PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



Mark Pappas

OFFENSIVE

Mark Pappas, Morehead State Sophomore (RS) | Quarterback Avon Lake. Ohio

Pappas threw for three touchdowns and ran for another in Morehead State's season-opening 44-7 nonconference victory against Union (Ky.). Playing less than three full quarters, the redshirt sophomore completed 15-of-21 passes for 236 yards and three touchdowns (213.0 pass efficiency rating). Pappas only rushed once in the contest but that run was a one-yard burst for a touchdown. He led the Eagles on two scoring drives of 90-plus yards in his shortened outing.



Vaughn Taylor Jr.

DEFENSIVE

Vaughn Taylor Jr., Morehead State Junior | Defensive End Washington, D.C.

Taylor had six tackles, including 3.5 for a loss, in Morehead State's 44-7 nonconference win against Union (Ky.). The Eagles leader in tackles for loss in 2018 picked up where he left off, quickly posting 3.5 in the season-opener. He also had a quarterback sack, broke up a pass and was credited with a quarterback hurry. The sack helped keep Union off the scoreboard late in the third quarter, coming on 3rd-and-Goal to deny a score with Union missing a field goal attempt on the next play.



Michael Armstead

SPECIAL TEAMS

Michael Armstead, San Diego Senior | Wide Receiver Monterey, California

Armstead led all FCS return specialists with 221 combined kick return yards in San Diego's 52-34 defeat at Cal Poly. He had six kick returns totaling 183 yards with four of his returns going for more than 30 yards. Armstead also had a 38-yard punt return on the final punt of the contest. His effort helped San Diego average a starting field position on its own 34-yard line in the contest.

- DREW DINGMAN (RSo., P, BUT) Averaged 37.9 yards on seven punts at North Dakota State, including a 48-yard punt.
- ANDREW FOSTER (Jr., P/K, MOR) Averaged 37.5 yards on two punts, saw three kickoffs go for touchbacks, hit a 23-yard field goal and was 5-for-5 on PATs.
- DAVIDSON HILL (Jr., DE, DAV) Led Davidson with seven tackles (four solo) and had 1.5 tackles for loss in win against Georgetown.
- DREW LAUER (5th, HB, DRA) Carried the ball 21 times for 76 yards at North Dakota and added 65 yards on three kick returns.
- JORELL STORY (Sr., RB, DAV) Posted fourth career multi-TD outing with two touchdowns on 21 carries and 80 yards in win against Georgetown.

SETTING THE WEEK 2 SCENE

HOME SWEET HOME? PFL teams won both Week 1 home games (Davidson, Morehead State), but did not post a victory on the road. Week 2 sees five PFL teams at home, including a San Diego squad that puts its 21-game home win streak on the line against nationally-ranked UC Davis... PFL TAKES ON TOP 25. Three PFL teams will face FCS Top 25 opponents in Week 2, starting with Dayton's season-opening trip to Indiana State. Morehead State's first road game takes it to Illinois State while San Diego's home opener has it facing UC Davis... MARIST AT GEORGETOWN: Marist lifts the lid on its 2019 trek in Week 2 when it faces Georgetwon in what promises to be an early litmus test for the Red Foxes after Davidson downed the Hoyas in Week 1. Marist won the last time these two teams played in Washington, D.C., denying a game-tying twopoint conversion with 4:48 left to secure the victory... DAYTON AT INDIANA STATE: Dayton will make the trek across the state of Indiana to meet nationally-ranked Indiana State in their first meeting since 1976... The game will give the first glimpse of Adam Trautman, Dayton's FCS Preseason All-American tight end, as he begins his march toward the Flyers career reception and receiving touchdown marks... UC DAVIS AT SAN DIEGO: San Diego has not lost at Torero Stadium since the end of the 2014 season, a 21-game streak that will be put to the test when nationally-ranked UC Davis visits... Redshirt senior quarterback Reid Sinnett threw for 416 yards and four touchdowns at Cal Poly last week and will face a UC Davis defense that surrendered only 238 passing yards to California last week... INDIANA WESLEYAN AT BUTLER: Butler returns to Indianapolis for back-to-back home games, beginning with NAIA foe Indiana Weslevan which will be opening its 2019 season... The Bulldogs defense provided their lone points against No. 1 North Dakota State, with redshirt senior Dan DelGrosso with a scoop and score to go along with six tackles... VIRGINIA-LYNCHBURG AT DAVIDSON: Davidson's season-opening three-game homestand continues when it hosts Virginia-Lynchburg... It will be Game of Thrones Night at Richardson Stadium as the Wildcats host the Dragons... The FCS' top-ranked rushing attack in 2018 brought that force to bear in Week 1, amassing 355 rushing yards in its win against Georgetown - the fifth best rushing attack in the FCS last week... LOUISI-ANA COLLEGE AT STETSON: Stetson will look to get 2019 underway when it hosts Louisiana College after seeing its Week 1 contest canceled... It will be the rekindling of another old matchup for the Hatters, who last faced the Division III Wildcats in 1924... MOREHEAD STATE AT ILLINOIS STATE: After winning its home and season opener, Morehead State will face a sterner test in its road opener at nationally-ranked Illinois State... Eagles quarterback Mark Pappas was responsible for four touchdowns while play three quarters in his debut, but he will face a Redbirds defense that allowing just 299 passing yards to FBS foe Northern Illinois in Week 1... TRUMAN STATE AT DRAKE: Drake returns to lowa for a visit from Division II foe Truman State... Bulldogs running back Drew Lauer saw 21 carries at North Dakota in Week 1, gaining 73 yards en route to 142 all-purpose yards.

VALPARAISO'S 100TH SEASON

Valparaiso is set to celebrate its 100-year history over the course of the campaign by recognizing and celebrating individuals and teams from select eras at four games this season. The Crusaders have won 11 conference championships, including six in the Indiana Collegiate Conference and two in the Pioneer Football League. Valparaiso will retire the numbers of two University legends at the Homecoming game on Sept. 28 at Brown Field. Garry Puetz '73 and Fuzzy Thurston '56 (posthumous) will become the first players in program history to have their numbers retired.

DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK ENTERS 2019 AT 476 GAMES

The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to Dayton, which extended its streak to 476 games this season. That streak includes 281 games as an FCS member that is second among active FCS-only streaks. Montana holds the FCS-only longest streak without being shutout at 391 games which dates back to 1989. On the FBS side, Florida holds that subdivision's longest streak of games without being shutout at 381, dating back to the 1988 season. Meanwhile, the Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

NINE FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRESEASON SQUAD

The 29-member Preseason All-PFL squad saw nine First-Team All-PFL selections return from the 2018 season. Three 2018 first-teamers return on offense with San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy leading the unit. Drake defensive back Will Warner leads a group of five 2018 first-team selections on the league's preseason defensive unit. San Diego return specialist Michael Armstead is the lone returning first-team selection on the league's special teams unit. Six PFL teams have a First-Team All-PFL returnee on their roster in 2018: San Diego (3), Drake (2), Davidson, Dayton, Jacksonville and Stetson

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL

For the ninth consecutive year, San Diego was picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. San Diego, which has won regular-season title each of the past three seasons, again received the coaches' nod to win the 2019 PFL title. With seven first-place votes, the Toreros were chosen ahead of Dayton and Drake, who picked up the remaining three first-place votes.

THREE PFL PUNTERS NAMED TO FCS PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

A trio of Pioneer Football League Punters were named to the inaugural FCS Punter of the Year Award Watch List presented by The Augusta Sports Council. Drake's Ross Kennedy, Morehead State's Andrew Foster and San Diego's Tanner Kuljian were each named to the 28-player list released in July. Each of the three finished 2018 ranked among the NCAA's Top 100 punters in punting average. Kuljian was ranked No. 14 nationally, averaging 42.8 yards per punt on 59 kicks. Foster was No. 26 among FCS kickers with 41.9 yards per punt. Kennedy finished the season No. 93 among FCS punters (37.1 yards per punt).

BANDY, TRAUTMAN, WANRER EARN FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA NODS

San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy, Dayton tight end Adam Trautman and Drake defensive back Will Waner made the rounds as the Preseason All-America squads were announced. Bandy was named to all four Preseason All-America teams (STATS, Athlon, Phill Steele and HERO), Warner was named to three (STATS, Phill Steele and HERO) and Trautman earned recognition on two (STATS and Phill Steele).

THIRTY-FIVE PFL ATHLETES NAMED TO 2019 NFF HAMPSHIRE SOCIETY

Thirty-five Pioneer Football League student-athletes, representing seven member institutions, were named members of the 2019 NFF Hampshire Honor Society, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame announced in April. The NFF's Hampshire Honor Society recognizes those college football players from all divisions of play that maintained a cumulative 3.2 GPA or better throughout their college careers.

FOUR NOMINATED FOR ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Three Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 137 nominees from across the country for the 28th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. George Hatalowich (Davidson), Luke Butera (Marist) and Ryan Culhane (Dayton) were nominated for the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

PARADY DEAN OF PFL, FCS COACHES

As 2019 gets underway, the longest-tenured coaches in Division I FCS are Marist's Jim Parady and Monmouth's Kevin Callahan, who have been head coaches at their respective schools since 1992. On the other end of the spectrum, the PFL welcomes two new head coaches in 2019: Valparaiso's Landon Fox and Drake's Jeff Stepsis, who were part of 24 new head coaches in the FCS this season.

LANDON FOX TAKES OVER AT VALPARAISO

In March Valparaiso Director of Athletics Mark LaBarbera introduced Landon Fox as the 18th head coach of the Crusaders football program. Fox is no stranger to success in the Pioneer Football League, as he spent the 11 previous season as Dayton's defensive coordinator and secondary coach. During that time, the Flyers compiled an 86-38 record, won three PFL championships and participated in the 2015 FCS playoffs while making defense a hallmark of the program.

STETSON'S HUGHES EARNS CONTRACT EXTENSION

Coming off the best season in more than 65 years, Stetson football coach Roger Hughes was rewarded with a contract extension that will keep him on the Hatters sideline through at least the 2021 season. Hughes, who has guided the Stetson football program since 2011 when he was charged with leading the program onto the field after more than 50 years without a team, was named Pioneer Football League Coach of the Year in 2018.

DRAKE NAMES STEPSIS HEAD COACH

Todd Stepsis, the architect of the Drake football team's nationally-ranked defense, was named the head coach of the Drake football team in December. He takes the reins of the Bulldogs' program after serving as the program's defensive coordinator for the past five seasons under previous head coach Rick Fox, who resigned his position. As the defensive coordinator, Stepsis built the Drake defense into one of the nation's top units and coached a total of 42 all-conference selections including the program's all-time leading tackler and the 2018 PFL Defensive Player of the Year, Nathan Clayberg.

PFL'S 27TH CAMPAIGN

The 2019 season marks the 27th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 10 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2018 NCAA FCS Championship.

PRESBYTERIAN TO JOIN PFL IN 2021

In 2019, the Pioneer Football League Commissioner presidents' council agreed to accept Presbyterian College's request for membership, effective for the 2021 season. Presbyterian College's football program will remain a Big South member for the 2019 season while continuing to phase out scholarships in order to obtain PFL eligibility. The Blue Hose will play one season as a Division I independent in 2020 before joining the PFL in 2021.
