On May 28, 2010, Davidson College Athletic Director Jim Murphy announced the hiring of Michele Savage as the head coach for the Wildcat women's basketball program. She is the 11th head coach in the program's 35-year history as she enters her seventh season for the 2016-17 campaign, which has the Wildcats playing its third year in the Atlantic 10.

- •Led Davidson to a school-record 12 homes wins in 2011-12.
- Guided the 'Cats to a school-best eightgame road win streak and tying a school record with eight straight in the SoCon on the road all in 2013.
- Coached Davidson to the program's firstever Atlantic 10 win, Jan. 18, 2015 with a win at Saint Louis.
- Has coached 13 SoCon academic honor roll players, four A-10 Commissioner's Honor Roll players, four All-SoCon players, five 1,000-point scorers, four all-league Freshmen Team members, one SoCon Freshman of the Year and Player of the Year.

• Has coached three Rebecca E. Stimson Award winners (Aleksandrivius, Murray and Hannah Early), given to Davidson's top female athlete in recognition of outstanding dedication and contribution to intercolle-

Davidson, Through the Years Entering its second year in the Atlantic 10, Savage helped the Wildcats improve across the board with six more wins overall and four in league play. Davidson went 11-19 on the season, while finishing 12th with a 5-11 A-10 mark. The Wildcats ran off a seasonhigh three-game win streak, including collecting a thrilling double-overtime win at High Point. In addition, they recorded the program's first two-game A-10 win streak, collecting victories at VCU on national television and then at home vs. Fordham. The triumph at home vs. the Rams was Davidson's first league home victory in its new conference and the biggest in its two years so far at 69-51.

Savage guided the 'Cats to six non-conference wins, marking the most since the Wildcats went 6-5 during the 2007-08 season. They also won the program's seventh in-season tournament title since 1992-93 when they took home wins against Bowling Green and UNC Wilmington at the UNCW Thanksgiving Tournament. It was the second in-season tournament title under Savage for Davidson.

Senior Hannah Early and Dakota Dukes, under the direction of Savage, left their marks scattered throughout the Wildcats' record books. Early was honored with the Rebecca E. Stimson award as the top female athlete at Davidson. She finished her career as the program's all-time record holder in three-pointers, while ranking fourth in scoring with 1,406. Dukes concluded her career with 1,280 points, eighth-most all-time in the record books. Her name is found in nine overall categories in the Wildcat top-15, including third in made free throws (350) and second in attempts (486), and fifth in rebounds with 734.

The 2014-15 season marked a new era for the women's basketball program as Savage, in her fifth season, helped Davidson usher in its first year in the Atlantic 10. The Wildcats won their first-ever A-10 game on the road with a 53-50 win at Saint Louis to open the month of January. It would be the only win though in league play, as they went 1-15 in their first year and 5-25 overall. The 'Cats played 10 new opponents during the campaign, with nine of them being from the A-10.

Savage helped the program win its 400th game in its 36th season with a road win at Gardner-Webb, Nov. 20, 2014. The victory also marked her 75th career win at Davidson

Under the guidance of Savage, junior Hannah Early became the 17th player in program history to reach 1,000 career points as she accomplished the feat during the 2014-15 season. It was the fourth time during Savage's tenure a Wildcat had reached the 1,000-

point mark. Early also went on to set a single season record for three-pointers with 74. Freshman Mackenzie Latt had a great debut season for Savage, earning a spot on the A-10 All-Freshman Team, while earning two A-10 Rookie of the Week awards. Fellow classmate Saadia Timpton also earned an A-10 Rookie of the Week award during the season. Davidson as a team tied the single game record for blocks with 12 in a 76-57 home win over High Point.

In Davidson's final season in the Southern Conference, Savage, in her fourth year, coached the Wildcats to a third place finish with an 11-7 record and a 16-16 mark overall in 2013-14. They reached the SoCon Championship game for the second year in a row, falling to Chattanooga. Savage collected her 50th career SoCon victory at UNCG, Feb. 8, 2014. She moved into second place in program history in league wins, finishing with 52. Davidson as a team tied the single season record for three-pointers with 180. It reached the 10-win plateau for the 11th time in the past 12 years in SoCon victories and had a seven-game home SoCon win streak that spanned from the end of the 2012-13 season into the first three league games of the 2013-14 campaign.

For the second year in a row, Savage saw one of the players in program history become its all-time scoring leader when Laura Murray hit her last bucket in the SoCon Final to set the record with 1,880 points, suprassing Sophia Aleksandravicius, who set the record the year before. Under Savage, Murray also became the program's all-time leader in made and attempted three-pointers and field goals attempted. In addition, the guard's senior season saw her set the single-season Wildcat record for points with 617, field goals attempted and free throws attempted.

Savage coached three all-league players in 2013-14, starting with Murray, who was a first team pick by both the coaches and the media. Dakota Dukes was also named to the first team by the coaches and teamed with Hannah Early on the second team for the media squad. The pair of Murray and Dukes were named to the SoCon All-Tournament First Team, with Murray becoming the first player in program history to earn the feat three times. She also joined Aleksandravicius as the only two players to earn All-SoCon First Team by the coaches.

Savage guided the Wildcats to their second

straight 20-win campaign in 2012-13, as they followed up one of their best season's in program history with yet another strong year. Davidson finished 22-13 overall and went second in the SoCon with a 16-4 record. The 'Cats' 22 wins were tied for the second-most in program history. They rode their outstanding season all the way to the conference tournament championship game, before falling to Chattanooga in a last-second affair. It was just the second time in program history Davidson had reached the final.

The Wildcats' season did not end there as they earned their second straight postseason appearance, and third overall, with a bid into the Women's NIT. They made history winning the program's first postseason game, taking home a first round victory on the road at Old Dominion, 83-72.

Savage coached arguably the best player in program history in two-time SoCon Player and Defender of the Year Sophia Aleksandravicius. The senior at the broke seven alltime records during her three years under Savage, while being named to the coaches and media's all-league first team three times. Aleksandravicius capped off her career by being named the SoCon Female Athlete of the Year, the first female from Davidson to earn the honor. She was also earned the Davidson athletic department's Rebecca A. Stimson Award as the top female studentathlete at the school.

Also during 2012-13, Savage saw Laura Murray become the 16th Wildcat to score over 1,000 career points and earn a spot on the All-SoCon First Team by the coaches and second team by the media. Murray and Aleksandravicius were both named to the SoCon All-Tournament First Team. Dakota Dukes was named to the league's all-freshman team. February 9 was a special day for Savage as she collected her 50th career coaching win at Davidson in a 56-49 road victory at Appalachian State.

In 2012-13, Davidson set a school record with an eight-game road overall win streak, all against SoCon foes. The eight-game SoCon streak tied a school record set from 2005-06 and 2006-07.

The 2011-12 season saw Savage guide the Wildcats to one of their best seasons in program history. They captured the program's first SoCon Regular-Season Title with a school-best mark of 17-3, while the 'Cats' 22 wins were second-most in school history. Davidson also set a school mark for home wins (12-1), while it earned the program's 350th win during the season.

For all her accomplishments, Savage was honored by the coaches and media as she was named the 2011-12 SoCon Coach of the Year. She is the second coach in Wildcat history to garner the media's top coach, while she is the first to be coach of the year in the coaches all-league team. Davidson's trip to the Women's NIT was the program's second-ever bid into postseason play.

In addition, Savage coached the league's player and defender of the Year in Aleksandravicius, who also was a first-teamer on both the coaches and media teams, and Laura Murray, who was an All-SoCon First

Team member on both teams as well.

Savage's first season, 2010-11, saw Davidson go 14-17 overall and sport an 8-12 campaign in the Southern Conference. The first-year head coach led the 'Cats to their first league tournament win since 2007 with a 69-53 victory against College of Charleston. They also nearly pulled off an upset of No. 1-seeded Appalachian State in the quarterfinals, before falling 73-63. Savage coached the SoCon Freshman of the Year in Murray and saw Aleksandravicius earn a spot on both the coaches and media All-SoCon First Team, while also pick up first-team all-state honors.

During the regular season, Savage led Davidson to the program's fourth in-season tournament title when the Wildcats captured the UTSA Thanksgiving Tournament with the program's first-ever wins over North Texas and UTSA, Nov. 26-27. The 'Cats also had their 10th straight winning season at home, going 8-5.

Before Davidson- Part of a Successful Run at Tulane

A Street & Smith's All-American during her playing days at Northwestern, Savage came to Davidson after serving as an assistant coach at Tulane University from 2001-10. While at Tulane, Savage's duties touched all areas of the program as she coached the Green Wave post players on a day-to-day basis and worked with recruiting, directing Tulane's scouting efforts and overseeing the team's academic progress. She was the women's basketball program's liaison with the athletic department's marketing and game management units among many other responsibilities.

During her nine years at Tulane, the Green Wave twice hit the 26-win plateau and reached the NCAA Tournament in 2002, 2003 and 2010. The 2009-10 season saw Tulane go 26-7, earn the Conference USA regular-season title and earn an automatic bid to the postseason after winning the C-USA Tournament. Savage helped lead Tulane to two Conference USA regular-season titles and a Women's NIT bid in 2007.

She helped develop several top Green Wave players who were selected by USA Today for All-American Honorable Mention as well as several first-team Conference USA players. In addition, she had the chance to coach two players, Teana McKiver and Gwen Slaughter, who went on to play in the WNBA.

Assistant Positions at Cornell, Toledo and Chicago State

The Illinois native came to Tulane after two seasons as an assistant coach at Cornell University (1999-00 & 2000-01). She helped the Big Red achieve its best season in school history while signing three players who earned honorable mention All-America honors in high school - two from New York and one from New Mexico. Her specific duties included coordinating Cornell's recruiting efforts and supervising the skill development and workouts of the post players.

Prior to her arrival at Cornell, Savage spent the 1997-98 and 1998-99 seasons as an assistant coach at Toledo, where she coached the post players and served as recruiting coordinator. She helped guide the Rockets to a Mid-American Conference championship and a No. 25 ranking. In 1998-99, Toledo advanced to the NCAA Tournament as a No. 6 seed, and its star player, Kim Knuth, the two-time Mid-America Conference Player of the Year, was named honorable mention All-America.

Before coaching at Toledo, Savage spent two seasons at Chicago State University.

Hall of Fame Collegiate Career at Northwestern

Savage graduated from Northwestern University in 1993 after a standout career with the Wildcats. A three-time All-Big Ten selection, she was a Kodak All-District choice in 1990, 1991 and 1992 and earned All-America recognition from Street & Smith's in 1991. She helped lead the Wildcats to the 1990 Big Ten Championship and to appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 1990 and 1991 as NU posted 20-plus wins both years.

One of the top 15 players in the nation as a high school senior, she led Northwestern in scoring three times and was also the team's top rebounder in 1990 and 1991. Her career field goal percentage of .606 is still a school record as is her .652 single-season mark from 1990. Savage scored in double figures in 25 straight games as a junior and had a 23-game double-figure scoring streak in her senior season. Savage was inducted in the Northwestern Hall of Fame in 2002 and the Illinois Hall of Fame in 2008





2014 2015 CONTINUE INAUGURAL SEASON



The 2015-16 season marked Davidson women's basketball program's second year in the Atlantic 10 as they finished up the program's 37th year.

Individually, Hannah Early and Dakota Dukes finished out their careers with strong senior seasons and left with their names scattered throughout the record books.

Below are just a few of the Wildcat highlights throughout the campaign.

Trio Pace 'Cats to Season-Opening Win at Furman

Davidson started the year off with a solid 18-point win at Furman, Nov. 13, behind the strong play of Dakota Dukes, Hannah Early and Mackenzie Latt. The trio each reached double figures in the win. Dukes had game-high tying 19 points, while Early dropped in 14 and Latt had 12.

Double-OT Thriller at High Point

Davidson need a couple extra periods to get its second win of the season Tuesday, Nov. 24, when it secured a 62-60 double-overtime win at High Point.

Hannah Early hit a pair of free throws with 2:37 left in the second overtime and it proved to be the winning points to send Davidson to the win.

The double-overtime game was the first for the Wildcats (2-2) since Feb. 15, 2005 at UNCG and their first win in the two extra periods since downing Canisius 83-79 on Dec. 3, 2000.

The 'Cats twice led by six in the fourth quarter, only to see HPU tie it up and later take the lead. Dakota Dukes hit 1-of-2 free throws to tie it back up with 3.4 seconds to send the game into OT.

Welcome to the 1,000-Point Club

Senior forward Dakota Dukes joined an elite company in Davidson women's basketball history over the Thanksgiving weekend, Nov. 27-28. The senior became the 18th player to reach 1,000 points for a career when she swished home two free throws in the late seconds of the first quarter vs. UNC Wilmington, Nov. 28 to give her 999 and 1,000 career points.

Dukes went on to score a game-high 20 points and canned all eight free throw attempts she took for the game.

It marks the ninth year in the past 10 that a Wildcat has scored 1,000 points for their career. Last year saw Hannah Early reach the milestone to become the 17th

Under head coach Michele Savage, it is her fifth 1,000-point scorer she has coached.

The Wildcats also faced a familiar face in former player and hall of famer Jennifer

Roos. The BG head coach was facing her alma mater for the first time. She was inducted into the Davidson Athletic Hall of Fame in 2004-05. She was a three-sport star for the Wildcats.

In-Season Tournaments

The Wildcats, after taking home the UNC Wilmington Hampton Inn Thanksgiving Tournament, ran their record to 29-36 at in regular-season tournament play since the 1992-93 season when women's basketball returned to Davidson.

Davidson downed Bowling Green and host UNCW to win its seventh tournament title and first in three tries at the Seahawks' holiday tournament.

Dukes Tabbed A-10 Player of Week by College Sports Madness

After leading Davidson to a perfect 3-0 week and reaching the 1,000-point mark for her career, senior forward Dakota Dukes was named the College Sports Madness Atlantic 10 Player of the Week, Nov.

The senior had an outstanding week, averaging 18.7 points. 8.3 rebounds and 4.0 blocks a game (12 total blocks for the week), while shooting a blistering 75 percent from the floor (21-of-28). In addition, Dukes went 14-for-17 from the free throw line, including a 10-for-10 showing over the weekend at the holiday tournament.

Early, Wildcats Keep Win Streak Rolling vs. the Catamounts

Hannah Early tallied her eighth career double-double and Davidson rolled to a 64-51 win in its home opener Saturday against Western Carolina, Dec. 5.

Early registered a season-high 20 points, canning a personal-best nine field goals, and pulled in a career-best 15 rebounds for her second double-double of the season. She also recorded three blocks and three steals, which were both season

Davidson won its ninth in a row in the all-time series vs. WCU and 12th in the past 14 games overall. It holds a 28-25 alltime record in the series.

Davidson Goes 4-3 on Season-Long Seven-Game Road Trip

Despite being on the road for the first seven games to start the 2015-16 season, Davidson had a solid showing by going 4-

It picked up wins against Furman, High Point, Bowling Green (first-ever) and UNC Wilmington, while winning the UNCW Thanksgiving Tournament.

It was the second longest road trip in program history, next to an eight-game trip to open the 2009-10 season.

'Cats Hang Tough vs. No. 25/23 Michigan State

Despite the final score, a 73-44 defeat, Davidson hung tough on its home floor against nationally-ranked Michigan State, Dec. 9. The Wildcats played to an even 15-all first quarter behind Hannah Early's nine points and were down just seven at halftime, 29-22.

Though the Spartans pushed the lead out to 16 in the third quarter, a 9-3 run to close the quarter got Davidson within 10 (44-34) heading into the final quarter. But MSU pulled away with a 14-4 run to open the final quarter and the 'Cats never recovered.

Early finished with a double-double on 13 points and 11 rebounds, while freshman Justine Lyon netted a season-best 12 points.

It was the first time-ever Davidson hadhosted a top-25 ranked team. The game also marked the third time in the past four years the Wildcats faced a nationallyranked opponent.

'Cats Reach 10-Win Mark For 20th Time

With their win at home vs. George Mason, the Wildcats reached the 10-win mark for the 20th time in the past 22 years dating back to 1995-96. It also doubled their win total from a year ago.

Early Sets all-Time Three-Point Mark at Saint Louis

Senior Hannah Early became the program's all-time leader in made three-pointers at Saint Louis, Feb. 15. The senior set the mark when she drilled home her third trey of the game in the third quarter for her 223rd career three-pointer, breaking Laura Murray's mark of 222 set from 2010-14.

Early has recorded three games this year hitting five shots in a game from downtown.

Early already holds the single season record with 74 triples, which she set a year ago during the 2014-15. She also had 63 during the 2013-14 campaign, good for fifth-most in a single season.

Early Goes Off For 24 Points, Ties Personal 3-Point Mark

Senior Hannah Early scored a gamehigh 24 points in her final home game, but it was not enough as VCU spoiled Davidson's Senior Day, Feb. 27.

Early tied her career-high with six triples, finishing 8-of-15 overall from the floor on her way to her third 20-point outing of the season and 16th of her career. With her 24-point outing, Early moved into fourth place all-time in scoring with 1,400 points. She scored 14 of those points in the first two quarters.

Sophomore Mackenzie Latt saw her 12game double-figure scoring streak come to an end in Davidson's regular season finale vs. VCU, Feb. 27. She was held to seven points, seven below her season average in the defeat. It was the first time she didn't score in double digits since a two-point effort vs. Saint Louis, Jan. 10, at home.

During the streak, Latt averaged 15 points and 7.6 rebounds per game. She shot 47.4 percent from the floor, while pocketing 24 steals (2 per game), blocking 11 shots and dishing out 23 assists.

The forward also recorded her first two double-doubles of the season, coming back-to-back at Dayton and vs. George Mason.

Bench Ties Season High Output

Led by the duo of Kianna Speight and Diona Johnson, the Davidson bench matched his season high for points at Saint Joseph's, Feb. 24.

Speight and Johnson scored 11 points each off the bench, as the Wildcats got a season-high tying 27 points from its bench. It matched the output it got in a win at UNC Wilmington, Nov. 28.

Dukes Ties Single Game School Record at the Charity Stripe

Senior Dakota Dukes had a career day at the free throw line in a home contest vs. Massachusetts, Feb. 21. In addition to recording her 17th career double-double, Dukes swished home a personal-best 13 free throws, and went on to tie her career high and match a single game school record with 16 attempts. She also attempted 16 shots in a game vs. Wofford, March 3, 2014.

The 13 made free throws were one off the record set by Kerry Brown vs. Wofford, Jan. 24, 1998.

Davidson Wins First-Ever A-10 Home Game; Halts 10-Game Home Conference Skid

Four of Davidson's five starters reached double figures in points to help lead the Wildcats to their second straight Atlantic 10 win with a 69-51 decision over visiting Fordham, Jan. 20. Davidson won the program's first-ever A-10 home game, while picking up their biggest win in league play. In addition, the 'Cats halted a 10-game conference losing streak at home and stopped their current four-game skid at Belk Arena.

Leading the way again was the duo of Dakota Dukes and Mackenzie Latt, as they both scored 19 points apiece.

It was a new era for most of Davidson College sports as it moved to the Atlantic 10 for the 2014-15 after a 74-year run in the Southern Conference (1936-88, 1991-2013).

"Davidson is thrilled to join the Atlantic 10 Conference to compete alongside some of the most dynamic Division I student-athletes in the country," Quillen said. "Our athletic teams – from men's basketball to women's lacrosse, from men's swimming to women's tennis – are ready for this new opportunity and we have the greatest confidence they will succeed."

According to most recent NCAA graduation rates, the Atlantic 10 ranked second among all Division I conferences, with 90 percent of their student-athletes graduating.

"The Atlantic 10 is a conference that gives Davidson the opportunity to be associated with and compete against institutions with significant profiles, both academically and athletically, while we continue to establish our national brand. This is a great opportunity to use athletics to further the goals and objectives of the college as we enhance the experience of our students," said Director of Athletics Jim Murphy.

The geographic footprint of the Atlantic 10 Conference covers eight different states and the District of Columbia for a total population of 75.3 million people (2010 Census).

The move allows 19 of Davidson's 21 sports to compete in the A-10, with the exception of football and wrestling. Football will remain in the Pioneer Football League which hosts non-scholarship programs, while wrestling will seek to continue its affiliation with the Southern Conference.




SARAH WOMACK PARHAM, INDUCTED IN 1996-97

Parham, Director of Psychosocial Club House, Catawba County Mental Health Services, became the first women's basketball player to be inducted into the Davidson Hall of Fame. She set 18 school records in her four-year career from 1977 through 1980 and she's the only female athlete whose jersey is retired. When she graduated in 1980, Womack's school records included most career points (1,249) and rebounds (601). Ranking ninth in career points, she's the all-time leader in points per game (16.7) and is third in made field goals (556). She holds the single-game record for attempted field goals (32) and ranks third in points per game for a single season at 19.1. She received the Rebecca Stimson Award in 1980 as the college's most outstanding female athlete.

ELIZABETH A. TANNER, INDUCTED IN 1997-98

Beth Tanner was the 1978 recipient of the Rebecca Stimson Award for her accomplishments in women's basketball and field hockey. A standout guard on the basketball team, Tanner graduated in 1978 as the Wildcat's all-time leading scorer in women's basketball with 792 points. Tanner also held single-game (10 against Guilford) and season (67 in 1976) records in assists, and the season record holder for steals with 60. Tanner averaged 11.3 points per game in her career from 1974 through 1978. She also at one time shared the single-game record for field goal percentage with .818 (9 for 11) against Catawba in 1974.



JENNIFER R. ROOS, INDUCTED IN 2004-05



A three-sport athlete at Davidson, Jennifer Roos excelled at whatever she did. She was an outstanding field hockey player during some of the squad's best seasons, earning the Stimson Award as Davidson's top female athlete to cap her career. As a freshman, she was named the team's defensive MVP. The following year, only one person was honored as the team MVP, and she earned it each of her final three seasons. Roos, a defender, scored nine goals and had one assist as a sophomore, the best offensive output of her career. She was named All-Deep South each of her first three campaigns, plus was All-Southeast Region as a junior.

One of the first field hockey players to be awarded a scholarship, Roos was a member of the lacrosse club team that went 12-3 before the sport was elevated to varsity status the year after she graduated. She was also a key player for the women's basketball team in its first season back as a varsity sport during her senior year. She played the point and was one of two players to start all 22 games. Her 77 assists led the team, as did her 64 steals. She also drained a three-pointer at the buzzer to lift the Wildcats to a 64-62 win over Winthrop.

CAROLYN KIRSCH RUMPEL, INDUCTED IN 2007-08

Davidson's first women's basketball player to be named SoCon Player of the Year (1997), Kirsch ranks second all-time in rebounding (878) and ranks sixth in scoring (1,370 points). The native of Heidelberg, Germany, earned first-team All-SoCon honors in 1997 and was named second-team all-league in 1996. She was named to the conference's academic honor roll twice and was a two-time winner of the Wildcat Award, given to the team's most valuable player. Kirsch led the 'Cats to a 29-23 overall record and two top-5 SoCon finishes in her final two seasons.



JENNIFER O'BRIEN, INDUCTED IN 2010-11

Second all-time scorer in school history with 1,510 points when she graduated, Jennifer O'Brien was named first-team All-SoCon in 1998 and 2000, and earned second-team honors in 1999. She was named to the SoCon All-Tournament Team from 1998-2000. O'Brien owns Davidson single-game records in steals and assists. She owns the school all-time marks for assists (588) and steals (368), and ranks in the top-10 in points per game, field goals made, 3-point field goals, 3-point field goal percentage, free throws and rebounds. She won the Wildcat Award for team MVP honors in 1998 and 2000 and the Rebecca Stimson award in 2000. Davidson posted a record of 61-47 during her four-year career.

CAROLYN KIRSCH, 1996-97

Carolyn Kirsch stepped up her level of play as a senior to lead the Southern Conference in scoring (16.3 ppg) and become the first Wildcat to be named SoCon Player of the Year.

The 5-11 guard from Heidelberg, Germany, was also among the league leaders in steals (2.3 spg), field goal percentage (47.7 percent) and rebounding (7.8 rpg) in 1996-97 while guiding Davidson to a then school record 15 wins. She reached the 20-point plateau eight times as a senior, including a team season-best 26-point performance in the 'Cats' 84-65 win over Western Carolina on Jan. 11, 1997.



MIDSON

SOPHIA ALEKSANDRAVICIUS, 2011-12

Sophia Aleksandravicius had a stellar junior campaign, leading the league in rebounding (8.9) and blocks (2.9), while ranking fourth in scoring (13.8), as she was named the SoCon Player of the Year by the coaches. She was also voted the Defender of the Year. Twice Aleksandravicius was named the player of the month during the regular season, while garnering first-team All-SoCon honors on both the coaches and media teams.


The 6-foot-5 forward from Pound Ridge, N.Y., led the Wildcats to a 22-10 record and helped the program capture its first regular season title with a school-best mark of 17-3 in the league. She finished the season scoring in double-digits in 29 games and registering 11 double-doubles.

SOPHIA ALEKSANDRAVICIUS, 2012-13 SOCON ATHLETE OF THE YEAR, 2012-13

Sophia Aleksandravicius, a three-time All-SoCon First Team pick in her career, made program history as she became the first Wildcat to earn a second Southern Conference Player of the Year honor, while also grabbing the Defender of the Year for a second straight season as she took home both awards in 2012-13. The 6-foot-5 foward led the SoCon in scoring (16.5), rebounding (9.9) and blocks (102- 2.9 per game / 10th in the nation), all career highs.

Aleksandravicius' award-winning season was not done there as she was named the SoCon Female Athlete of the Year, becoming the first female at Davidson to earn the prestigious award and the seventh Wildcat overall. In addition, the senior was honored with Davidson College's Rebecca A. Stimson Award for being the top student female-athlete.

Other accolades during her amazing senior campaign included being named the SoCon Player of the Year by CollegeSportsMadness.com and earning first-team honors. The publication named Aleksandravicius to the All Mid-Major Second Team. The senior was also a Full Court Mid-Major All-America Honorable Mention by fullcourt.com. She was a first-team SoCon



It was a record-setting career for Aleksandravicius, who was a two-time SoCon Player and Defender of the Year, and a three-time All-SoCon First Team member on both the coaches and media teams. During her senior year, she set seven school records, including points (1,878), rebounds (1,143) and blocks (339), while also setting six new single-season Wildcat records. The senior is the only women's player, and just the third basketball player at Davidson, to have over 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds in a career.

The forward also set a single-game blocks record with 10 on her way to collecting the program's first triple-double, Feb. 16, with 20 points, 10 rebounds and 10 blocks in home win vs. Furman.

Aleksandravicius put her name among the greats in the SoCon women's basketball record book during her four years. She finished ranked in the top-10 all-time in: points (10th), scoring (14.8-9th), field goals (5th), field goal attempts (4th), free throws (9th), free throw attempts (10th), rebounding (4th) and blocks (10-2nd-best single game, 102-2nd-best in single season, 339-1st).

The senior forward wrapped up her stellar career by scoring in double digits 104 times, including 28 20-point outings and a pair of 30-point games. Aleksandravicius registered 56 double-digit rebounding games during her career, with 22 of those coming in the 2012-13 season.

Aleksandravicius led Davidson to its second straight postseason appearance, and third overall, with a trip to the 2013 Women's NIT, where the Wildcats netted the program's first postseason victory. The senior tallied her 50th career double-double, and 20th of the season, with 27 points and 11 rebounds in guiding the 'Cats to a first-round win at Old Dominion, March 21. Her 20 double-doubles ranked 11th in the nation during the season.

The 2006-07 season for the Davidson women's basketball team will go down as one of the best, if not the best ever, in program history.

Twenty-three wins. A 10-game winning streak. A nine-game road winning streak. Eleven road wins in all. Ten home wins. Those were just a few of the many accomplishments that either set a new school record or tied one.

For all their hard work, Davidson put an exclamation point on their season when they found out Monday, Mar. 12, 2007 they would continue their historic season with the team's first-ever trip to postseason play when it earned an at-large bid to the Women's National Invitational Tournament.

It marked the first time ever the women's team had earned a postseason bid. They were part of WNIT history as for the first time, each of the nation's 31 conferences will be represented in the WNIT. The tournament expanded to 48 teams this year to accommodate an automatic berth for each of the conferences.

Davidson's opponent in its first trip to postseason play was the UAB Blazers. The two schools had faced each other just once, back on Dec. 16, 2001.

Playing in their first-ever postseason game, the senior trio of Jessica Mitchell, Brynn Kelly, and Tia Washington looked to

give the Wildcats their first career postseason win. Mitchell did all she could to keep the Wildcats within striking distance, draining a career-high 24 points by tying her career-best with nine field goals made and hit four of the Wildcats' 10 three-pointers. Three of her four three-balls came in the second half, including one with 14 seconds on the clock to bring the Wildcats within one, 78-77. She also matched her season-high with seven assists.

Kelly was the only other 'Cat in double figures as she registered her fourth career


double-double on 12 points and 11 rebounds. Davidson, as a team, hauled in a game-high 46 boards to win the rebounding margin, 46-39.

Trailing by 11 (67-56) with 8:24 left in the game, Davidson started its rally with a three-pointer from Mitchell on the right wing. The shot sparked a 16-5 run over the next five and a half minutes that saw the Wildcats knot things up at 72-all on yet another three-pointer, this time from freshman Alex Thompson on the left side. Junior Danielle Hemerka also canned back-to-back shots from downtown in the run and finished the contest with eight points, four boards and three assists.

A quick 5-0 run, three of the points coming from the Blazers' Diamond Rogers, gave UAB back the lead at 77-72 with just 36 seconds on the clock.

Davidson charged right back, getting a fade-away jumper by sophomore Kelly Gassie and Mitchell's three-pointer that closed the gap to one (78-77). Rogers and Britney Jones sealed the Wildcats' hopes though, hitting three of four free throws in the closing seconds and Mitchell's last-second three-pointer was off target for the final score of 81-77.

The Wildcats did not get many calls their way all evening as the fouls were 20-

11 and UAB stepped to the charity stripe 25 times (16-for-25) compared to Davidson's six trips (5-for-6).

Davidson used the hot hand of Mitchell in the first half to jump out to an early 11-10 advantage. Mitchell was perfect in the first half, draining all five of her shots from the field, including her only shot from downtown, and had two free throws for 13-first half points. The Wildcats as a team started the contest hitting eight of their first 12 shots, including two three-pointers. They finished the half nailing 15-of-29 shots from the floor for 51.7 percent and closed out the game shooting 44.9 percent.

UAB grabbed the lead back, 12-11, on the next possession on a layup from Shimena Moore and maintained at least a one-point lead all the way into halftime for a score of 39-36.

Sophomore Mercedes Robinson assisted off the bench during the Wildcats' second-half comeback with all eight her points coming in the second period. She also hauled in nine rebounds and picked up one of Davidson's season-high five blocks.





The Davidson women's basketball team made a return trip to the women's NIT after a record setting 2011-12 campaign. The Wildcats won their first regu-

lar season Southern Conference title with a school-best mark of 17-3, earning the automatic bid into the WNIT. The squad finished with 22 wins, one off the school record, while they rattled off a nine-game winning streak, again one off the 10-game set by the 2006-07 team that made the program's first postseason bid. The Wildcats also set a bench mark with a 12-1 home record at Belk Arena, including a record 9-1 record vs. the SoCon.

The 'Cats took their 22-9 record to Harrisonburg, Va., on Thursday, March 15, for a first-round matchup against the Dukes. It was the first-ever matchup against both teams.

James Madison entered the WNIT with a 24-7 record after reaching the semifinals of the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament. It marked only the second time since 2005 that the Dukes had not advanced to the championship game after winning the last two CAA Championships.

Junior Sophia Aleksandravicius, the SoCon Player of the Year as voted on by the coaches, scored a season-best 25 points and Davidson forced 22 turnovers, but was unable to overcome a 19-7 second-half run by James Madison in falling 64-49 in the

first round of the Women's NIT.

Davidson concluded it season at 22-10, one win away from the school-record, as it made its second-ever postseason appearance. James Madison (25-7) moves on and will play Wake Forest in the second round.

Aleksandravicius finished with 25 points, 17 of them in the second-half when she kept the Wildcats in the game. She added nine rebounds, two assists and two blocks

Down 24-20 at the break, the junior got Davidson's offense rolling by scoring seven straight points to open the new stanza, and a fastbreak bucket by Jasmine Calin after she leaked out on the break gave the 'Cats a 29-28 advantage with 14:13 to go. It would be the only lead Davidson had for the game.

JMU would score a quick six points and then continue their run to 10-2 for a 38-31 advantage. The spurt continued all the way out to 19-7 giving the Dukes the lead for good at 47-36 with under five minutes to go.

Lauren Whitehurst led the rally with eight of her 14 total points in the run. The Dukes overall had three reach double figures with Tarik Hislop scoring 15 points and Kirby Burkholder 11, nine of them on treys.

The lead was cut to nine at 49-40 on a layup by Aleksandravicius with 4:23 remaining, but four straight free throws by Hislop pushed the lead back to double digits and the Wildcats got no closer than 10 the rest of the way.

Despite starting the game just 3-for-16 from the field, Davidson stayed within striking distance thanks to its solid defense. The Wildcats forced nine turnovers early and trailed just 7-6 after a driving layin by Sarah Davis.

It became 12-6 after the Dukes' Hislop hit a short jumper, forcing Davidson to call a timeout. The Wildcats though, came right back with two quick buckets from Laura Murray and Aleksandravicius. The 'Cats leading scorer Murray, who came in averaging just under 15 points, was held to seven points for the game.

Aleksandravicius sparked a mini 8-2 run when she rattled off six straight points and Davidson cut a seven-point Duke lead down to one, 21-20, on a Barbara Sitton fastbreak layup off a Murray steal. Davidson ended up causing 14 first-half turnovers and pocketing three steals.

JMU hit its third three-ball of the half for a 24-20 score at the break.

The Davidson women's basketball team made it backto-back postseason years with a return trip to the women's NIT after a very strong 2012-13 cam-

paign. The Wildcats entered the first round of the tournament fresh off reaching the Southern Conference title game and were looking to make history with their first-ever postseason win.

Senior Sophia Aleksandravicius led the charge, dominating in the paint with her 20th double-double to pace four Wildcats in double figures and Davidson won the program's first postseason game with an 82-73 victory on the road at Old Dominion in the first round of the Women's National Invitation Tournament Thursday evening at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The two-time Southern Conference Player of the Year Aleksandravicius had 27 points and pulled in 11 rebounds for her 50th career double-double. She went a career-best 11-for-14 from the charity stripe as Davidson hit 20 shots at the line.

Laura Murray (16), Dakota Dukes (season-best tying 15) and Jasmine Calin (season-high 10) also registered double figures in points as Davidson moved to 22-12 on the season.

Barbara Sitton for the second game in a row hauled in double figures in rebounds, pulling in a career-best 11 on the defensive end. She also dished out seven assists and dravicius and Calin had 11 and eights points, respectively, in the half.

Dukes helped push the lead out 16 (51-35) with six points in the first four minutes of the second half. An Aleksandravicius' and-one play two minutes later gave the Wildcats its biggest lead of the game at 58-40 when she swished home the free throw.

Old Dominion went on a 15-7 run to cut the deficit to 10 (65-55) with 7:48 on the clock. Kelley scored the final seven points of the spurt.

Davidson came right back, pushing its lead out to 74-59 on a pair of free throws from Katrin Chiemeka with 4:06 left and did not allow the lead to slip below 11 the rest of the way until the final score.

Davidson took control of the contest with a 17-4 run to close the first half that turned a 25-24 deficit with 9:44 remaining into a 41-29 lead at the break. Aleksan-

After their historic first round win, Davidson was looking for win number two in the women's NIT second round. Their

opponent, cross-county rival Charlotte 49ers.

The Wildcats battled all the way to the end against its cross-county rival, but Charlotte pulled away with a 19-8 run in the final six minutes to capture a 72-60 victory in the second round of the Women's National Invitation Tournament Sunday afternoon at Halton Arena.

Davidson completed its outstanding season at 22-13, which included earning the program's first postseason win in the first round of the WNIT. Charlotte moved to 26-5 and advances to the third round of the WNIT to face the winner of the Florida/Winthrop contest.

Up 53-52, Charlotte broke free from Davidson by scoring 10 of the next 13 points during a five-minute stretch to give itself a 10-point lead with 1:10 remaining. Jennifer Hailey scored seven of those points for the 49ers on her way to a gamehigh 22 points.

A free throw by Sophia Aleksandravicius made it 65-56 with 59 ticks left, but the 49ers sealed up with the win by going 7for-8 at the charity stripe in the last minute, while the Wildcats were unable to

convert on offense, turning the ball over three times in the last 1:10.

Aleksandravicius capped off her amazing four-year Wildcat career with 18 points and five rebounds. The two-time SoCon Player of the Year finished her career setting seven all-time school records, including points (1,878), rebounds (1,143) and blocks (339).

Fellow senior Jasmine Calin had one of her best games of the season, scoring a season-high 12 points, nine of them coming in the first half. Hannah Early gave Davidson another spark off the bench scoring 13 points.

Senior Barbara Sitton had four points, five rebounds, four assists and three steals in her last game, while Katrin Chiemeka had two points on a pair of free throws.

Charlotte had three other players join Hailey in double figures. Hillary Sigmon and Jai Forney finished with 13 apiece, while Ny Hammonds scored 12 points and pulled in a gamehigh tying nine rebounds.

The 49ers shot 47.1 percent from the floor, including 50 percent in the second half, while Davidson was at 37.1 percent. Charlotte held a 43-31 edge on the boards, with both teams each pulling in 15 offensive rebounds.

The Wildcats erased a fourpoint halftime deficit with an 11-6 run, capped off by an and-one play from Aleksandravicius to start the second half and they

had their second lead of the game at 38-37. Charlotte countered though by breaking up a 40-all tie a few minutes later with a quick six for a 46-40 advantage at 11:02 on the clock.

The 'Cats never backed down, getting another three-point play from Calin to make it 50-49 and then when the 49ers had pushed its lead to 53-49, Early struck for a deep trey on the left wing to make it 53-52 with 6:47 left in the game.

Davidson stayed close after the opening tip, getting a driving layup on the baseline by Sitton to make it 8-7. Two triples by Hillary Sigmon doubled the 'Cats up later though at 20-10 with 12:04 left in the first


Five straight points, including a threepoint play from Calin, cut the deficit in half a few minutes later.

Then down 28-17 after a pair of Hailey free throws, part of her 13 first-half points, the 'Cats switched to a zone-defense and charged back with a 10-0 run. Sparking the run was six straight points from Early to get within one at 28-27 and under a minute to go. Charlotte took away a little of the momentum with the final three points to end the half up 31-27.


