## HATTERS TWEETABLES

- Stetson's win over Brown University in week six snapped a five game losing streak to start the season and nine game losing streak overall.
- The Hatters and today's opponent, Davidson, are the only two remaining Pioneer Football League teams without a win this season. Davidson is 0-2, Stetson is 0-3. Stetson has lost seven straight PFL games, and Davidson has lost 10 in a row against PFL opponents. The Hatters last PFL win was at Campbell on 10/24/16, while Davidson's last PFL win was at Spec Martin Stadium against Stetson on 11/21/15.
- Stetson has not won a home game against a Pioneer Football League opponent since beating Marist College, 22-14 on 11/8/14.
- Stetson's week six win over Brown marked the first time the Hatters failed to rush for 100 yards as a team, but still win the game. Stetson was 0-20 in its modern history when failing to rush for 100 yards in a game as a team.
- In the week five loss at Valpo, Colin McGovern passed for a career-high 383 yards, completed 35 passes on a career-high 52 attempts to set Hatter records for most in a game in all three statistical categories.
- After going the first five games without making an interception, in last Saturday's win over Brown, the Hatters' intercepted two passes, including one by Dre Long and the other by Colby Duncan.
- While Stetson intercepted its first two passes of the season last week, this week's opponent, Davidson, is just one of three remaining FCS teams yet to record an interception this season.
- In the Hatters' week five win against Brown, quarterback Colin McGovern ran for two touchdowns. It was the first time a Stetson quarterback ran for multiple touchdowns in a game.
- In the Hatters week six win over Brown, the Hatters led 3-0 after the first quarter. It was the first time all season that Stetson scored in the first quarter of a game all season.
- In the week five game at Valparaiso, Stetson outgained its opponent for

the first time this season, holding a 450-303 advantage in total yards.

- After allowing an average of over 245 rushing yards per game through the first four games, Stetson held week five opponent Valpo to just 49 yards rushing, which set a Stetson record for fewest rushing yards allowed in a game by the Hatters. The previous low by an opponent was 53 at Valpo on 10/24/15.
- Former Stetson standout Donald Payne made his NFL debut on September 10th for the Jacksonville Jaguars in a win over the Houston Texans. The three-time PFL defensive player of the year is one of five former PFL players currently on NFL active rosters. Payne is the only rookie in that group.
- Overall, Stetson had 24 players make their collegiate debuts in the season opening game at Sacred Heart. That group included 10 true freshmen, 10 redshirt freshmen and four others.
- In the Hatters' win over Brown in week five, three Hatters made their first NCAA start, including wide receivers Bensley Bornelus and Jordan Sabo, along with linebacker Tyler Mirabella.
- In Stetson's week five win over Brown, it was the first time all season the Hatters led after each quarter. The last time Stetson led at the end of each quarter in a game was against Warner on 9/10/16.
- Stetson's home win over Brown in week five was the first home win for Stetson since beating Warner College 30-15 on 9/10/16. It was the Hatters' first home win against an NCAA Division I team since 11/8/14 when they beat Marist College at Spec Martin Stadium.
- After making one catch the entire season, Bensley Bornelus was Stetson's leading receiver with eight catches in the week five win over Brown.
- Sophomore Bryce Blackmon scored his first career touchdown in the week two game at Marist. Blackmon's two-yard TD run capped a seven play, 59-yard, scoring drive and was the first touchdown of the season for Stetson.
- Prior to Blackmon finding the end zone, the Stetson defense did its job in keeping Marist out of the end zone. The Red Foxes were turned away on downs inside the Stetson 10 yard line on each of their first two possessions. Freshman defensive lineman Marco Foreman was credited with a share of both tackles on fourth down, sharing with graduates Jeb Boudreaux on the first and Eddie Curry on the second.
- Both Stetson and Marist benefitted from a big defensive play for a score in the game. The Hatters got their defensive touchdown in the second quarter when Boudreaux sacked Red Foxes QB Mike White for a 19-yard loss, forcing a fumble that Eric Martin scooped up and raced 20 yards for a touchdown with. Marist answered in the third quarter when Colin McGovern was sacked and stripped by senior Ruben Avalos, who picked up the

fumble and scored himself.

- In the game against Dartmouth week three, Colin McGovern found freshman receiver Justin Jordan for a touchdown. It was the first passing touchdown in McGovern's NCAA career and the first receiving touchdown in Jordan's NCAA career.
- In the week four loss to Campbell, Stetson players including junior wide receiver Ja'Vonta Swinton, freshman wide receiver Bensley Bornelus and freshman running back Gordon Stetson all scored their first NCAA touchdowns.
- While Stetson has a group of five players who serve as captains for the 2017 season, the four players who went to midfield for the coin toss at Sacred Heart were the four closest friends of Nick Blakely. That group included redshirt freshmen JJ Henderson and Jeremiah Nails along with sophomores Cam Adams and Reggie Gantt.
- The Hatters were held to just three points in the loss to Sacred Heart, the first time Stetson has been held to just a field goal since Sept. 26, 2016 in a 41-3 loss at Drake.
- The only turnover for the Hatters in the season opening game at Sacred Heart came on a fake punt. Freshman Matias Gasc basically threw the ball as far as he could and the pass was intercepted by the Pioneers' Andrew O'Neil, who was back as the punt returner.
- Backup quarterbacks Cole Martin (1) and Nick Andreas (3) both made starts during the 2016 season, which saw Stetson use five players at QB.
- Two things Stetson has not yet done in four-plus seasons is return a kickoff or a punt that wasn't blocked for a touchdown.
- Stetson has returned three blocked punts for touchdowns and one blocked field goal in four seasons.
- The Hatters are 5-7 in games decided by a touchdown or less (7 points) since restarting the program in 2013.
- The Hatters have won more games away from home (8) than at home (7) since the start of the 2013 season.
- Almost half of the players on the Stetson squad to open the season came from the state of Florida (50). In addition to the Sunshine State the Hatters hail from 17 other states and one US Territory. Behind Florida, Georgia (18) and California (5) are the most represented states on the roster.
- The Hatters have five captains for the 2017 season: LB Jeb Boudreaux, RB Arkee Brown, DE Jeff Fallabel, DB Dre Long and QB Colin McGovern.
- The Sacred Heart game was the first for Stetson in which no players from the original team in 2012 were on the roster.
- For the first time since restarting the program, the entire Stetson schedule consists of NCAA Division I opponents.
- Stetson is looking to finish better than .500 for the first time since 1951 (8-1-2). The Hatters' best record was 5-6 during the 2014 season.
- In week three's loss to Dartmouth, the Hat-

ters were held to -3 yards rushing, the lowest output for Stetson since the restart of the program, and the first time they netted negative yardage for a game.

- Stetson was held to less than 100 yards rushing as a team in four of 11 games last season and all six games this season. The Hatters have failed to rush for at least 100 yards in a game in 21 of 51 games since restarting the program. Not surprisingly, the Hatters were 0-20 in those games and 14-15 in all other games. Stetson's week six win over Brown marked the first time the Hatters did not rush for 100 yards but still won the game.
- Six of the nine lowest rushing outputs in Stetson's history since restarting the program in 2013 have all come this season. The Hatters' season best rushing output this season was 69 yards against Marist in week two. Here is a look at the games when the Hatters were held to less than 100 yards on the ground.

- On the flip side, the Hatters have rushed for more than 200 yards in a game five times over the last four plus seasons. Stetson is just 3-2 in those games.

- Extremes in passing yards in a game does not provide an accurate measure of success for the Hatters. Stetson has failed to throw for at least 100 yards in a game six times, and is 0-6 in those games. The Hatters have passed for more than 200 yards in a game 22 times, but are just 6-16 in those games.
- Over 51 games, the Hatters have scored defensive or special teams touchdowns 14 times. Amongst current players, Eric Martin now has two and Shayne White has one. The Hatters have also posted two safeties, one in 2014 and one in 2016 against Valpo.

## The Coaching Staff

- The 2017 season mark's head coach Roger Hughes' 32nd season of college football. He joins linebackers coach Bob Majeski to have reached three decades of college coaching.
- Roger Hughes is the ninth different head coach in Stetson football history. He has a career record of 62-88 in 13 seasons as a collegiate head coach.
- With Stetson's 2013 win over Warner, the nine Hatter head coaches have combined to go 7-2 in their debut contests.
- Before coming to DeLand, Hughes already had 10 years of head coaching experience, posting a 47-52 mark at Princeton from 2000-09.
- Hughes' Tigers shared the 2006 Ivy League title, going 9-1 overall and 6-1 in "the ancient eight".
- Hughes has previously served as an assistant with the Omaha Nighthawks of the UFL and collegiately at Dartmouth, Cameron, Wisconsin-Whitewater, Nebraska and, his alma mater, Doane College in Crete, Nebraska.
- Hughes graduated from Doane in 1982 after playing both football (tight end) and golf. His daughter, Maddison, is in her senior season as a member of the women's golf team at Doane.
- Jacob Behrns is back for his fourth season with the Hatters. He coached tight ends in 2014, but led the receivers in 2015 and 16. A graduate of Wayne State, Behrns also has a degree from the Arizona Culinary Institute.
- Nolan Behrns returns for his sixth year at Stetson where he serves as the Director of Football Operations and also works with the Hatters kickers. He was the first person hired by Hughes when he agreed to take the job of building the new Stetson program from scratch in 2011.
- Brian Boerboom came to Stetson in 2015 from Southeast Missouri State, where he had served as offensive line coach for eight seasons. Boerboom played collegiately for Tom Osborne at the University of Nebraska where he was an All-Big Eight selection. His son, Jacob, is a linebacker for the Hatters.
- Matt Diniak returns for his fourth year as running backs coach. He played collegiately at Grand Valley State for current Notre Dame head coach Brian Kelly and got his coaching

## Season Dedicated to Memory of Nick Blakely

Nick Blakely had an infectious smile, the spirit of a competitor and was looking forward to playing in his first Hatter football game on Sept. 2.

The 19-year-old accounting major had complained about being light-headed Monday evening and was on the sidelines being monitored by athletic trainers when he collapsed.

The trainers performed CPR on him until paramedics arrived. He was taken to Florida Hospital DeLand, where he passed away.

The Hatter football team and hundreds of others from the Stetson Community gathered on Tuesday, just hours after his passing, to remember Blakely.

Wearing black stickers with Blakely's number 37, the crowd overflowed from the auditorium as they held hands, prayed and embraced.

"I saw what it meant to be a Hatter last night," Head Coach Roger Hughes told the students, faculty and staff. "When a tragedy like this hits part of our family, we come together as a family. We come together to support each other ... to feel the spirit that makes us Stetson Hatters."

Football practice was canceled and flags were lowered to half-staff on the Stetson campus in Blakely's honor. A campus memorial service was

held on Thursday, August 31.

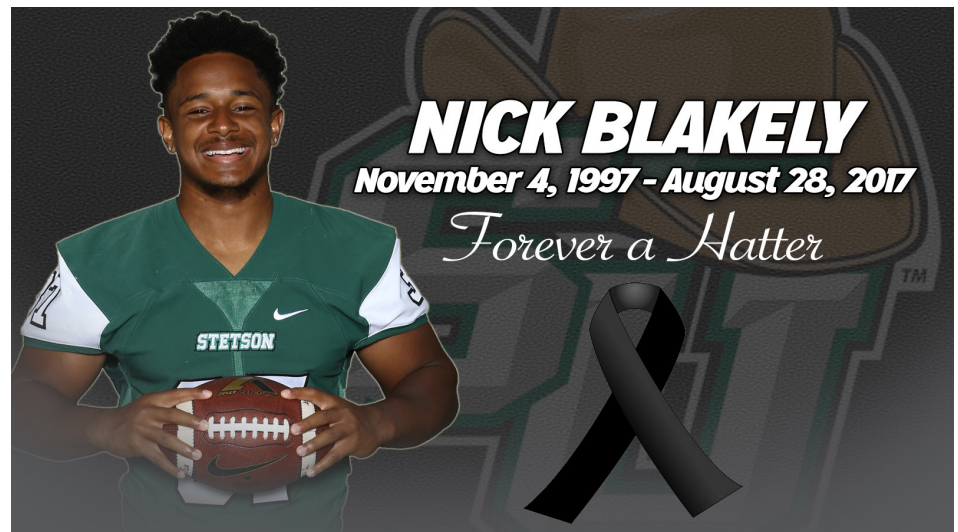

Social media was filled with kind words and condolences for Blakely. In one tweet posted Monday night, fellow teammate Matt Andreas said Blakely spoke with another player just hours before his death and said, "I'm not much of a traveler, but I'd sure like to go to heaven."

"Stories like this only confirm God," Andreas, a freshman receiver on the team, tweeted Monday night. "Literally gives me chills just thinking of it."

The Hatters will play the 2017 season with helmet stickers emboldened with NB. Several other Stetson teams will also wear stickers this year.

start as a member of Kelly's staff in 2001. He spent four seasons working for the Tampa Bay Bucs as an offensive scout.

- Jonathan Johnson is in his second season as defensive line coach for the Hatters. He came to Stetson in 2016 from Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College where he filled a variety of roles, including equipment manager and facility manager in addition to coaching the offensive line, tight ends and full backs.
- Bob Majeski is a member of the three-decade club for the Hatters. He returns to coach linebackers while also working to coordinate the Hatters' special teams. Majecki played collegiately at Kansas State and has worked in virtually every capacity possible as a coach, including multiple stops as a head coach at the junior college level, earning Jayhawk Conference Coach of the Year honors in 2010.
- Clay Mazza is in his second season as a full-time member of the coaching staff as the tight end coach. Prior to being a full-time coach, Mazza worked for two seasons as a volunteer assistant coach with the Hatters. He graduated from Lenoir Rhyne University and was a three year member of the football team. While there, the team won the conference championship each year and went to the national championship game in 2013.
- Cliff Odom is the lone new member of the Hatters coaching staff in 2017, serving as defensive backs coach. A native of Arlington, Texas, Odom worked as a graduate assistant for the University of Missouri in 2016 and Texas Christian University in 2015. As an undergraduate, he played four seasons at Baylor University and was team captain for three. He is the son of Cliff Odom, Sr., who played linebacker in the NFL for 13 seasons with the Cleveland Browns, Baltimore / Indianapolis Colts and Miami Dolphins.
- Defensive coordinator Brian Young was the first on-field coaching hire for Hughes and he has been a steady force on the staff from the very first day. Also a former player at Georgia Southern, Young played in the arena leagues before starting his coaching career and has had stops at Mississippi College and Cornell before joining the Stetson staff.

## Hatters History

- The 2017 season marks the 53rd overall season of play for Stetson football. The Hatters have an all-time record of 174-169-27.
- Stetson began play in 1901, defeating the Florida Agricultural College, 6-0, on Nov. 22 (Thanksgiving Day) at the State fairgrounds in Jacksonville.
- The Hatters compiled a 155-127-27 (.543) mark in their history prior to discontinuing the program following the 1957 season.
- Stetson participated in the 1951 Tangerine Bowl, defeating Arkansas State, 35-20.
- The Hatters claimed the Florida state championship six times (1901, 03, 05, 06, 07 and 09).
- The program had been halted three times before, not competing in 1915, 1917-18 (World

War I) and 1941-45 (World War II) in addition to 1957-2012.

- All four times that Stetson has missed a season of play, the Hatters won their first game upon the program's resumption, downing Rollins College in 1916, the Florida Military Academy in 1919, Troy in 1946 and Warner in 2013.
- Stetson football has produced 22 coaches and players who have been inducted into the Stetson Athletics Hall of Fame, in addition to the 1927, 1938 and 1951 teams.

## Noting the Hatters

- LB Jeb Boudreaux is the lone returning Hatter who was named to the All-Pioneer League team last season. He also led the team and Pioneer Football League in tackles in 2016 with 116.
- After sitting out last season with injury, Colin McGovern is the starting quarterback this season. Last season, the Hatters had three different starting quarterbacks (Nick Andreas, Gaven DeFilippo, Cole Martin)
- RB Arkee Brown was the leading rusher last season amongst the returning running backs this season with 137 yards.
- TE Donald Parham led the Hatters in receiving touchdowns in 2016 with six and was one of only two Hatters to amass more than 100 yards receiving in a game during the 2016 season. He had 109 yards receiving against Marist (11/5/16). He has looked very impressive during the 2017 preseason camp, and is expected to be a big part of the offense this season.
- LB Jacob Boerboom is the son of offensive line coach Brian Boerboom and is one of six children.
- Five members of the 2017 Hatters are enrolled as graduate students (Jeb Boudreaux, Eddie Curry, Dre Long, Austin Tyrell and Shayne White).
- DB Eric Martin is the only returning Hatter to have more than one interception last season. He had two interceptions in 2016 along with six pass pickups.
- WR Luke McDermott, who redshirted last season, was originally a quarterback but made the switch last season.
- Despite being located in DeLand, the Hatters have just two players who attended DeLand High School (Jackie Johnson and Austin Tyrell).
- FB Tony Gilotti is the only Hatter from Volusia County not from DeLand. He is a resident of Orange City and attended University HS.
- PK Jonny Messina redshirted last season, but has already proven his ability to kick from distance. He successfully connected on a 51 yard field goal attempt during a team scrimmage at preseason camp.
- QB Gaven DeFilippo, who is redshirting this season, led the Hatters last season in completions (131), passing yards (1,272) and touchdown passes (9).

## Quoting Hatters Coach Roger Hughes On the win over Brown:

I told the team the night before this game has already been won by the way you prepared. It was

our best preparation for a game all season, and frankly the past couple of seasons. We came out and executed, and we didn't do the things that dug us a hole early. We didn't turn the ball over early and we didn't have stupid penalties that put us behind the chains. That had been our focus the whole week, cleaning up what we are doing wrong and executing what we are supposed to do right. When you do that you have a chance to win, and I think certainly we did that. We won the turnover battle and we got our first two interceptions of the season on defense. All those molded together got us the result we got.

## On the rapidly improving offense:

I think we are starting to understand what we are good at. With eight new starters on offense, we knew there would be a learning curve, and I think we are starting to understand what we can and can't do. We are starting to understand the skill level of our players and what they are good at, so we are putting them into positions within our formations to have success, and frankly we are executing better. I think the offensive line has played much better, and all of that means is a more productive offense. Top that off with much fewer procedural penalties. When you start at first and ten rather than first and fifteen, it's easier to execute on third down when it's third and two or third and three. Our chances of converting are greatly enhanced compared to when it's third and ten or third and nine or third and eight. So by not committing the penalties we are able to stay on track and stay in front of the chains.

## Success on offense despite missing two key receivers:

We have a next man up attitude. Someone goes down, the next one up has to perform. I thought our assistant coaches did a great job of getting those guys in the correct position and only asking them to do things they were already comfortable doing. I think on the other side of that, that (starting quarterback) Colin is getting more comfortable with other receivers in the game. We are using four, five or even six different receivers at times in the game and frankly since Donald Parham has been out of the lineup, Colin has been doing a much better job of distributing the ball to the other receivers. When you have a very good receiver, sometimes you go to him even when you know you shouldn't. When he's double covered, Donald makes great catches, and with his size advantage over people, sometimes we'll just throw the ball up to him because he generally comes down with it. Without him in the line up, we have to go to our progression. We're reading better. Guys are getting more confident in what they are doing, making sure they are running their routes correctly, so that they will get the ball delivered to them. All those things motivate us to work harder and I think it has forced Colin to stay within the system and deliver the ball where it should be. I think also its familiarity. Colin is one of the eight new starters this season and I think the more experienced you get, the game starts to slow down, therefore we are much better able to execute because of the experience on all the subtle little things they are doing, and that stuff takes time.

## **On significantly fewer penalties:**

It's outstanding because that's what we have been preaching all year long and it gives you kind of a glimpse of how fragile winning is. Little things make the big difference. The other thing is the hidden value in the yardage. It's been said that for every 100 yards of penalties your point total cuts in half. So the fact that we are limiting that shows we are maturing offensively as the season goes on, and one of the things you want to do as a coaching staff is you want to make sure the team is continuing to improve and getting better with each practice, and obviously win each game. Luckily the last few games we have seen that improvement.

## **Morale at practice after the win:**

Anytime you win, nothing hurts as bad. There is always a little more spring in your step. One of the things I have been most proud of with this team is no matter what our record has been, there wasn't that much difference in practice in the way we are preparing. That's the sign of a maturing program. We have the culture as such that we are focusing on what we are doing right then and there, and be 'where your feet are,' so to speak. I was not too happy with Tuesday's practice, it was a bit of a letdown, but Monday's was great and Wednesday's was great, and so I think we are on the right track. Understanding how to come back from failure is one thing, but understanding how you approach success is another, and that is one of the things we are working very hard this week do to, because we have not always done a very good job of putting two and three good game together. In fact we are working on how to put two and three good practices together. Each time we are starting to do that, and as we do that we'll continue to improve as a program.

## **One the great defense effort against Brown:**

To hold that Brown team to just thirteen points was remarkable. They came in and had scored almost thirty points against a scholarship school. They are known for their offense. They are known for throwing the ball around and doing trick plays and things like that. I thought our defense did a great job of tackling; there were very few missed tackles. We got them to turn it over three times, and our defensive game plan was well planed, and the execution by our players was big. Our secondary did a great job of covering those guys up. Brown does a great job of getting matchups in their favor, and other than one miscue which allowed them a forty-yard pass, there were much fewer explosive plays than earlier games. That's an attribute to the defense.

## **Scouting report on Davidson:**

Defensively, Davidson has a lot of their guys back. They play a four man front. They are very active, relentless, I really like how Davidson's defense plays. They are relentless to the ball. They fly around, they don't miss many tackles, and they do a good job of pressuring you in situations and in ways that are kind of unique. They tend to come with weak side blitzes and come with the corner fire a bunch which is not easy to pick up.

Offensively, they have some very talented receivers. They have been using a couple of different

quarterbacks in their rotation, but they are much improved on offense, so it's going to be a very hard game, one our kids are looking forward to.

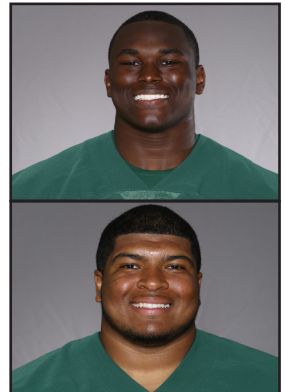
