OFFENSIVE

Tucker Yinger, Dayton Senior | Running Back Columbus, Ohio

Yinger scored three touchdowns as Dayton opened PFL play with a 42-21 come-from-behind win against Davidson, Saturday. He was held to three carries for seven yards in the first half but broke out in decisive third quarter. Yinger scored the touchdown on each of Dayton's first two drives in the third, amassing 12 carries for 69 yards, as Dayton surged into the lead. He then added a 29-yard touchdown reception on his final play of the game midway through the fourth quarter. Yinger finished the day with 124 all-purpose yards – 80 rushing (17 carries) and 44 receiving (2 receptions).

DEFENSIVE

Reggie Gantt, Stetson Junior | Defensive Back Macon, Georgia

Gantt's day was highlighted by an interception to set up a Stetson field goal in a 19-14 PFL victory against Marist, Saturday. He also had four tackles (three solo), including two tackles for loss (both sacks). Gantt's interception, with a 27-yard return, was his first official stat of the day and came late in the second quarter. He opened the third quarter with a sack on 3rd-and-8 to force a punt on Marist's first drive. Gantt then helped secure Stetson's game-winning score with a sack to force 3rd-and-18 then a pass breakup to end the ensuing Marist drive.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Sean Smith, DaytonSenior | Punter Avondale, Pennsylvania

Smith placed all three of his punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line in Dayton's 42-21 PFL victory against Davidson, Saturday. His three punts came from the Davidson 40, then the Dayton 32- and 37-yard lines and all three ended up unreturned from inside the Davidson 20-yard line. Smith averaged 42.0 yards on those three punts, including a 51-yard boot. He also handled kickoff duties with his seven kickoffs averaging 47.1 yards and netting 37.6 yards with one touchback.

- WILLIE BARRETT (RSr., LB, Marist) Posted seven tackles in loss to Stetson, including 1½ tackles for loss (1½ sacks).

WEEK 5 QUICK THOUGHTS | All 10 PFL teams are in action during Week 5, with a full slate of PFL contests on tap... The week's key matchup will see unbeaten Stetson head cross-country to face preseason favorite San Diego... The Hatters have not won a game in the previous five meetings in the series but they are coming off a game that saw them run 93 offensive plays against Marist... The Toreros return to action after its off week having won their last three PFL openers and will put long win streaks in PFL play and at home (see below) on the line... Dayton, which won its PFL opener last week, will seek its first road win when it travels to Marist, which is seeking its first win this season... It's been a long respite from the football fray for Jacksonville, which has had back-to-back off weeks after seeing a Week 3 contest canceled by Hurricane Florence before its scheduled Week 4 off... The Dolphins return to play will see them host Drake in a series dominated by the Bulldogs, including wins in each of the last three meetings... Morehead State travels to Butler in a contest that sees both teams returning from an off week seeking defensive improvement... the Eagles allowed 78 in their last outing at home to Austin Peay while the Bulldogs surrendered 50 points at home to Princeton... Davidson will seek to recover from its PFL-opening loss when it returns north to face Valparaiso... the Wildcats seek an end to their long PFL losing streak while the Crusaders will seek a fourth straight win in the series.

CHAMBERLIN FIRST COACH TO 60 PFL WINS | Dayton head coach Rick Chamberlin became the first coach to win 60 PFL contests when the Flyers defeated Davidson in Week 4. Chamberlin became the PFL's all-time wins leader last season, passing his longtime mentor Mike Kelley who held the record since 2007.

SAN DIEGO SEEKS TO EXTEND PFL RECORD WIN STREAK | San Diego brings a PFL record 21-game win streak in conference-only games into the 2018 season. The Toreros have posted unblemished 8-0 marks in PFL play in both 2016 and 2017. San Diego's last PFL loss was a 13-12 loss to Dayton on Oct. 10, 2015 in Dayton, Ohio. It is the second longest active FCS conference winning streak behind Jacksonville State's 33-game win streak in Ohio Valley Conference play.

TOREROS ALSO OWN NATION'S #2 HOME WIN STREAK | San Diego also owns a 17-game home winning streak that dates back to a season-ending loss in 2014 (Cal Poly). It is the second-longest active home win streak in the FCS behind James Madison's 19-game home win streak.

FOUR PFL ALUMNI DOT NFL ACTIVE ROSTERS ON OPENING DAY | As the National Football League season began, four Pioneer Football League alumni were on active rosters across the league. In addition, two other league alumni were on their team's reserved roster or PUP list. The complete list of PFL alumni in the NFL can be found in the box at the right.

LEISRING LONE FCS REP ON LOTT IMPACT TROPHY WATCH LIST I Davton's David Leisring is the lone FCS representative named to the 2018 Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List. Established by The Pacific Club IMPACT Foundation, the Lott IMPACT Trophy honors college football's best in character and performance. The IMPACT award is awarded annually to individuals who demonstrate excellence in the field of athletics and recognizes college football's Defensive Player of the Year who best exemplifies the IMPACT acronym: Integrity, Maturity, Performance, Academics, Community and Tenacity.

FIVE PFL ATHLETES EARNING SECOND DEGREE WHILE ON FIELD IN 2018 I Five Pioneer Football League student-athletes are among nearly 1,200 football student-athletes who have already earned their undergraduate degrees and are playing football this fall while pursing their second degree, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame has determined. Alex Jeske and Nick Surges of Dayton, Marshal Davis of Jacksonville, Skyler Lane of Morehead State and Gaven DeFilippo of Stetson are the PFL student-athletes playing for their respective teams after previously earning their undergraduate degree.

TEMPLE TAKES NATIONAL OFFENSIVE HONOR IN WEEK 1 | Butler wideout Pace Temple led all FCS receivers with 14 catches and recorded 167 receiving yards and a touchdown to lead the Bulldogs past nationally-ranked Youngstown State in Week 1. In addition to his offensive duties, Temple recovered a pivotal on-side kick late in the fourth quarter to set up Butler's game-winning drive.

BEVELHIMER & DONLEY NAMED TO MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Butler's Drew Bevelhimer and Drake's Danny Donnley were each named to the 2018 Fred Mitchell Award Watch List just prior to the season starting. The kickers were two of 34 placekickers from the FCS, Division II, Division III and NAIA ranks to earn a spot on the award's preseason list which recognizes placekickers for their excellence on the field and their continued community service.

BUTLER WIN ENDS PFL'S LONG DROUGHT AGAINST MVFC | Butler's Week 1 win at Youngstown State was the first win by a PFL member against a member of the Missouri Valley Football Conference since 2007 when Drake defeated Illinois State.

The NCAA Football Championship began in 1978 with a four-team field. It has expanded over the years to its current 24-team format. The Pioneer Football League first received an automatic bid during the 2013 expansion.

GRIDIRON CLASSIC

The Gridiron Classic matched the champions of the Pioneer Football League and Northeast Conference in an exempted postseason football contest. The inaugural Gridiron Classic took place Dec. 2, 2006 with PFL Champion San Diego traveling to NEC Champion Monmouth.

2001: at Dayton 46, Jacksonville 14 2002: Dayton 28, at Morehead State 0 2003: at Valparaiso 54, Morehead State 42 2004: Drake 20, at Morehead State 17 **DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK HITS 469 GAMES** | The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to Dayton, which extended its streak to 469 games against Davidson. That streak includes 274 games as a FCS member that is second among active FCS-only streaks. Montana holds the FCS-only longest streak without being shutout at 384 games which dates back to 1989. On the FBS side, Florida holds that subdivision's longest streak of games without being shutout at 375, dating back to the 1988 season. Meanwhile, the Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

12 FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRESEASON SQUAD | The 31-member Preseason All-PFL squad was loaded with 12 First-Team All-PFL selections from the 2017 season returning. Seven of those first-team returnees are on offense with the San Diego quarterback Anthony Lawrence, the 2017 PFL Offensive Player of the Year, highlighting the group. Marist linebacker Willie Barrett is one of three 2017 First-Team All-PFL picks returning on defense while Dayton punter Sean Smith is one of two returning first-team honorees. Six different teams have a First-Team All-PFL returnee on their roster in 2018.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | For the eighth consecutive year, the San Diego was picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. The Toreros, which have won regular-season title and then advanced to the second round of the FCS Championship in back-to-back seasons, were chosen just ahead of Dayton in polling that was dominated by the two teams. San Diego and Dayton combined to receive all available first-place votes (coaches could not vote for their own team). The Toreros received a maximum nine first-place votes to finish with 81 points of the maximum 100 points possible. The Flyers earned the other first-place vote and finished with 72 points.

COONEY NAMED TO FOUR FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | San Diego senior offensive lineman Daniel Cooney received plenty of national preseason attention, earning recognition on four preseason All-America teams. The STATS FCS, Athlon Sports, Phil Steele FCS Magazine and Hero Sports groups each recognized the 6-8, 315-pound lineman from Western Springs, Illinois on their respective preseason squads.

FOUR NOMINATED FOR ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Four Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 169 nominees from across the country for the 27th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Drew Bevelhimer (Butler), Nathan Clayberg (Drake), Jake Dempsey (Jacksonville) and Kyle Hamrick (Stetson) were nominated for the 2018 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

PFL's 26TH CAMPAIGN | The 2018 season marks the 26th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 10 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2018 NCAA FCS Championship.

PRESBYTERIAN TO JOIN PFL IN 2021 | Pioneer Football League Commissioner presidents' council has agreed to accept Presbyterian College's request for membership, effective for the 2021 season. Presbyterian College's football program will remain a Big South member for the 2018 and 2019 seasons while beginning to phase out scholarships in order to obtain PFL eligibility. The Blue Hose will play one season as a Division I independent in 2020 before joining the PFL in 2021.

PFL ALUMNUS NAMED TO NFL ALL-PRO TEAM | San Diego's Jamal Agnew was named an NFL All-Pro selection by the Associated Press, Pro Football Writers Association and Sports News after an impressive rookie campaign with Detroit. Primarily a return specialist for the Lions, Agnew finished 2017 leading the NFL with 447 punt return yards while scoring two punt return touchdowns.
