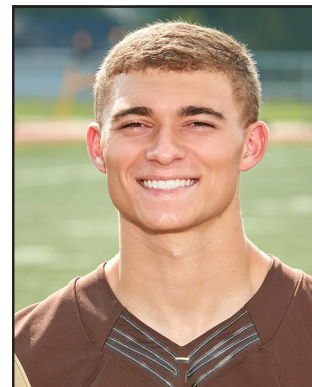

OFFENSIVE

Anthony Lawrence, San Diego

Senior (RS) | Quarterback
La Mesa, California

Lawrence compiled a career-high 469 offensive yards to help San Diego hold on for a 36-34 PFL victory against Dayton, Saturday. Compiling career highs in completions (29) and rushing yards (35), he finished the day with a season-best 434 passing yards and three touchdowns on 29-of-44 passing. Lawrence spread out his passes with eight different receivers catching a pass and three different receivers catching a touchdown score. His 74-yard touchdown strike to Michael Bandy early in the fourth quarter proved to be the game-winner, but he used his feet to secure the win late in the frame. His 19-yard run after San Diego secured an on-side kick provided a key first down as did his 7-yard completion on 4th-and-2, which ended the game.

DEFENSIVE

Colby Duncan, Stetson

Duncan made three crucial fourth-quarter tackles to give Stetson an opportunity to post a 23-21 PFL victory against Drake, Saturday. He finished the game with 10 tackles (eight solo) and a fumble recovered. However, in the fourth quarter, his tackles on consecutive Drake drives ended threats deep in Stetson territory. Opening the quarter, his tackle on 3rd-and-2 at the Stetson 23 helped forced a turnover on downs on the next play. On the next Drake drive, his tackle on 4th-and-2 forced another turnover on downs. On the next Drake drive, he tackled and forced a fumble at the Stetson 15-yard drive to keep Drake out of the end zone. Those three stops proved pivotal as Stetson posted its first win against Drake.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Bailey Gessinger, Valparaiso

Junior | Return Specialist

Gessinger's 97-yard kickoff return for a touchdown to start the second half propelled Valparaiso to a 35-17 PFL victory against Butler, Saturday. In a game that went back-and-forth in the first half, Gessinger pulled the momentum in Valparaiso's favor with the third kickoff return for a touchdown in his career. He finished the day with 131 combined kick return yards, with 109 kickoff return yards and another 22 punt return yards. His first two punt returns came in the first quarter and setup Valparaiso at its own 49 and 46 yard lines, both those drives leading to scores. It was his second outing of 100-plus combined kick return yards this season.

2018 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

WEEK 8 QUICK THOUGHTS | League-leading San Diego returns to the road for a Week 8 tilt at Butler, seeking to extend its 12-game PFL road winning streak... **SAN DIEGO** last lost a road PFL contest on Oct. 3, 2015, at Jacksonville... Meanwhile, **BUTLER** will play only its third home game in the season's opening eight weeks, they are 1-1 at the Sellick Bowl this season... Drake travels to Dayton with both clubs looking to bounce back from close losses in Week 8... **DAYTON** is unbeaten at Welcome Stadium this season, with a 25-point margin of victory in its three home wins... **DRAKE** is on the road for just the third time this season and will look to keep within sight of San Diego which sits one game ahead in the standings... **MARIST** is off to a 2-1 start in PFL play thanks to a come-from-behind win at Jacksonville last week and will also look to keep pace in the title race when Davidson visits Poughkeepsie... **DAVIDSON** suffered its first home loss of 2018 last week but still ran up 264 rushing yards in the loss – its sixth 200-yard rushing performance in seven outings this season... The Sunshine State Showdown is on tap when Jacksonville makes the trip to Stetson, the Dolphins are unbeaten in five previous meetings between the two PFL sides... **JACKSONVILLE** has lost four straight but its last two losses have been by a touchdown or less, including a three-point defeat last week... **STETSON** bounced back from its loss at league-leading San Diego in Week 7 to stun Drake on a late fumble recovery for a touchdown, improving to 2-1 and its 4-1 start is its best start since 1950... Two clubs that secured their first PFL win of 2018 in Week 7 will meet in Week 8 as Morehead State heads north to Valparaiso... **MOREHEAD STATE**'s first PFL win came on the road against Davidson while **VALPARAISO**'s first PFL win was at home against Butler, both teams will seek to repeat those performances this week.

COOK NAMED NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK | Dayton's Jack Cook was named the STATS FCS National Freshman Player of Week 7 after nearly leading Dayton to end ended San Diego's PFL (23 games) and home (18) winning streaks before falling 36-34. He passed for a school-record 432 yards and accounted for all five Flyers' touchdowns. He was 29 of 40 for four touchdown passes and rushed for 29 yards, including a 9-yard score. He led an offense that was turnover-free while totaling 497 yards.

COOK NAMED TO RICE AWARD WATCH LIST | Dayton redshirt freshman quarterback Jack Cook has been named to the Watch List of the STATS FCS Jerry Rice Award. The Rice Award is given annually to the top freshman football player in the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). He was one of 15 FCS freshmen named to the initial Jerry Rice Award Watch List.

TOREROS OWN NATION'S #1 HOME WIN STREAK | With James Madison's home loss, Oct. 6, San Diego has become the FCS team with the longest home win streak. The Toreros own a 19-game home winning streak that dates back to a season-ending loss in 2014 (Cal Poly). San Diego will put that streak on the line this weekend when Dayton visits the west coast.

RED FOXES' CHRISTIAN SEEKS PFL RECEIVERS RECORD | Marist wideout Juston Christian is on his way to setting the PFL record for most career receiving yards, entering Week 8 with 3,545 yards receiving – taking over the FCS lead among active career leaders. He needs 260 yards to break the record set by Valparaiso's Rob Giancola (3,804 yards, 2001-04). He is only the sixth receiver in league history to amass 3,000 career receiving yards.

CAN TEMPLE JOIN RECEIVING RANKS? | While the 3,000 career receiving yard club only has six members currently, Butler's Pace Temple seeks to join the group. With 2,767 career yards entering Week 8, he stands a good chance of becoming lucky number seven.

USD's LAWRENCE SEVENTH TO 10,000 YARDS | San Diego's Anthony Lawrence became the He also was the second San Diego quarterback to reach the milestone, joining Mason Mills (10,204 yards, 2010-13). Entering Week 8, Lawrence has 10,560 career passing yards – second among FCS active career leaders. The PFL record for career passing yards is 11,230 yards held by Jacksonville's Josh McGregor.

DAYTON'S YINGER 12TH MEMBER OF PFL 3,000-YARD CLUB | Dayton running back Tucker Yinger became the 12th PFL runner to record 3,000 career rushing yards, reaching the milestone in Week 7 action at San Diego. With 3,022 career rushing yards, he joins Connor Kacsor (3,528 yards) as the only Dayton runners to breach 3,000 career rushing yards.

SAN DIEGO EXTENDS PFL RECORD WIN STREAK | San Diego extended its PFL record win streak in conference-only games to 24 games with its win against Dayton, Oct. 15. San Diego's last PFL loss was a 13-12 loss to Dayton on Oct. 10, 2015 in Dayton, Ohio, which it followed with back-to-back 8-0 PFL campaigns in 2016 and 2017. It is the second-longest active FCS conference winning streak behind Jacksonville State's 35-game win streak in Ohio Valley Conference play.

FIVE NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST LIST | Five Pioneer Football League student-athletes have been named as semifinalists for the 2018 William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Fidelity Investments and The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. That quintet joins a group that now includes 77 PFL student-athletes who have been named a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy, or its predecessor the Draddy Trophy, since 1998.

CHAMBERLIN FIRST COACH TO 60 PFL WINS | Dayton head coach Rick Chamberlin became the first coach to win 60 PFL contests when the Flyers defeated Davidson in Week 4. Chamberlin became the PFL's all-time wins leader last season, passing his longtime mentor Mike Kelley who held the record since 2007.

The IMPACT award is awarded annually to individuals who demonstrate excellence in the field of athletics and recognizes college football's Defensive Player of the Year who best exemplifies the IMPACT acronym: Integrity, Maturity, Performance, Academics, Community and Tenacity.

FIVE PFL ATHLETES EARNING SECOND DEGREE WHILE ON FIELD IN 2018 | Five Pioneer Football League student-athletes are among nearly 1,200 football student-athletes who have already earned their undergraduate degrees and are playing football this fall while pursuing their second degree, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame has determined. Alex Jeske and Nick Surges of Dayton, Marshal Davis of Jacksonville, Skyler Lane of Morehead State and Gaven DeFilippo of Stetson are the PFL student-athletes playing for their respective teams after previously earning their undergraduate degree.

TEMPLE TAKES NATIONAL OFFENSIVE HONOR IN WEEK 1 | Butler wideout Pace Temple led all FCS receivers with 14 catches and recorded 167 receiving yards and a touchdown to lead the Bulldogs past nationally-ranked Youngstown State in Week 1. In addition to his offensive duties, Temple recovered a pivotal on-side kick late in the fourth quarter to set up Butler's game-winning drive.

BEVELHIMER & DONLEY NAMED TO MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Butler's Drew Bevelhimer and Drake's Danny Donnelly were each named to the 2018 Fred Mitchell Award Watch List just prior to the season starting. The kickers were two of 34 placekickers from the FCS, Division II, Division III and NAIA ranks to earn a spot on the award's preseason list which recognizes placekickers for their excellence on the field and their continued community service.

BUTLER WIN ENDS PFL'S LONG DROUGHT AGAINST MVFC | Butler's Week 1 win at Youngstown State was the first win by a PFL member against a member of the Missouri Valley Football Conference since 2007 when Drake defeated Illinois State.

DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK HITS 472 GAMES | The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to Dayton, which extended its streak to 472 games against Davidson. That streak includes 277 games as an FCS member that is second among active FCS-only streaks. Montana holds the FCS-only longest streak without being shutout at 387 games which dates back to 1989. On the FBS side, Florida holds that subdivision's longest streak of games without being shutout at 377, dating back to the 1988 season. Meanwhile, the Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

12 FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRESEASON SQUAD | The 31-member Preseason All-PFL squad was loaded with 12 First-Team All-PFL selections from the 2017 season returning. Seven of those first-team returnees are on offense with the San Diego quarterback Anthony Lawrence, the 2017 PFL Offensive Player of the Year, highlighting the group. Marist linebacker Willie Barrett is one of three 2017 First-Team All-PFL picks returning on defense while Dayton punter Sean Smith is one of two returning first-team honorees. Six different teams have a First-Team All-PFL returnee on their roster in 2018.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | For the eighth consecutive year, the San Diego was picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. The Toreros, which have won the regular-season title and then advanced to the second round of the FCS Championship in back-to-back seasons, were chosen just ahead of Dayton in polling that was dominated by the two teams. San Diego and Dayton combined to receive all available first-place votes (coaches could not vote for their own team). The Toreros received a maximum nine first-place votes to finish with 81 points of the maximum 100 points possible. The Flyers earned the other first-place vote and finished with 72 points.

COONEY NAMED TO FOUR FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | San Diego senior offensive lineman Daniel Cooney received plenty of national preseason attention, earning recognition on four preseason All-America teams. The STATS FCS, Athlon Sports, Phil Steele FCS Magazine and Hero Sports groups each recognized the 6-8, 315-pound lineman from Western Springs, Illinois on their respective preseason squads.

FOUR NOMINATED FOR ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Four Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 169 nominees from across the country for the 27th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Drew Bevelhimer (Butler), Nathan Clayberg (Drake), Jake Dempsey (Jacksonville) and Kyle Hamrick (Stetson) were nominated for the 2018 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

PFL'S 26TH CAMPAIGN | The 2018 season marks the 26th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 10 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2018 NCAA FCS Championship.
