A-10 Tournament ♦ May 4-7, 2017 ♦ Philadelphia, Pa.

Records: Davidson reached the A-10 Tournament by going 5-4 in league play to earn the fifth seed for the second year in a row. Overall the Wildcats went 7-9 on the year, winning three of their final four regular season games.

Head Coach: Davidson's Kim Wayne is in her 9th season with an overall mark of 73-82 at DC. She has guided the Wildcats' to an 13-13 record in their three years in the Atlantic 10.

The Journey: This is Davidson's third year in the A-10 and is making its second appearance in the league tournament.

Last Tourn. Results: The Wildcats dropped a 10-7 decision to Saint Joseph's in their first tourn. appearance in 2016.

Up Next: If the 'Cats advance, they would play top-seeded UMass Friday at 1 p.m. in the semifinals.

WILDCATS SET FOR SECOND TRIP TO ATLANTIC 10 LAX CHAMPIONSHIP

The Opening Draw Control

Davidson (7-9, 5-4 A-10) reached the A-10 Lacrosse Championship by earning the fifth seed after going 5-4 during the regular season in league play. It will face off against fourth-seeded George Mason Thursday, May 4, at 1 p.m. Should the Wildcats advance, they would take on top-seeded UMass Friday at 1 p.m.

A-10 Tournament

This is Davidson's second trip to the A-10 tournament in its third year in the conference. The championship was expanded to six teams in 2016 for the first time. Last year saw the 'Cats fall to Saint Joseph's in the quarterfinals, 10-7.

The All-Time Series/Last Meeting vs. George Mason

Thursday's contest vs. Mason will be the seventh meeting dating back to 1994, with the Wildcats trailing 5-1 against the Patriots. In this year's meeting, the Wildcats were unable to stop a quick-striking George Mason attack as it raced out to a 7-1 lead after the first 11 minutes of action and never looked back in taking a 19-9 decision. Senior Annie Brockett had a team-high three goals, while Kendall Thielemann had two points on a goal and assist.

Last Game Out...

Davidson dropped its regular season finale Saturday at home as George Mason spoiled the Wildcats' Senior Day with a 19-9 victory in Atlantic 10 women's lacrosse at Richardson Stadium on a humid afternoon.

Brockett closed out her final game at home with a team-high three goals to push her career best total to 43 on the season. Fellow classmate Kendall Thielemann had two points on a goal and an assist, while Christine Molinari recorded three points on two goals and an assist. Shayne Antolini dished out two assists, and Shannon Blee and Genna Portner each scored once.

NEWPORT, NEWS, Va. — Entering its third year in the Atlantic 10, the Davidson women's lacrosse team was picked by the league's coaches to finish sixth in the preseason poll as announced recently by the league office.

The Wildcats received 47 points, getting picked behind Duquesne (51 points) and ahead of La Salle (40).

Eight-time defending champion Massachusetts was picked to repeat as league champions for the ninth straight year with 98 points and nine of the 10 first-place votes. Richmond was picked second with 86 total points and received the other first place vote. Both teams met in the A-10 Championship game for the third year in a row last season, with UMass scoring a 10-7 win. Saint Joseph's was picked to finish third.

Davidson has faced all nine of the A-10 teams at least once during its program history, including the VCU Rams, which started their lacrosse program last year.

The 2017 Atlantic 10 Women's Lacrosse Championship will be held May 4-7 at Sweeney Field on the campus of Saint Joseph's. The championship will again feature six teams after the league extended it from four to six last year for the first time.

Entering their ninth year under head coach Kim Wayne, the Wildcats are coming off an 8-9 campaign a year ago. They went 5-4 in league play and reached the league tournament for the first time, where they fell to Saint Joseph's in the quarterfinals. The Wildcats return 14 letterwinners with the addition of eight freshmen. Leading the way is the senior duo Nicole Pettiglio and Annie Brockett, who were each tabbed captains.

Record at Davidson: 66-74

Davidson College Athletic Director Jim Murphy announced the hiring of Kim Wayne on July 23, 2008 as the new head coach for the Wildcat women's lacrosse program. She will begin her eighth season in 2016 as head coach as she looks to help the Wildcat continue their success as they enter their second year in the Atlantic 10.

The 2015 season marked a new beginning for Wayne and the lacrosse program as it moved to the A-10 for its 22nd season. Davidson went 6-10 overall on the year and 3-5 in conference play during Wayne's seventh season. The Wildcats collected their first league win with a 9-7 win at home over George Mason. Of the 'Cats' five A-10 defeats in A-10, three of them were decided by a single goal.

Wayne saw four players earn all-league honors at the end of the season. Emily Rademacher and Holly Thomas were each named to the A-10 All-Second Team, while the freshmen duo of Paige Farrar and Rachel Hianik were two of the 12 first-year players to be named to the A-10 All-Rookie Team. For the second year in a row, Wayne saw one of the all-time great players in program history graduate under her leadership as Emily Cooke finished her storied career. Cooke left Davidson second all-time in points and set the career assist mark with 123. Cooke along with freshman Christine Molinari each won Davidson's first A-10 weekly awards, earning player and rookie of the week honors, Feb. 16. .

It was another successful year and a memorable one in 2014 as Wayne collected her 50th career win during the season and became the program's all-time winningest coach on her way to coaching the Wildcats to a school-best 12 wins (12-7). She earned her 50th victory in 13-9 road win at Longwood, April 25. Earlier in the month, the 2013 Big South Coach of the Year won her 47th career game to set the program mark for most coaching wins, surpassing Mary Schwartz, who had collected 46 during her eight year tenure (1996-2003).

Wayne again coached one of the top players in the Big South when freshman Katherine Rueger was named the league's freshman of the year. She was also named to the All-Big South Second Team along with Ann Fucigna and Emily Cooke. Earning a spot on the first team under Wayne in 2014 was Paige Logan, Emma Sissman and Emily Rademacher. Logan was named to the Big South All-Academic Team.

The Wildcats went 6-1 in their final season in the Big South and reached the championship game for the second year in a row, before falling to High Point. In addition to the school-record 12 wins, Davidson rattled off a new school-best nine-game win streak, topping the seven set a year ago. It also set a single-season record for draw controls (247) to surpass the previous mark of 235 set in 2011. Individually, Wayne saw Sissman set the all-time record for draw controls in just two years and set a new single season mark with 75.

Wayne saw three players earn Big South Weekly awards with Rueger taking home the rookie of the week twice, Fucigna and Sissman earning the offensive player of the week once each and Logan earning a defender of the week award.

Wayne had the privilege to coach one of the program's all-time best players in Fucigna. The senior graduated from Davidson holding the all-time records for goals (192) and points (261), while ranking third in career assists with 69.

Wayne's fifth season in 2013 was one of the best in program history. She guided the Wildcats to the inaugural Big South Regular Season Title with a perfect 7-0 mark in league play and they finished with an 11-7 overall record, tying for most wins in a year. Davidson also set a program-best with a seven-game win streak during the season. For her great accomplishments, Wayne was named the Big South Coach of the Year, the first coach's honor of her career. She coached the Big South Offensive Player of the Year Emily Cooke, while seeing seven 'Cats earn first or second team honors. Davidson advanced to the Big South Championship game before falling in a closely-battled contest to High Point, 9-7. Three Wildcats were named to the all-tournament team.

In addition, a few other records fell during Wayne's fifth campaign. Davidson tied a school bench mark for home wins with eight and broke the single-season record for goals with 229, which had been set in 2012 with 222. Wayne saw Cooke set the single-game record for assists with 10 and tied the single-game points mark with 11 vs. Kennesaw State, Feb. 25. The sophomore also went on to set the single-season record for assists (55) and points (87). Junior Ann Fucigna became the program's all-time record holder in goals with 153 and points at 197. Senior goalkeeper Jessica Melby set the program's single-game mark for goals against average at a Big South-best 8.36.

During her fourth season, 2012, Davidson went 8-10 with a 4-3 NLC mark. The Wildcats reached the semifinals of the NLC Tournament for the third year in a row, before falling to High Point. They closed the year winning four of their last five games, including a season-best three-game win streak near the end of the regular season. Under the guidance of Wayne, four 'Cats were named All-NLC, including Ann Fucigna who garnered first team honors. The sophomore had a record-setting season as she set the program's single-season mark for goals (51) and points (74). Fucigna's 23 assists were also good for third-most in a Wildcat single-season. In addition to the four all-league players, three other Wildcats were named to the NLC All-Academic Team.

In 2011, Wayne guided the 'Cats to a 6-12 overall record and 4-3 in the NLC. Davidson won its first-round game vs. Liberty in the NLC Tournament, hosted by the Wildcats, but fell to Jacksonville in the semifinals. After starting the season with five straight defeats, Wayne got the Wildcats rolling heading into the tournament, winning four of its last six games to finish out the regular season. Wayne again coached the league's top defensive player as Lily Graham won the honor for the second year in a row. Davidson also placed three players on the NLC First Team and one on the second team, while putting a pair of 'Cats on the all-tournament team. Wayne also coached one of the top freshman in the league in Ann Fucigna, who tied a Wildcat single-season record with 49 goals.

Wayne's second year, 2010, saw Davidson return to a conference as the Wildcats joined the National Lacrosse Conference and had a very successful inaugural season. Wayne guided the 'Cats to a 5-1 NLC record, good for second place, and a 9-9 overall mark. Davidson advanced all the way to the conference championship game where it faced No. 1-seeded Longwood, before seeing its season come to an end. The Wildcats put seven players on All-NLC First and Second Teams combined, and had
