OFFENSIVE

Anthony Lawrence, San Diego Senior (RS)| Quarterback La Mesa. California

Lawrence tied a PFL record with seven touchdown throws as San Diego clinched the 2018 PFL title with a 56-52 victory against Davidson, Saturday. He secured the PFL-clinching victory with 1:43 left in the game when he found Michael Bandy for a 20-yard touchdown just 55 seconds after Davidson had taken the lead. Lawrence also set a PFL record with 556 passing yards, breaking the record set by Toreros alumnus Mason Mills in 2012. That passing performance also catapulted him to 12,017 career passing yards, breaking the PFL record and making him the 13th FCS quarterback to surpass 12,000 career passing yards. He completed 24-of-36 passes in the high-scoring affair and also led Bandy to set a PFL record with 324 receiving yards.



Will Warner

DEFENSIVE

Will Warner, Drake Junior | Safety Pella, Iowa

Warner tied a PFL record with three interceptions, including two in the final 3:46 to help Drake upend Marist, 13-10, in PFL action, Saturday. His second interception of the day was key in the victory, with his 28-yard return setting up the Bulldogs offense at the Marist 12-yard line and the ensuing drive ended with a go-ahead field goal. On the next Marist drive, he intercepted his third pass of the day and allowed Drake to kneel out the game for a win. Warner's first pick came at the start of the second quarter and his 24-yard return set up the Bulldogs at the Marist 30-yard line. He also posted six tackles (three solo) and had a half-tackle for loss and finished with 62 vards on his three interception returns. Warner is the fourth FCS defender to record three interceptions in a game this season.

Donley's 24-yard field goal with 1:51 remaining lifted Drake to a 13-10 PFL victory against Marist, Saturday. He was responsible for seven points in the win, driving home a pair of field goals and an extra point. Donley's 30-yard field goal with 10:54 remaining in the first quarter were the game's only points until the 6:47 mark of the third quarter. He also handled kickoff duties and Drake netted 40.0 yards on his four kicks. Donley remained perfect on field goals this season, improving to 9-for-9 on the year.

WEEK 12 QUICK THOUGHTS | The 2018 PFL title may be wrapped up but each of the league's top four teams have plenty to play for in the regular season's final week... San Diego will look to wrap up its third -straight unbeaten PFL season and run its PFL win streak to 29 games when it travels cross country to face Marist... However, Marist is seeking to cap a fine campaign with a win that would give it a 6-2 record and its best since winning share of the 2013 title with a 7-1 record... Drake will travel to Morehead State seeking a win for its third straight 6-2 mark in PFL play which would also place it second in the league for a secondstraight year... Morehead State is one of four teams tied at 2-5 entering the week but have won their last four PFL finales... Stetson, which already has its best finish since joining the PFL locked up, will look to complete its move from 10th place last season to second this season with a win when it hosts Valparaiso... That Valparaiso squad has won three of its last four PFL closers and is coming off its best offensive performance of the year in a win against Jacksonville... A pair of 2-5 teams will square off with Davidson hosting Butler,... Davidson has two wins in a PFL campaign for the first time since 2012 and a third win would be the Wildcats best total since 2009... Meanwhile, Butler got a much-needed win against Stetson last week and will look to build on that momentum with its first PFL road win this season... Dayton looks to also finish above .500 in PFL play this season, needing a win at Jacksonville to assure it of that feat... The Dolphins have posted 400-plus rushing yards in each of their last four PFL contests but have only one win in that stretch.

PFL IN NFL UPDATE | Six PFL alumni have seen action in the NFL this season... Jason Myers (New York [AFC] via Marist) hit seven field goals in the Jets Week 6 victory against Indianapolis, and has made 21-of-23 field goals and 19-of-20 PATs this season... Eric Saubert (Atlanta via Drake) has played in all eight games for the Falcons in 2018 and made his first professional reception in a Week 5 loss at Pittsburgh... Jamal Agnew (Detroit via San Diego) is among all NFL kick returner leaders, averaging 27.8 yards per kickoff return this season and recovered a fumble on kickoff coverage against Green Bay in Week 5, a game in which he suffered an injury... Donald Payne (Jacksonville via Stetson) has seen action in seven games for the Jaguars this season, but was placed on the Jaguars reserved/injured list Oct. 25... Ross Dwelley (San Francisco via San Diego) made his first professional reception in Week 9 against Oakland, his fourth game in action for the 49ers... Andy Jones (Detroit via Jacksonville) saw his first action of 2018 in Week 9 at Minnesota on special teams.

TOREROS CLAIM 10TH PFL TITLE, LEAGUE'S AQ SPOT | San Diego clinched its 10th PFL title all-time in Week 11. The Toreros also have won five straight league crowns and all their titles have come since winning the 2005 championship.

TOREROS LEAP INTO NATIONAL RANKINGS | Days after clinching their 10th PFL title, San Diego catapulted from receiving votes into the Top 25 in each of the FCS polls. The AFCA Coaches Poll moved San Diego to No. 22 on its list. Meanwhile, the FCS STATS media poll pushed the Toreros to No. 21. It is the first time USD has been ranked since the end of the 2017 season.

PFL BOASTS TRIO OF 1,000-YARD RUNNERS | Entering the regular season's final week, the PFL features three of the subdivision's 18 1,000-yard runners. Jacksonville's Calvin Turner Jr. leads the group with 1,429 yards – third among FCS runners. Davidson's Wesley Dugger (1,138) and Dayton's Tucker Yinger (1,137) are ranked No. 8 and No. 9, respectively. Meanwhile, Davidson's Wesley Wicks (898 yards) and Butler's Brad Sznajder (850) stand within 150 yards of joining the 1,000-yard club this season.

TRIO OF RECEIVERS ALSO HAVE 1,000-YARD SEASONS | Highlighting the offensive nature of the PFL in 2018, three PFL receivers have compiled 1,000-yard seasons. San Diego's Michael Bandy, who set the PFL record with a 356-yard receiving day against Davidson in Week 10, leads the subdivision with 1,427 receiving yards. Marist's Juston Christian (1,085 yards) and Stetson's Donald Parham (1,062) yards are No. 5 and No. 6 on the FCS list which features just 10 1,000-yard receivers to date. Here again, two PFL receivers are within 100 yards of reaching the milestone: Butler's Pace Temple (928 yards) and Valparaiso's Griffin Norberg (902).

DAVIDSON SMASHES FCS RUSHING RECORD | Davidson nearly pulled off the upset of the year before falling to San Diego in Week 11, all thanks to its FCS record 789 rushing yards. The Wildcats broke the record of 681 yards set by Missouri State in 1988. Four Davidson runners had 100-plus yardage days, including Wesley Dugger's 231-yard outing. Davidson leads all FCS programs in rushing average (435.0) and total rushing yards (4,350).

USD's LAWRENCE SETS SINGLE-GAME, CAREER MARKS | San Diego's Anthony Lawrence tossed a PFL single-game record 556 yards in a Week 11 win against Davidson and also became the first PFL thrower to surpass 12,000 career passing yards, ending the week with 12,017 yards passing. He became only the 13th FCS quarterback to throw for more than 12,000 yards during their career.

RED FOXES' CHRISTIAN ONE YARD SHY OF 4,000 | Entering Week 11 needing 114 yards to reach 4,000, Marist wideout Juston Christian finished the day at Drake with 113 yards and ended the week with has 3,999 career receiving yards. Christian is seeking to join the elite 4,000-yard club, which counts only 17 FCS receivers all-time. He is only the sixth receiver in league history to amass 3,000 career receiving yards.

BUTLER'S TEMPLE BREACHES 3,000-YARD MARK | Butler wide receiver Pace Temple joined the 3,000-receiving yard club with a 196-yard outing at Jacksonville in Week 10. He is the seventh PFL receiver to reach the milestone and is eighth among the FCS' active career leaders. He enters the season's final week with 3,195 career receiving yards, sixth among FCS Active Career Leaders.

TOREROS' LEAGUE WIN STREAK NOW FCS' LONGEST | San Diego extended its PFL record win streak in conference-only games to 28 games with its win against Davidson last week. The Toreros now have the FCS' longest conference win streak after Ohio Valley Conference member Jacksonville State saw its streak stopped at Southeast Missouri in Week 8. San Diego's last PFL loss was a 13-12 loss to Dayton on Oct. 10, 2015 in Dayton, Ohio, which it followed with back-to-back 8-0 PFL campaigns in 2016 and 2017.

USD ALSO OWN NATION'S #1 HOME WIN STREAK | With James Madison's home loss, Oct. 6, San Diego has become the FCS team with the longest home win streak. The Toreros own a 21-game home winning streak that dates back to a 2014-ending loss (Cal Poly).

DAYTON'S YINGER 12TH MEMBER OF PFL 3,000-YARD CLUB | Dayton running back Tucker Yinger became the 12th PFL runner to record 3,000 career rushing yards, reaching the milestone in Week 7 action at San Diego. With 3,554 career rushing yards, he joins Connor Kacsor (3,528 yards) as the only Dayton runners to breach 3,000 career rushing yards.

DAVIDSON'S DUGGER HITS 2,000 YARDS IN 19TH GAME Sophomore... yes, sophomore... Davidson running back Wesley Dugger ran past 2,000 career rushing yards in his 19th career game, ending Week 8 with 2,038 career rushing yards. He is 20th on the FCS' active career leaders list with 2,269 career rushing yards after posting back-to-back 1,000-yard campaigns in his first two seasons at Davidson.

ARMSTEAD NAMED NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK | San Diego junior Michael Armstead was named the STATS FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week for Week 9 becoming the third Pioneer Football League athlete to earn national recognition this season. Armstead had kick returns of 67 and 100 yards, the first leading to a Toreros touchdown and the second a touchdown all its own as San Diego pulled away for a 59-35 victory against Jacksonville.

COOK NAMED NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK | Dayton's Jack Cook was named the STATS FCS National Freshman Player of Week 7 after nearly leading Dayton to end ended San Diego's PFL and home winning streaks before falling 36-34. He passed for a school-record 432 yards and accounted for all five Flyers' touchdowns. He was 29 of 40 for four touchdown passes and rushed for 29 yards, including a 9-yard score. He led an offense that was turnover-free while totaling 497 yards.

COOK NAMED TO RICE AWARD WATCH LIST Dayton redshirt freshman quarterback Jack Cook has been named to the Watch List of the STATS FCS Jerry Rice Award. The Rice Award is given annually to the top freshman football player in the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). He was one of 15 FCS freshmen named to the initial Jerry Rice Award Watch List.

FIVE NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST LIST I Five Pioneer Football League student-athletes have been named as semifinalists for the 2018 William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Fidelity Investments and The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. That quintet joins a group that now includes 77 PFL student-athletes who have been named a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy, or its predecessor the Draddy Trophy, since 1998.

CHAMBERLIN FIRST COACH TO 60 PFL WINS | Dayton head coach Rick Chamberlin became the first coach to win 60 PFL contests when the Flyers defeated Davidson in Week 4. Chamberlin became the PFL's all-time wins leader last season, passing his longtime mentor Mike Kelley who held the record since 2007.

FIELD IN 2018 | Five Pioneer Football League student-athletes are among nearly 1,200 football student-athletes who have already earned their undergraduate degrees and are playing football this fall while pursuing their second degree, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame has determined. Alex Jeske and Nick Surges of Dayton, Marshal Davis of Jacksonville, Skyler Lane of Morehead State and Gaven DeFilippo of Stetson are the PFL student-athletes playing for their respective teams after previously earning their undergraduate degree.

TEMPLE TAKES NATIONAL OFFENSIVE HONOR IN WEEK 1 I

Butler wideout Pace Temple led all FCS receivers with 14 catches and recorded 167 receiving yards and a touchdown to lead the Bulldogs past nationally-ranked Youngstown State in Week 1. In addition to his offensive duties, Temple recovered a pivotal on-side kick late in the fourth quarter to set up Butler's game-winning drive.

BEVELHIMER & DONLEY NAMED TO MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Butler's Drew Bevelhimer and Drake's Danny Donnley were each named to the 2018 Fred Mitchell Award Watch List just prior to the season starting. The kickers were two of 34 placekickers from the FCS, Division II, Division III and NAIA ranks to earn a spot on the award's preseason list which recognizes placekickers for their excellence on the field and their continued community service.

BUTLER WIN ENDS PFL'S LONG DROUGHT AGAINST MVFC I

Butler's Week 1 win at Youngstown State was the first win by a PFL member against a member of the Missouri Valley Football Conference since 2007 when Drake defeated Illinois State.

DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK HITS 475 GAMES | The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to Dayton, which extended its streak to 475 games against Drake. That streak includes 280 games as an FCS member that is second among active FCS-only streaks. Montana holds the FCS-only longest streak without being shutout at 390 games which dates back to 1989. On the FBS side, Florida holds that subdivision's longest streak of games without being shutout at 380, dating back to the 1988 season. Meanwhile, the Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

12 FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRE-SEASON SQUAD | The 31-member Preseason All-PFL squad was loaded with 12 First-Team All-PFL selections from the 2017 season returning. Seven of those first-team returnees are on offense with the San Diego quarterback Anthony Lawrence, the 2017 PFL Offensive Player of the Year, highlighting the group. Marist linebacker Willie Barrett is one of three 2017 First-Team All-PFL picks returning on defense while Dayton punter Sean Smith is one of two returning first-team honorees. Six different teams have a First-Team All-PFL returnee

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | For the eighth consecutive year, the San Diego was picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. The Toreros, which have won the regular-season title and then advanced to the second round of the FCS Championship in back-to-back seasons, were chosen just ahead of Dayton in polling that was dominated by the two teams. San Diego and Dayton combined to receive all available first-place votes (coaches could not vote for their own team). The Toreros received a maximum nine first-place votes to finish with 81 points of the maximum 100 points possible. The Flyers earned the other first-place vote and finished with 72 points.

COONEY NAMED TO FOUR FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA

SQUADS | San Diego senior offensive lineman Daniel Cooney received plenty of national preseason attention, earning recognition on four preseason All-America teams. The STATS FCS, Athlon Sports, Phil Steele FCS Magazine and Hero Sports groups each recognized the 6-8, 315-pound lineman from Western Springs, Illinois on their respective preseason squads.
