 on a pair of free throws from Katrina Chiemeka with 4:06 left and did not allow the lead to slip below 11 the rest of the way until the final score.

POSTSEASON HISTORY



After their historic first round win, Davidson was looking for win number two in the women's NIT second round. Their

opponent, cross-county rival Charlotte 49ers.

The Wildcats battled all the way to the end against its cross-county rival, but Charlotte pulled away with a 19-8 run in the final six minutes to capture a 72-60 victory in the second round of the Women's National Invitation Tournament Sunday afternoon at Halton Arena.

Davidson completed its outstanding season at 22-13, which included earning the program's first postseason win in the first round of the WNIT. Charlotte moved to 26-5 and advances to the third round of the WNIT to face the winner of the Florida/Winthrop contest.

Up 53-52, Charlotte broke free from Davidson by scoring 10 of the next 13 points during a five-minute stretch to give itself a 10-point lead with 1:10 remaining. Jennifer Hailey scored seven of those points for the 49ers on her way to a game-high 22 points.

A free throw by Sophia Aleksandravicius made it 65-56 with 59 ticks left, but the 49ers sealed up with the win by going 7-for-8 at the charity stripe in the last minute, while the Wildcats were unable to

convert on offense, turning the ball over three times in the last 1:10.

Aleksandravicius capped off her amazing four-year Wildcat career with 18 points and five rebounds. The two-time SoCon Player of the Year finished her career setting seven all-time school records, including points (1,878), rebounds (1,143) and blocks (339).

Fellow senior Jasmine Calin had one of her best games of the season, scoring a sea-

son-high 12 points, nine of them coming in the first half. Hannah Early gave Davidson another spark off the bench scoring 13 points.

Senior Barbara Sitton had four points, five rebounds, four assists and three steals in her last game, while Katrin Chiemeka had two points on a pair of free throws.

Charlotte had three other players join Hailey in double figures. Hillary Sigmon and Jai Forney finished with 13 apiece, while Ny Hammonds scored 12 points and pulled in a game-high tying nine rebounds.

The 49ers shot 47.1 percent from the floor, including 50 percent in the second half, while Davidson was at 37.1 percent. Charlotte held a 43-31 edge on the boards, with both teams each pulling in 15 offensive rebounds.

The Wildcats erased a four-point halftime deficit with an 11-6 run, capped off by an and-one play from Aleksandravicius to start the second half and they had their second lead of the game at 38-37. Charlotte countered though by breaking up a 40-all tie a few minutes later with a quick six for a 46-40 advantage at 11:02 on the clock.

The 'Cats never backed down, getting another three-point play from Calin to make it 50-49 and then when the 49ers had pushed its lead to 53-49, Early struck for a deep trey on the left wing to make it 53-52 with 6:47 left in the game.

Davidson stayed close after the opening tip, getting a driving layup on the baseline by Sitton to make it 8-7. Two triples by Hillary Sigmon doubled the 'Cats up later though at 20-10 with 12:04 left in the first half.

Five straight points, including a three-point play from Calin, cut the deficit in half a few minutes later.

Then down 28-17 after a pair of Hailey free throws, part of her 13 first-half points, the 'Cats switched to a zone-defense and charged back with a 10-0 run. Sparking the run was six straight points from Early to get within one at 28-27 and under a minute to go. Charlotte took away a little of the momentum with the final three points to end the half up 31-27.

ALL-TIME RECORD VS. 2017-18 OPPONENTS


