Adam Trautman

OFFENSIVE

Adam Trautman, Dayton Senior (RS) | Tight End Williamsburg, Michigan

Trautman caught just six passes, but four of those went for touchdowns as Dayton downed Jacksonville, 56-28, Saturday. He set Dayton's single-game touchdown reception mark and the Flyers career receptions mark (139) in the win. Each of his four touchdown receptions came in the first half as Dayton raced out to a 21-point lead. The Flyers then turned to their run game the rest of the way and Trautman was part of an offensive line that aided the Flyers run game in posting 7.6 yards per carry. He finished the game with six receptions for 107 yards.



Cassius Johnson

DEFENSIVE

Cassius Johnson, San Diego Junior | Cornerback Greenwich, Connecticut

Johnson led the PFL in Week 6 with four passes defended, including two interceptions, as San Diego defeated Marist, 31-7, Saturday. His two interceptions came in the second half, the first coming at the San Diego 35-yard line near the end of the third quarter. Johnson then picked off his second pass on Marist's next drive of the game, setting up San Diego on the Marist 39-yard line which led to a Toreros field goal. He also had three tackles (all solo).

SPECIAL TEAMS

Jonny Messina, Stetson Junior | Kicker Orlando, Florida

Messina's 27-yard field goal as time expired lifted Stetson to a 30-27 PFL victory against Butler, Saturday. He was responsible for 12 points in the win, connecting on each of his three field goals and three PATs. Messina connected on field goals of 20, 18 and 27 yards on the day as he became Stetson's career scoring leader. It was Messina's second career game-winning field goal as time expired, each has provided the Hatters their first program victory against their opponent: Jacksonville in 2018 and Butler in 2019.

- DREW LAUER (RSr., HB, DRA) Ran for two TDs and 77 yards in three quarters of action in win against Valparaiso.
- CADEN MEIS (Fr., RB, DRA) Had two TDs, on as a runner and another as a receiver, and team-best 101 all-purpose yards as Drake downed Valparaiso.
- LUKE SENNETT (Sr., SAF, BUT) Led Butler with 14 tackles (six solo) and had an interception in loss at Stetson.
- REID SINNETT (RSr., QB, SAN) Threw for 341 yards (third 300-yard passing effort of 2019) and three TDs, completing 19-of-29 passes in win against Marist.
- CALVIN TURNER JR. (Jr. QB, JAC) Ran for all four Jacksonville TDs in loss to Dayton, his 169 rushing yards the most by a PFL runner in 2019.
- NICK TURNER (RSr., LB, VAL) Led all PFL defenders in Week 6 with 3½ tackles for loss, including a sack, as part of 10-tackle outing in loss at Drake.

WEEK 7 QUICKLY

Only eight of the league's 10 teams will be in action but each of the PFL's four unbeaten teams will be in action. An early meeting of unbeatens takes place in North Carolina when San Diego leaves California for the first time this season and heads cross country to meet Davidson in a meeting of the league's top passing team (San Diego) and its top rushing squad (Davidson). Drake takes its 2-0 mark to Indianapolis for a meeting with Butler in the PFL's annual Battle of the Bulldogs. Dayton also heads into Indiana after winning its PFL opener, making the trek to Valparaiso. Meanwhile, Jacksonville returns to Florida to host Morehead State with each team seeking its first PFL victory.

WEEK 7 BREAKDOWNS

DRAKE AT BUTLER, 1 P.M.

The annual Battle of the Bulldogs will feature a Drake squad unbeaten in PFL play on the road at Butler. Drake is out to a 2-0 start in league play thanks to a defense that has allowed just 23 points in its first two PFL games, ranking second in scoring defense (11.5 ppg) and second in total defense (289.0 yards allowed per game). Meanwhile, Butler's defense picked off four passes against a quarterback that had not thrown a interception in 2019 in a Week 6 loss at Stetson and is ranked third in pass defense efficiency (108.6) in PFL action. DRAKE BULLDOG TO WATCH: With the ball-hawking Butler defense coming off its highlight-reel outing at Stetson, the attention turns to freshman quarterback lan Corwin who has marshalled Drake to its 2-0 start. He has thrown just one interception in 49 passes in league play and five in 137 passes overall. BUTLER BULLDOG TO WATCH: On the other side, sophomore quarterback Sam Brown opened PFL action with a 202-yard passing performance with a pair of touchdown throws last week. He has three interceptions in 119 pass attempts in 2019.

SAN DIEGO AT DAVIDSON, 1 P.M.

San Diego makes its first foray outside the state of California in Week 6 and ventures to a Davidson squad that was less than two minutes away from an upset victory in San Diego last season. San Diego needed a touchdown with 1:43 left to eke out a 56-52 victory last season. The Toreros got 556 yards and seven touchdowns from the arm of quarterback Anthony Lawrence. Meanwhile, Davidson had its way on the ground, amassing 789 yards and seven touchdowns through its rushing game in last season's meeting. TORERO TO WATCH: Quarterback Reid Sinnett opened PFL play with a 341-yard outing against Marist and has averaged 345 passing yards per game in four games this season. He's also one of three PFL quarterbacks with double-digit touchdown totals with 12 TD tosses in 90 completions this season. WILDCAT TO WATCH: Running back Wesley Dugger led Davidson's run-game attack in 2018 with a career-best 231 rushing yards. He enters this season's meeting against the Toreros with 100-yard rushing performances in each of his last two outings in a sign he's starting to find his rhythm.

MOREHEAD STATE AT JACKSONVILLE, 1 P.M.

The league's leading rusher squares off the league's leading all-purpose runner when Jacksonville hosts Morehead State. Jacksonville quarterback Calvin Turner Jr. is no longer a surprise when he uses his legs, hitting Dayton for 169 yards and four touchdowns in Week 6 to take the mantle as the top rusher in league play. Meanwhile, Morehead State return specialist lan Holder posted 186 kick return yards alone against Davidson and finished with 196 all-purpose yards to end the week as the PFL's top all-purpose runner. EAGLE TO WATCH: Jovan Smith was Morehead State's featured back against Davidson with 20 touches (12 rushes, 8 receptions) totaling 107 yards and a touchdown. It was his team-leading fifth touchdown of 2019. DOLPHIN TO WATCH: Turner Jr. attracts a lot of the attention on offense, which will happen when you account for 46.7 percent of your team's total yardage and nine of its 12 rushing touchdowns in 2019.

DAYTON AT VALPARAISO, 2 P.M.

A meeting between former coaching teammates unfolds in Valparaiso when former Dayton assistant – and current Crusader head coach – Landon Fox meets his former boss in Dayton's Rick Chamberlin-After displaying an impressive passing attack to open PFL play with a win, Dayton heads north to face Valparaiso. The Flyers used their passing game to devastating effect against Jacksonville in Week 6, as Jack Cook completed 10-of-12 passes for 175 yards and five touchdowns – four to tight end Adam Trautman – in the first half alone. Valparaiso will look to shake off a slow start to PFL play that saw it held to 131 total yards by a surging Drake defensive unit. FLYER TO WATCH: Running back Jake Chisholm was the Flyers go-to man when it came time to control the ball, rushing 10 times for 101 yards with six carries coming in the second half. It was the second 100-yard rushing performance by a Flyer this season. CRUSADER TO WATCH: Linebacker Nick Turner has made the most of his return to action after missing the final seven games of 2018. He leads Valparaiso with 30 tackles and seven tackles for loss, including 3.5 tackles for loss in last week's outing at Drake.

PFL WELL REPRESENTED ON CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST LIST

Five Pioneer Football League student-athletes were named as semifinalists for the 2019 William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Mazada and The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. The five PFL student-athletes recognized as semifinalists were: Brad Sznajder, Butler; Ethan Steinbacher, Davidson; Tim Simon, Dayton; Andrew McElroy, Marist; and Gaven DeFilippo, Stetson. That quintet joins a group that now includes 82 PFL student-athletes who have been named a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy, or its predecessor the Draddy Trophy, since 1998.

CORWIN NAMED STATS FCS FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Drake freshman Ian Corwin put it all together in his best performance and Drake's first win of the season, 41-17 at Marist, Sept. 28. Corwin completed 20 of 29 passes (69 percent) for 255 yards and four touchdowns with one interception. The four touchdown passes went to four different receivers and were one more than he threw in the first three games combined.

DUGGER VAULTS PAST 2.500 YARDS

Davidson running back Wesley Dugger pushed past the 2,500 career yard mark against Campbell, Sept. 21. One of two juniors among the FCS Top 10 Active Career Leaders, he is ranked fourth in total rushing yardage (2,705) after Week 5, averaging 108.2 yards per game. He is just ahead of Monmouth junior Pete Guerriero (2,513 yards) on the list. Dugger needs 779 yards to move into the PFL's career Top 10 in rushing yards (3,292 yards, Drake's Jonathan Taylor).

THE EFFICIENT COOK

Seeing a PFL quarterback listed on the FCS Active Career Leaders list in passing efficiency is a normal occurrence. However, that quarterback not having San Diego next to their name is a new twist. Dayton signal caller Jack Cook is the FCS' active career leader with a 163.06 career pass efficiency rating. That would rank second all-time on the PFL's career pass efficiency list, behind San Diego's Josh Johnson's 176.68 mark (2004-07)

BANDY REACHES 2.500

Meanwhile, San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy moved past the 2,500 receiving yard plateau in Week 6. He now is ranked fifth among FCS active career leaders with 2,533 career receiving yards. Bandy needs just 374 yards to move into the PFL's Top 10 in receiving yardage (2,907 yards, Morehead State's Jake Raymond).

WARNER'S DOZEN

Drake's defensive back Will Warner nabbed his first interception of 2019 against Valparaiso in Week 6. It was his 12th career interception, keeping him atop the list of the FCS' active career leaders. With his next pick he moves into the PFL's career Top 10 in interceptions.

DAVIDSON'S HATALOWICH NAMED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Davidson linebacker George Hatalowich was named to the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team Sept. 12. As the founder and current president of Davidson Football Uplifting Athletes, George has been responsible for raising more than \$25,000 to benefit the rare disease community. George has also taken the Davidson Chapter a step further to engage with local patients, families and caregivers through the Uplifting Athletes Bowling event, which allows the families the opportunity to bowl alongside the football team. The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team will be invited to the 2020 Allstate® Sugar Bowl® and will join Tebow and Allstate volunteers to give back to New Orleans through a special community service project. Allstate will recognize the team during the halftime show. Fans are invited to visit ESPN.com/Allstate to vote for the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team captain once per day, now through Nov. 22. The team captain will be honored at The Home Depot College Football Awards on ESPN later this season.

DAYTON FLIES TO HISTORIC WIN

Facing the No. 14 team in the FCS, Dayton faced daunting odds to win its season opener at Indiana State. But when Sean Prophit scored with 1:57 left the Flyers had an opportunity. Then Zach Rumpke turned that opportunity into reality with a interception to seal the win. It was the highest-ranked FCS opponent a Dayton team had defeated in program history and was the PFL's third win all-time against the Missouri Valley Football Conference.

VALPARAISO'S 100TH SEASON

Valparaiso is set to celebrate its 100-year history over the course of the campaign by recognizing and celebrating individuals and teams from select eras at four games this season. The Crusaders have won 11 conference championships, including six in the Indiana Collegiate Conference and two in the Pioneer Football League. Valparaiso will retire the numbers of two University legends at the Homecoming game on Sept. 28 at Brown Field. Garry Puetz '73 and Fuzzy Thurston '56 (posthumous) will become the first players in program history to have their numbers retired.

DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK NOW 480 GAMES

The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to Dayton, which extended its streak to 480 games with its win at Robert Morris. That streak includes 284 games as an FCS member that is second among active FCS-only streaks. Montana holds the FCS-only longest streak without being shutout at 397 games which dates back to 1989. On the FBS side, Florida holds that subdivision's longest streak of games without being shutout at 390, dating back to the 1988 season. Meanwhile, the Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

NINE FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRE-SEASON SQUAD

The 29-member Preseason All-PFL squad saw nine First-Team All-PFL selections return from the 2018 season. Three 2018 first-teamers return on offense with San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy leading the unit. Drake defensive back Will Warner leads a group of five 2018 first-team selections on the league's preseason defensive unit. San Diego return specialist Michael Armstead is the lone returning first-team selection on the league's special teams unit. Six PFL teams have a First-Team All-PFL returnee on their roster in 2018: San Diego (3), Drake (2), Davidson, Dayton, Jacksonville and Stetson

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL

For the ninth consecutive year, San Diego was picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. San Diego, which has won regular-season title each of the past three seasons, again received the coaches' nod to win the 2019 PFL title. With seven first-place votes, the Toreros were chosen ahead of Dayton and Drake, who picked up the remaining three first-place votes.

THREE PFL PUNTERS NAMED TO FCS PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

A trio of Pioneer Football League Punters were named to the inaugural FCS Punter of the Year Award Watch List presented by The Augusta Sports Council. Drake's Ross Kennedy, Morehead State's Andrew Foster and San Diego's Tanner Kuljian were each named to the 28-player list released in July. Each of the three finished 2018 ranked among the NCAA's Top 100 punters in punting average. Kuljian was ranked No. 14 nationally, averaging 42.8 yards per punt on 59 kicks. Foster was No. 26 among FCS kickers with 41.9 yards per punt. Kennedy finished the season No. 93 among FCS punters (37.1 yards per punt).

BANDY, TRAUTMAN, WANRER EARN FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA NODS

San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy, Dayton tight end Adam Trautman and Drake defensive back Will Waner made the rounds as the Preseason All-America squads were announced. Bandy was named to all four Preseason All-America teams (STATS, Athlon, Phill Steele and HERO), Warner was named to three (STATS, Phill Steele and HERO) and Trautman earned recognition on two (STATS and Phill Steele).

THIRTY-FIVE PFL ATHLETES NAMED TO 2019 NFF HAMP-SHIRE SOCIETY

Thirty-five Pioneer Football League student-athletes, representing seven member institutions, were named members of the 2019 NFF Hampshire Honor Society, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame announced in April. The NFF's Hampshire Honor Society recognizes those college football players from all divisions of play that maintained a cumulative 3.2 GPA or better throughout their college careers.

FOUR NOMINATED FOR ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Three Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 137 nominees from across the country for the 28th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. George Hatalowich (Davidson), Luke Butera (Marist) and Ryan Culhane (Dayton) were nominated for the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

PARADY DEAN OF PFL, FCS COACHES

As 2019 gets underway, the longest-tenured coaches in Division I FCS are Marist's Jim Parady and Monmouth's Kevin Callahan, who have been head coaches at their respective schools since 1992. On the other end of the spectrum, the PFL welcomes two new head coaches in 2019: Valparaiso's Landon Fox and Drake's Jeff Stepsis, who were part of 24 new head coaches in the FCS this season.

LANDON FOX TAKES OVER AT VALPARAISO

In March Valparaiso Director of Athletics Mark LaBarbera introduced Landon Fox as the 18th head coach of the Crusaders foottball program. Fox is no stranger to success in the Pioneer Football League, as he spent the 11 previous season as Dayton's defensive coordinator and secondary coach. During that time, the Flyers compiled an 86-38 record, won three PFL championships and participated in the 2015 FCS playoffs while making defense a hallmark of the program.

STETSON'S HUGHES EARNS CONTRACT EXTENSION

Coming off the best season in more than 65 years, Stetson football coach Roger Hughes was rewarded with a contract extension that will keep him on the Hatters sideline through at least the 2021 season. Hughes, who has guided the Stetson football program since 2011 when he was charged with leading the program onto the field after more than 50 years without a team, was named Pioneer Football League Coach of the Year in 2018.

DRAKE NAMES STEPSIS HEAD COACH

Todd Stepsis, the architect of the Drake football team's nationally-ranked defense, was named the head coach of the Drake football team in December. He takes the reins of the Bulldogs' program after serving as the program's defensive coordinator for the past five seasons under previous head coach Rick Fox, who resigned his position. As the defensive coordinator, Stepsis built the Drake defense into one of the nation's top units and coached a total of 42 all-conference selections including the program's all-time leading tackler and the 2018 PFL Defensive Player of the Year, Nathan Clayberg.

PFL'S 27TH CAMPAIGN

The 2019 season marks the 27th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 10 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2018 NCAA FCS Championship.

PRESBYTERIAN TO JOIN PFL IN 2021

In 2019, the Pioneer Football League Commissioner presidents' council agreed to accept Presbyterian College's request for membership, effective for the 2021 season. Presbyterian College's football program will remain a Big South member for the 2019 season while continuing to phase out scholarships in order to obtain PFL eligibility. The Blue Hose will play one season as a Division I independent in 2020 before joining the PFL in 2021.
