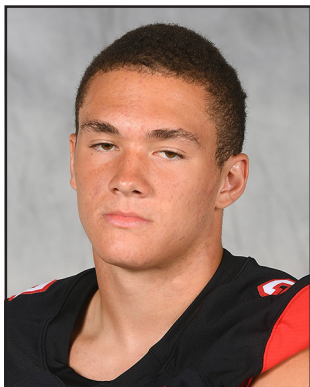

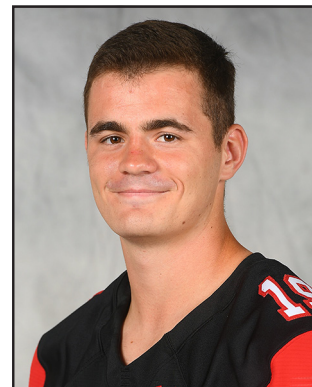

Wesley Dugger, Davidson

Junior | Running Back
Henrico, Virginia

Set a Davidson record and tied the PFL record with five rushing touchdowns in a 49-19 victory at Jacksonville, Saturday. He finished the day with 22 carries for 193 yards, the third-best rushing performance of his career and best this season. Dugger punched in each of his touchdowns from the five-yard line or closer. He also had a 74-yard dash that set up one of his touchdowns. It was his third multi-TD performance this season. Dugger set the Davidson record for career touchdowns (37) and third on the program's all-time rushing yardage list (2,940 yards).

DEFENSIVE

Vaughn Taylor Jr., Morehead State

Junior | Defensive End
Washington, D.C.

Taylor Jr. earns his second consecutive weekly honor after leading Morehead State with 10 tackles in a 31-20 victory against Butler, Saturday. He posted his second 3.5 tackle-for-loss outing this season and harassed the Butler quarterback with 1.5 sacks and two quarterback hurries. With Morehead State leading by 10 points in the fourth quarter, Butler started a drive at MSU's 30-yard line only to see Taylor Jr. record a 15-yard sack to push them out of field goal position and into a punt.

Getting the nod at kicker during the pregame, Tabor connected on all seven of his PATs in Davidson's 49-19 victory at Jacksonville, Saturday. Prior to the contest Tabor had not practiced at kicker or attempted a kick during his Davidson career. In the fourth quarter, he ran for a three-yard score then kicked the PAT to give Davidson a 49-13 lead.

WEEK 9 BREAKDOWNS

■ SAN DIEGO AT DAYTON, NOON

Annually one of the most watch fixtures on the PFL calendar, the contest between San Diego and Dayton again will have an impact on the race for the championship. San Diego is one of the league's co-leaders at 3-0 and will look to stay there against a Dayton squad that is right behind the co-leaders with a 2-1 record. Offensively, these two teams are as evenly matched as can be with Dayton holding a slight edge in yardage (470.3-462.7) in their first three league outings. However, the difference emerges on defense where the top-ranked Toreros defense (268.7 ypg) holds a sizeable edge over the Flyers defensive unit (451.7 ypg). TORERO TO WATCH: Dayton has been susceptible to the run in its first three PFL outings but will San Diego running back Emilio Martinez, who has just 281 rushing yards in 2019 – 115 of those coming against nationally-ranked UC Davis – be able to take advantage? FLYER TO WATCH: San Diego's defense has not allowed a touchdown by air in its first three PFL contests and intercepted six passes, enter Dayton quarterback Jack Cook whose 12 TD to 1 INT ratio is second only to Reid Sinnett, the Toreros' quarterback.

■ JACKSONVILLE AT BUTLER, 1 P.M.

Jacksonville and Butler each enter their Week 9 contest seeking a PFL win that has proven elusive in 2019. Jacksonville has had the misfortune of playing three of the league's 2-1 squads in its first three outings. Butler has fared no better in its early schedule, facing one of the PFL's co-leaders and two of the league's 2-1 teams. Both the Dolphins and Bulldogs have faced Morehead State in the last two weeks: Jacksonville seeing a fourth-quarter lead evaporate in a 30-22 Week 7 loss while Butler was within four points in the fourth quarter before falling by a 31-20 margin last week. DOLPHIN TO WATCH: In its Week 8 loss to Davidson, Jacksonville was held under 100 rushing yards for the first time this season but mostly due to a season-low 26 team carries that was half its previous low. Quarterback Calvin Turner Jr. will look to return to his season averages: his 137 carries (19.6 per game) averaging 5.3 yards each (103.6 yards per game). BULLDOG TO WATCH: Brad Sznajder was a true utility man in last week's loss to Morehead State. He finished with 90 rushing yards, 20 yards receiving, passed for 43 yards (2-of-2 passing) and even tossed in a 41-yard punt return for good measure. Sznajder leads Butler with 642 all-purpose yards in 2019.

■ MARIST AT DAVIDSON, 1 P.M.

Marist, who has played one of the PFL's toughest schedule so far in 2019, receives no respite from its early slog when it travels to face a Davidson squad that is 2-1 in league play. The Red Foxes have faced PFL co-leaders Drake and San Diego and Ivy League co-leader Dartmouth in their last three outings, each a loss. The Wildcats bounced back from a Week 7 loss to co-leader San Diego with a decisive victory at Jacksonville last week as it posted a season-best 521 rushing yards. Both Marist and Davidson have faced San Diego in 2019: Marist dropping a 31-7 decision at home in Week 6 while Davidson fell on the road by a 37-17 margin. RED FOX TO WATCH: On a relatively quiet day for the Marist offense against Dartmouth, wide receiver and return specialist Dwayne Menders kept setting up the offense with good field position. He posted 98 combined kick return yards, 26 on one punt return and 72 yards on four kick returns, and finished with 122 all-purpose yards. WILDCAT TO WATCH: Davidson showed off the full depth of its run attack against Jacksonville last week, with 12 Wildcats runners combined for 73 carries and 525 yards. Running back Wesley Dugger was the league's Offensive Player of the Week (193 yards), averaging 8.8 yards on his 22 carries.

■ STETSON AT VALPARAISO, 1 P.M.

Winners of their last four games, Stetson hits the road for only the second time in 2019 when it travels to Valparaiso. The Hatters only other road trip this season was the scene of their only PFL loss, a narrow 26-23 defeat at Marist. Valparaiso, who joins Marist with the PFL's toughest schedule so far in 2019, returns home to face another of the league's early challengers for the championship. Keeping with the common opponent theme, both Stetson and Valparaiso have square off against Dayton this season. The Hatters enjoyed their first-ever win against the Flyers with a 38-21 victory last week. The Crusaders enjoyed their best offensive outing of 2019 in a 41-28 loss to Dayton in Week 7. HATTER TO WATCH: Freshman running back Jalen Leary broke out in a big way against Dayton, posting a program-record 220 rushing yards on 19 carries. That after he rushed for 352 yards in his first five games at Stetson. His 220-yard outing is the best by a PFL runner and most by an FCS freshman in 2019. CRUSADER TO WATCH: Quarterback Chris Duncan is slowly returning to form in 2019, posting 516 offensive yards in his last two outings after missing back-to-back games. He ran for two scores against San Diego last week and is responsible for four of Valparaiso's six touchdowns in its last two games.

■ MOREHEAD STATE AT DRAKE, 2 P.M.

Fresh off its off week, Drake returns to PFL play finding that its tied for the league lead at 3-0. The Bulldogs will look to fend off a surging Morehead State squad that has won its last two outings and moved to 2-1 in league play. Drake has surged since entering PFL play and enters this week's matchup as the league's top-ranked scoring offense (39.3 ppg) and its top-ranked scoring defense (10.0 ppg) through three league outings. Morehead State also has made the most of its PFL run, scoring 30 or more points in all three contests and holding its last two foes to 22 points or less. EAGLE TO WATCH: Three-time PFL Defensive Player of the Week Vaughn Taylor Jr. ranks ninth among FCS defenders with 12.5 total tackles for loss through seven games in 2019, including 5.5 sacks (22nd in the FCS). He has 7.0 TFL in three PFL games this season. BULLDOG TO WATCH: Freshman quarterback Ian Corwin has hit his stride in PFL play, passing for nine touchdowns against one interception and ranks second in pass efficiency rating (175.7) in league action only through three games.

WEEK 9 QUICKLY

All 10 PFL teams will be involved in league action this weekend and will be for each of the five weeks remaining in the regular season. Co-leader Drake returns to action after its off week with a pivotal road trip to a surging Morehead State that has won back-to-back games and sits only a game behind the co-leaders. San Diego, the league's other co-leader, treks cross country for its own key test at Dayton in a matchup of perennial PFL powers that pits a 3-0 Toreros side against a 2-1 Flyers squad. Davidson and Stetson, also sitting at 2-1 in league play, look to follow up big Week 8 wins while avoiding potential traps as the Wildcats host Marist while the Hatters travel to Valparaiso. Meanwhile, Jacksonville travels to Butler with both squads seeking their first PFL win.

CHAMBERLIN TO RECORD 500TH GAME AS A FLYER

There are few things that can challenge the longevity of Dayton's scoring streak, which stands at 482 games entering this weekend. However, Rick Chamberlin's tenure as a Flyer surpasses even that streak. When he takes up his position on the sideline against San Diego this weekend it will be his 500th appearance as a Flyer. He played 45 as an All-American linebacker, then 326 games as an assistant coach under College Football Hall of Fame coach Mike Kelly, before taking over for his mentor and coaching the last 129 games as Dayton's head coach.

SAN DIEGO'S PFL WIN STREAK THIRD LONGEST IN FCS HISTORY

With its win against Valparaiso in Week 8, San Diego's extended its PFL win streak to 32 games. It is the third longest conference win streak in FCS history. It trails a 39-game win streak by Duquesne in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Association (1999-06) and a 36-game win streak by Jacksonville State of the Ohio Valley Conference (2013-18).

FOSTER NAMED STATS FCS SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Morehead State kicker Andrew Foster became the second PFL athlete to earn STATS FCS weekly honors in 2019, picking up the organization's National FCS Special Teams Player of the Week award after Week 7 action. Foster made three field goals and scored 12 points as Morehead State downed Jacksonville, 30-22, for the first time since 2005. He became the second PFL kicker to convert twice from 40 yards in the same game this season, hitting from 45 and 43 yards while making all three of his field goal attempts.

PFL WELL REPRESENTED ON CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST LIST

Five Pioneer Football League student-athletes were named as semifinalists for the 2019 William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Mazada and The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. The five PFL student-athletes recognized as semifinalists were: Brad Sznajder, Butler; Ethan Steinbacher, Davidson; Tim Simon, Dayton; Andrew McElroy, Marist; and Gaven DeFilippo, Stetson. That quintet joins a group that now includes 82 PFL student-athletes who have been named a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy, or its predecessor the Draddy Trophy, since 1998.

CORWIN NAMED STATS FCS FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Drake freshman Ian Corwin put it all together in his best performance and Drake's first win of the season, 41-17 at Marist, Sept. 28. Corwin completed 20 of 29 passes (69 percent) for 255 yards and four touchdowns with one interception. The four touchdown passes went to four different receivers and were one more than he threw in the first three games combined.

DUGGER VAULTS PAST 2,500 YARDS

Davidson running back Wesley Dugger pushed past the 2,500 career yard mark against Campbell, Sept. 21. One of two juniors among the FCS Top 10 Active Career Leaders, he is ranked fourth in total rushing yardage (2,924), averaging 108.3 yards per game (2nd among active career leaders). He is just ahead of Monmouth junior Pete Guerriero (2,780 yards) on the list. Dugger needs 368 yards to move into the PFL's career Top 10 in rushing yards (3,292 yards, Drake's Jonathan Taylor).

THE EFFICIENT COOK

Seeing a PFL quarterback listed on the FCS Active Career Leaders list in passing efficiency is a normal occurrence. However, that quarterback not having San Diego next to their name is a new twist. Dayton signal caller Jack Cook is ranked No. 2 on the FCS' active career leader list with a 160.16 career pass efficiency rating. That would rank second all-time on the PFL's career pass efficiency list, behind San Diego's Josh Johnson's 176.68 mark (2004-07)

BANDY REACHES 2,500

Meanwhile, San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy moved past the 2,500 receiving yard plateau in Week 6. He now is ranked fifth among FCS active career leaders with 2,822 career receiving yards. Bandy needs just 86 yards to move into the PFL's Top 10 in receiving yardage (2,907 yards, Morehead State's Jake Raymond).

WARNER'S BAKER'S DOZEN

Drake's defensive back Will Warner has interceptions in back-to-back games after nabbing a pass against Valparaiso and Butler. He now has 13 career interceptions, keeping him atop the list of the FCS' active career leaders. He also moved into the PFL's career Top 10 in interceptions with the pick against Butler.

DAVIDSON'S HATALOWICH NAMED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Davidson linebacker George Hatalowich was named to the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team Sept. 12. As the founder and current president of Davidson Football Uplifting Athletes, George has been responsible for raising more than \$25,000 to benefit the rare disease community. George has also taken the Davidson Chapter a step further to engage with local patients, families and caregivers through the Uplifting Athletes

DAYTON FLIES TO HISTORIC WIN

Facing the No. 14 team in the FCS, Dayton faced daunting odds to win its season opener at Indiana State. But when Sean Proffit scored with 1:57 left the Flyers had an opportunity. Then Zach Rumpke turned that opportunity into reality with a interception to seal the win. It was the highest-ranked FCS opponent a Dayton team had defeated in program history and was the PFL's third win all-time against the Missouri Valley Football Conference.

VALPARAISO'S 100TH SEASON

Valparaiso is set to celebrate its 100-year history over the course of the campaign by recognizing and celebrating individuals and teams from select eras at four games this season. The Crusaders have won 11 conference championships, including six in the Indiana Collegiate Conference and two in the Pioneer Football League. Valparaiso will retire the numbers of two University legends at the Homecoming game on Sept. 28 at Brown Field. Garry Puetz '73 and Fuzzy Thurston '56 (posthumous) will become the first players in program history to have their numbers retired.

DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK NOW 481 GAMES

The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to Dayton, which extended its streak to 48 games with its win at Robert Morris. That streak includes 285 games as an FCS member that is second among active FCS-only streaks. Montana holds the FCS-only longest streak without being shutout at 398 games which dates back to 1989. On the FBS side, Florida holds that subdivision's longest streak of games without being shutout at 391, dating back to the 1988 season. Meanwhile, the Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

NINE FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRE-SEASON SQUAD

The 29-member Preseason All-PFL squad saw nine First-Team All-PFL selections return from the 2018 season. Three 2018 first-teamers return on offense with San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy leading the unit. Drake defensive back Will Warner leads a group of five 2018 first-team selections on the league's preseason defensive unit. San Diego return specialist Michael Armstead is the lone returning first-team selection on the league's special teams unit. Six PFL teams have a First-Team All-PFL returnee on their roster in 2018: San Diego (3), Drake (2), Davidson, Dayton, Jacksonville and Stetson

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL

For the ninth consecutive year, San Diego was picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. San Diego, which has won regular-season title each of the past three seasons, again received the coaches' nod to win the 2019 PFL title. With seven first-place votes, the Toreros were chosen ahead of Dayton and Drake, who picked up the remaining three first-place votes.

THREE PFL PUNTERS NAMED TO FCS PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

A trio of Pioneer Football League Punters were named to the inaugural FCS Punter of the Year Award Watch List presented by The Augusta Sports Council. Drake's Ross Kennedy, Morehead State's Andrew Foster and San Diego's Tanner Kuljian were each named to the 28-player list released in July. Each of the three finished 2018 ranked among the NCAA's Top 100 punters in punting average. Kuljian was ranked No. 14 nationally, averaging 42.8 yards per punt on 59 kicks. Foster was No. 26 among FCS kickers with 41.9 yards per punt. Kennedy finished the season No. 93 among FCS punters (37.1 yards per punt).

BANDY, TRAUTMAN, WANER EARN FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA NODS

San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy, Dayton tight end Adam Trautman and Drake defensive back Will Waner made the rounds as the Preseason All-America squads were announced. Bandy was named to all four Preseason All-America teams (STATS, Athlon, Phill Steele and HERO), Warner was named to

three (STATS, Phill Steele and HERO) and Trautman earned recognition on two (STATS and Phill Steele).

THIRTY-FIVE PFL ATHLETES NAMED TO 2019 NFF HAMPSHIRE SOCIETY

Thirty-five Pioneer Football League student-athletes, representing seven member institutions, were named members of the 2019 NFF Hampshire Honor Society, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame announced in April. The NFF's Hampshire Honor Society recognizes those college football players from all divisions of play that maintained a cumulative 3.2 GPA or better throughout their college careers.

FOUR NOMINATED FOR ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Three Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 137 nominees from across the country for the 28th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. George Hatalowich (Davidson), Luke Butera (Marist) and Ryan Culhane (Dayton) were nominated for the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

PARADY DEAN OF PFL, FCS COACHES

As 2019 gets underway, the longest-tenured coaches in Division I FCS are Marist's Jim Parady and Monmouth's Kevin Callahan, who have been head coaches at their respective schools since 1992. On the other end of the spectrum, the PFL welcomes two new head coaches in 2019: Valparaiso's Landon Fox and Drake's Jeff Stepsis, who were part of 24 new head coaches in the FCS this season.

LANDON FOX TAKES OVER AT VALPARAISO

In March Valparaiso Director of Athletics Mark LaBarbera introduced Landon Fox as the 18th head coach of the Crusaders football program. Fox is no stranger to success in the Pioneer Football League, as he spent the 11 previous season as Dayton's defensive coordinator and secondary coach. During that time, the Flyers compiled an 86-38 record, won three PFL championships and participated in the 2015 FCS playoffs while making defense a hallmark of the program.

STETSON'S HUGHES EARNS CONTRACT EXTENSION

Coming off the best season in more than 65 years, Stetson football coach Roger Hughes was rewarded with a contract extension that will keep him on the Hatters sideline through at least the 2021 season. Hughes, who has guided the Stetson football program since 2011 when he was charged with leading the program onto the field after more than 50 years without a team, was named Pioneer Football League Coach of the Year in 2018.

DRAKE NAMES STEPSIS HEAD COACH

Todd Stepsis, the architect of the Drake football team's nationally-ranked defense, was named the head coach of the Drake football team in December. He takes the reins of the Bulldogs' program after serving as the program's defensive coordinator for the past five seasons under previous head coach Rick Fox, who resigned his position. As the defensive coordinator, Stepsis built the Drake defense into one of the nation's top units and coached a total of 42 all-conference selections including the program's all-time leading tackler and the 2018 PFL Defensive Player of the Year, Nathan Clayberg.

PFL'S 27TH CAMPAIGN

The 2019 season marks the 27th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 10 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2018 NCAA FCS Championship.

PRESBYTERIAN TO JOIN PFL IN 2021

In 2019, the Pioneer Football League Commissioner presidents' council agreed to accept Presbyterian College's request for membership, effective for the 2021 season. Presbyterian College's football program will remain a Big South member for the 2019 season while continuing to phase out scholarships in order to obtain PFL eligibility. The Blue Hose will play one season as a Division I independent in 2020 before joining the PFL in 2021.
