OFFENSIVE

Reid Sinnett, San Diego Senior (RS) | Quarterback Johnston, Iowa

Sinnett set career bests in touchdowns, completions and passing yardage to help San Diego post its first road win of 2019 in a 37-17 PFL victory at Davidson, Saturday. Sinnett completed 27-of-32 passes for 358 yards and five touchdowns against the Wildcats. He found nine different receivers on the day, four of those catching a touchdown. Sinnett tied the game 17-17 going into halftime with a touchdown throw with 1:02 left in the first half. He then was responsible for all three second-half touchdowns as San Diego pulled away for the victory. The Toreros had two 100yard receivers on the day in Michael Bandy (118 yards, 2 TD) and Dalton Kincaid (112 yards, TD).

DEFENSIVE

Vaughn Taylor Jr., Morehead State Junior | Defensive End Washington, D.C.

Taylor Jr. was credited with 2.5 sacks, including 1.5 in a crucial fourth quarter as Morehead State rallied from a late deficit for a 30-22 PFL victory at Jacksonville, Saturday. With the Eagles trailing 22-16, Taylor recorded a solo sack that forced a Dolphins punt from its own 10-yard line and helped set up the offense at midfield for the eventual go-ahead score. On the next Jacksonville possession, Taylor picked up a share of a sack to put the Dolphins behind the chains and ultimately a turnover on downs deep in its own territory to set up an Eagles insurance touchdown. Taylor was credited with five tackles (four solo) and a first-quarter fumble recovery.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Andrew Foster, Morehead State Junior | Kicker/Punter Knoxville, Tennessee

Foster made three field goals and scored 12 points as Morehead State downed Jacksonville, 30-22, for the first time since 2005. He became the second PFL kicker to convert twice from 40 yards in the same game this season, hitting from 45 and 43 yards before adding a 37-yarder to help the Eagles build a 16-7 lead with 3:23 left in the third quarter. Foster also converted all three PAT attempts in the win. He also handled punting duties for the Eagles, averaging 41.0 yards on his three punts with two downed inside the 20-yard line.

WEEK 8 QUICKLY

Drake takes the week off after moving to 3-0 in Week 7 and will watch Dayton and San Diego attempt to improve to 3-0... Dayton stays on the road after a win at Valparaiso and heads to the other end of the conference with a game at Stetson, which is unbeaten at home and looking to keep pace in the PFL race... San Diego, now owners of the third longest conference win streak in FCS history (31 games), returns home to host Valparaiso... Morehead State hosts Butler while Davidson travels to Jacksonville with both the Eagles and Wildcats looking to keep pace in the early league race.

WEEK 8 BREAKDOWNS

DARTMOUTH AT MARIST, NOON

Following its off week, Marist faces its second Ivy League opponent when No. 21 Dartmouth visits Tenney Stadium, Saturday. The Red Foxes return to action seeking to end a three-game losing streak that began with a loss to Ivy League foe Cornell in Week 4. Dartmouth has won six straight dating back to last season and moved into the Top 25 in both polls this week. Marist's offense has been up-and-down through the first five games this season, with 200-yard performances alternating with 400-yard outings, most recently the Red Foxes were held to 245 offensive yards at San Diego in Week 6. RED FOX TO WATCH: Marist has not seen a runner or receiver go for more than 100 yards in each of its last three games. The Red Foxes will look to wide receiver Anthony Olivencia to break that streak and extend his team lead in receiving yards (379) and touchdowns (three).

DAVIDSON AT JACKSONVILLE, 1 P.M.

Both Davidson and Jacksonville suffered home losses in Week 7, and they meet Saturday looking to rebound quickly. The Wildcats saw its offense shutout by San Diego in the second half, the first time this season it has been held scoreless in consecutive quarters in 2019. Jacksonville battled back from a 16-7 deficit to take the lead early in the fourth quarter but saw two scores in the final 2:31 unravel a potential win. Jacksonville saw an 11-game win streak against Morehead State snapped with the Week 7 loss and this week faces a Davidson team it owns a 10-game win streak against. WILDCAT TO WATCH: Wide receiver Jalen Staples led the Davidson offense contest against San Diego, picking up 76 yards on his four receptions, including a 54-yard catch-and-carry that set up Davidson for a touchdown that gave it a 17-10 lead with three minutes left. DOLPHIN TO WATCH: While Calvin Turner Jr. racked up his 10th career 100-yard rushing day, it was Garnett Nicolas who provided some much-needed support with a 123-yard outing. Nicolas is still seeking his first TD of the campaign despite ranking second on the Dolphins roster with 375 rushing yards.

DAYTON AT STETSON, 1 P.M.

Dayton has not lost to Stetson in two previous meetings between the teams, with the last meeting coming in 2016. However, Stetson owns a 4-0 record at Spec Martin Stadium and won three straight before taking its off week last week. Dayton is 3-0 on the road after a wire-to-wire win at Valparaiso last week, the first time it has not trailed in a game this season. Dayton has had to flat-out outscore opponents this season, surrendering at least 28 points in every game this season. Meanwhile, Stetson is unbeaten when scoring 30-plus points in 2019. FLYER TO WATCH: In his two PFL games, tight end Adam Trautman has been nearly unstoppable. He has amassed 229 yards on 16 receptions, seven of those going for touchdowns. Trautman has seven of Dayton's 14 TDs in PFL play. HATTER TO WATCH: While Dayton has the league's top scoring threat (Trautman), Stetson has the league's No. 2 scorer in kicker Jonny Messina. He has kicked eight field goals this season and made each of his last six attempts. That streak includes the game-winner in the Hatters' victory against Butler in Week 6.

BUTLER AT MOREHEAD STATE, 2 P.M.

Morehead State picked up its first road win in nearly a year at Davidson and it returns to Jayne Stadium where it is 2-1 this season. Butler has lost seven straight away from Sellick Stadium, including three in 2019. The Bulldogs enjoyed one of their better offensive performances in their last road trip, scoring 27 points at Stetson in Week 6 as the passing game enjoyed its second 200-yard outing of 2019. The Eagles put up their first 400-yard offensive outing against an FCS team this season in the win at Jacksonville, showing off a near 50-50 split between its passing (206 yards) and running (208 yards) games. BULLDOG TO WATCH: In their last road contest, Bulldogs wide receiver Stephens Dennis put together the team's first 100-yard receiving day. He caught five passes for 106 yards and a touchdown at Stetson and now leads Butler with 293 receiving yards on 20 catches this season. EAGLE TO WATCH: Running back Issiah Aguero opened last week's win with his first touchdown reception and closed the game with his third touchdown run. He leads Morehead State with 660 all-purpose yards (110.0 yards per game) and leads the team with five touchdowns.

WALPARAISO AT SAN DIEGO, 5 P.M.

San Diego's 31-game PFL win streak is certainly impressive, but the Toreros home win streak in PFL play is possibly more impressive. The Toreros have not lost to a PFL foe at home since Oct. 9, 2010, a streak of 30 home games (not counting its vacated 2013 PFL campaign) without losing to a PFL foe. Valparaiso ventures into San Diego after enjoying its best offensive outing of 2019, scoring 28 points and rushing for a season-best 299 yards against Dayton. It was the Crusaders' first rushing performance this season of more than 100 yards. San Diego has not allowed a PFL foe to score in the second half this season, shutting out both Marist and Davidson en route to surrendering just 24 points in those two PFL outings. CRUSADER TO WATCH: Quarterback Chris Duncan broke through against Dayton, rushing for 154 yards and a score and passing for another 148 yards and a TD. He had not run for more than 88 yards in a game in his career. TORERO TO WATCH: On a day that Reid Sinnett threw for 358 yards, wide receiver Michael Bandy caught touchdown passes on both sides of the halftime break to tie the game and give San Diego its first lead. Bandy finished with a team-best 118 receiving yards on nine catches.

SAN DIEGO'S PFL WIN STREAK THIRD LONGEST IN FCS HISTORY

With its win against Valparaiso in Week 7, San Diego's extended its PFL win streak to 31 games. It is the third longest conference win streak in PFL history. It trails a 39-game win streak by Duquesne in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Association (1999-06) and a 36-game win streak by Jacksonville State of the Ohio Valley Conference (2013-18).

FOSTER NAMED STATS FCS SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Morehead State kicker Andrew Foster became the second PFL athlete to earn STATS FCS weekly honors in 2019, picking up the organzization's National FCS Special Teams Player of the Week award after Week 7 action. Foster made three field goals and scored 12 points as Morehead State downed Jacksonville, 30-22, for the first time since 2005. He became the second PFL kicker to convert twice from 40 yards in the same game this season, hitting from 45 and 43 yards while making all three of his field goal attempts.

PFL WELL REPRESENTED ON CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST LIST

Five Pioneer Football League student-athletes were named as semifinalists for the 2019 William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Mazada and The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. The five PFL student-athletes recognized as semifinalists were: Brad Sznajder, Butler; Ethan Steinbacher, Davidson; Tim Simon, Dayton; Andrew McElroy, Marist; and Gaven DeFilippo, Stetson. That quintet joins a group that now includes 82 PFL student-athletes who have been named a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy, or its predecessor the Draddy Trophy, since 1998.

CORWIN NAMED STATS FCS FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Drake freshman Ian Corwin put it all together in his best performance and Drake's first win of the season, 41-17 at Marist, Sept. 28. Corwin completed 20 of 29 passes (69 percent) for 255 yards and four touchdowns with one interception. The four touchdown passes went to four different receivers and were one more than he threw in the first three games combined.

DUGGER VAULTS PAST 2,500 YARDS

Davidson running back Wesley Dugger pushed past the 2,500 career yard mark against Campbell, Sept. 21. One of two juniors among the FCS Top 10 Active Career Leaders, he is ranked fourth in total rushing yardage (2,731), averaging 105.0 yards per game. He is just ahead of Monmouth junior Pete Guerriero (2,594 yards) on the list. Dugger needs 561 yards to move into the PFL's career Top 10 in rushing yards (3,292 yards, Drake's Jonathan Taylor).

THE EFFICIENT COOK

Seeing a PFL quarterback listed on the FCS Active Career Leaders list in passing efficiency is a normal occurrence. However, that quarterback not having San Diego next to their name is a new twist. Dayton signal caller Jack Cook is the FCS' active career leader with a 165.65 career pass efficiency rating. That would rank second all-time on the PFL's career pass efficiency list, behind San Diego's Josh Johnson's 176.68 mark (2004-07)

BANDY REACHES 2,500

Meanwhile, San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy moved past the 2,500 receiving yard plateau in Week 6. He now is ranked fifth among FCS active career leaders with 2,651 career receiving yards. Bandy needs just 256 yards to move into the PFL's Top 10 in receiving yardage (2,907 yards, Morehead State's Jake Raymond).

WARNER'S BAKER'S DOZEN

Drake's defensive back Will Warner has interceptions in back-to-back games after nabbing a pass against Valparaiso and Butler. He now has 13 career interceptions, keeping him atop the list of the FCS' active career leaders. He also moved into the PFL's career Top 10 in interceptions with the pick against Butler.

DAVIDSON'S HATALOWICH NAMED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Davidson linebacker George Hatalowich was named to the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team Sept. 12. As the founder and current president of Davidson Football Uplifting Athletes, George has been responsible for raising more than \$25,000 to benefit the rare disease community. George has also taken the Davidson Chapter a step further to engage with local patients, families and caregivers through the Uplifting Athletes Bowling event, which allows the families the opportunity to bowl alongside the football team. The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team will be invited to the 2020 Allstate® Sugar Bowl® and will join Tebow and Allstate volunteers to give back to New Orleans through a special community service project. Allstate will recognize the team during the halftime show. Fans are invited to visit ESPN.com/Allstate to vote for the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team captain once per day, now through Nov. 22. The team captain will be honored at The Home Depot College Football Awards on ESPN later this season.

DAYTON FLIES TO HISTORIC WIN

Facing the No. 14 team in the FCS, Dayton faced daunting odds to win its season opener at Indiana State. But when Sean Prophit scored with 1:57 left the Flyers had an opportunity. Then Zach Rumpke turned that opportunity into reality with a interception to seal the win. It was the highest-ranked FCS opponent a Dayton team had defeated in program history and was the PFL's third win all-time against the Missouri Valley Football Conference.

VALPARAISO'S 100TH SEASON

Valparaiso is set to celebrate its 100-year history over the course of the campaign by recognizing and celebrating individuals and teams from select eras at four games this season. The Crusaders have won 11 conference championships, including six in the Indiana Collegiate Conference and two in the Pioneer

Football League. Valparaiso will retire the numbers of two University legends at the Homecoming game on Sept. 28 at Brown Field. Garry Puetz '73 and Fuzzy Thurston '56 (posthumous) will become the first players in program history to have their numbers retired.

DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK NOW 481 GAMES

The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to Dayton, which extended its streak to 480 games with its win at Robert Morris. That streak includes 285 games as an FCS member that is second among active FCS-only streaks. Montana holds the FCS-only longest streak without being shutout at 398 games which dates back to 1989. On the FBS side, Florida holds that subdivision's longest streak of games without being shutout at 391, dating back to the 1988 season. Meanwhile, the Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

NINE FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRE-SEASON SQUAD

The 29-member Preseason All-PFL squad saw nine First-Team All-PFL selections return from the 2018 season. Three 2018 first-teamers return on offense with San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy leading the unit. Drake defensive back Will Warner leads a group of five 2018 first-team selections on the league's preseason defensive unit. San Diego return specialist Michael Armstead is the lone returning first-team selection on the league's special teams unit. Six PFL teams have a First-Team All-PFL returnee on their roster in 2018: San Diego (3), Drake (2), Davidson, Dayton, Jacksonville and Stetson

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL

For the ninth consecutive year, San Diego was picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. San Diego, which has won regular-season title each of the past three seasons, again received the coaches' nod to win the 2019 PFL title. With seven first-place votes, the Toreros were chosen ahead of Dayton and Drake, who picked up the remaining three first-place votes.

THREE PFL PUNTERS NAMED TO FCS PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

A trio of Pioneer Football League Punters were named to the inaugural FCS Punter of the Year Award Watch List presented by The Augusta Sports Council. Drake's Ross Kennedy, Morehead State's Andrew Foster and San Diego's Tanner Kuljian were each named to the 28-player list released in July. Each of the three finished 2018 ranked among the NCAA's Top 100 punters in punting average. Kuljian was ranked No. 14 nationally, averaging 42.8 yards per punt on 59 kicks. Foster was No. 26 among FCS kickers with 41.9 yards per punt. Kennedy finished the season No. 93 among FCS punters (37.1 yards per punt).

BANDY, TRAUTMAN, WANRER EARN FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA NODS

San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy, Dayton tight end Adam Trautman and Drake defensive back Will Waner made the rounds as the Preseason All-America squads were announced. Bandy was named to all four Preseason All-America teams (STATS, Athlon, Phill Steele and HERO), Warner was named to three (STATS, Phill Steele and HERO) and Trautman earned recognition on two (STATS and Phill Steele).

THIRTY-FIVE PFL ATHLETES NAMED TO 2019 NFF HAMP-SHIRE SOCIETY

Thirty-five Pioneer Football League student-athletes, representing seven member institutions, were named members of the 2019 NFF Hampshire Honor Society, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame announced in April. The NFF's Hampshire Honor Society recognizes those college football players from all divisions of play that maintained a cumulative 3.2 GPA or better throughout their college careers.

FOUR NOMINATED FOR ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Three Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 137 nominees from across the country for the 28th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. George Hatalowich (Davidson), Luke Butera (Marist) and Ryan Culhane (Dayton) were nominated for the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

PARADY DEAN OF PFL. FCS COACHES

As 2019 gets underway, the longest-tenured coaches in Division I FCS are Marist's Jim Parady and Monmouth's Kevin Callahan, who have been head

coaches at their respective schools since 1992. On the other end of the spectrum, the PFL welcomes two new head coaches in 2019: Valparaiso's Landon Fox and Drake's Jeff Stepsis, who were part of 24 new head coaches in the FCS this season.

LANDON FOX TAKES OVER AT VALPARAISO

In March Valparaiso Director of Athletics Mark LaBarbera introduced Landon Fox as the 18th head coach of the Crusaders foottball program. Fox is no stranger to success in the Pioneer Football League, as he spent the 11 previous season as Dayton's defensive coordinator and secondary coach. During that time, the Flyers compiled an 86-38 record, won three PFL championships and participated in the 2015 FCS playoffs while making defense a hallmark of the program.

STETSON'S HUGHES EARNS CONTRACT EXTENSION

Coming off the best season in more than 65 years, Stetson football coach Roger Hughes was rewarded with a contract extension that will keep him on the Hatters sideline through at least the 2021 season. Hughes, who has guided the Stetson football program since 2011 when he was charged with leading the program onto the field after more than 50 years without a team, was named Pioneer Football League Coach of the Year in 2018.

DRAKE NAMES STEPSIS HEAD COACH

Todd Stepsis, the architect of the Drake football team's nationally-ranked defense, was named the head coach of the Drake football team in December. He takes the reins of the Bulldogs' program after serving as the program's defensive coordinator for the past five seasons under previous head coach Rick Fox, who resigned his position. As the defensive coordinator, Stepsis built the Drake defense into one of the nation's top units and coached a total of 42 all-conference selections including the program's all-time leading tackler and the 2018 PFL Defensive Player of the Year, Nathan Clayberg.

PFL'S 27TH CAMPAIGN

The 2019 season marks the 27th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 10 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2018 NCAA FCS Championship.

PRESBYTERIAN TO JOIN PFL IN 2021

In 2019, the Pioneer Football League Commissioner presidents' council agreed to accept Presbyterian College's request for membership, effective for the 2021 season. Presbyterian College's football program will remain a Big South member for the 2019 season while continuing to phase out scholarships in order to obtain PFL eligibility. The Blue Hose will play one season as a Division I independent in 2020 before joining the PFL in 2021.
