On May 10, 2017, Davidson College Athletic Director Jim Murphy announced the hiring of Gayle Coats Fulks as the head coach for the Wildcat women's basketball program. She is the 12th head coach in the program's 38-year history.

Quick Highlights...

•In second year, went 17-15 for the most wins since 2012-13 and had best finish to date in the Atlantic 10 with a 10-6 mark for fourth place.

•Guided Davidson to its first postseason appearance since 2012-13 with an invite to the WBI, hosting Marshall, in 2018-19. It also won the program's first A-10 Tournament game with a first-round victory against St. Bonaventure.

•During second season, helped the Wildcats set three program A-10 records with a six-game overall win streak, a five-game road win streak and a three-game home win streak.

•Also set a program single-season record for made and attempted threes by going 216-for-713 to break the previous record of 180-of-542 set in 2007-08.

•Sarah Donovan and Justine Lyon earned the Most Improved Player and Sixth Woman of the Year awards in 2018-19.

•Doubled Davidson's win total from previous season in first year as a head coach, going 12-18 in 2017-18 and a program-best 7-9 in the A-10.

•Earned first career coaching victory with a 70-57 triumph at Western Carolina, Nov. 10.

•Was recognized as one of WBCA's Thirty Under 30 honorees after fourth season at Wake Forest in 2015-16. The award is given annually to up-and-coming coaches 30 years old and younger, to recognize their involvement in community service, mentorship and impact on others' professional manner and attitude as well as association involvement.

•During tenure at Wake Forest, the Demon Deacons earned back-to-back postseason bids to the Women's NIT in 2016 and 2017, reaching the second round both seasons.

• Graduated from Fairleigh Dickinson in 2007, where she was a four-year letterwinner for the Knights.

Coach History...

Davidson (17-15) made great strides during Fulks' second year, finishing tied for fourth in the A-10 standings after being picked to finish 11th in the preseason poll. The Wildcats went a program-best 10-6 in league play and won the program's first game in the A-10 Championship with a first-round victory against St. Bonaventure.

The Wildcats' 17 wins were the most since the 2012-13 season, with 10 of those wins coming at home. They led the A-10 in scoring (66.0 per game), turnover margin (+2.8) and offensive rebounds (13.9 per game). The 'Cats invite into the WBI was its fourth postseason appearance in program history.

Other stellar team highlights included setting a program single-season record for made and attempted threes by going 216-for-713 to break the previous record of 180-of-542 set in 2007-08, had four players average in double figures in points for the first time since 2001-02 and won the program's 450th win the first-round victory vs. St. Bonaventure.

Under Fulks' guidance, Sarah Donovan (second team), Justine Lyon (third team) and Katie Turner (third team) each earned a spot on the A-10 All-Conference teams, while Donovan was tabbed the Most Improved Player of the Year and Lyon was named the league's Sixth Woman of the Year.

It was a solid first year for Fulks as a head coach at Davidson during the 2017-18 season. The Wildcats doubled their win total from the previous season by going 12-18 overall and a program-best 7-9 in Atlantic 10 play. Fulks earned her first career coaching victory with a 70-57 triumph at Western Carolina, Nov. 10. She became the third Wildcat head coach in the program's

39-year history to start a career with a win. It was also Davidson's 10th straight win in the series vs. the Catamounts.

Along the way, other highlights included a home opening win vs. UNC Asheville, a thrilling win at High Point by overcoming a 19-point third-quarter deficit and a victory against cross-county rival Charlotte that snapped an eight-game losing streak in the series. Davidson set a new road winning streak mark in A-10 games, running off a three-game streak with wins at Richmond, St. Bonaventure and Rhode Island.

During Fulks first season, she saw senior Mackenzie Latt go over 1,500 career points and end her career third all-time in scoring to go with a second place finish in rebounds and made field goals. Latt was named to the A-10 All-Third Team, while Katie Turner earned a spot on the league's all-rookie team. Turner also set the single season record for made three-pointers with 75. Justine Lyon became the 20th Wildcat to reach 1,000 career points during Coats Fulks first season as well.

Fulks came to Davidson from Wake Forest University, where she spent the five years as an assistant coach under Jen Hoover. The last two years (2015-16 & 2016-17) Wake Forest earned at-large bids to the Women's NIT, reaching the second round both seasons during Coats Fulks tenure.

During the 2016-17 season, the Demon Deacons went 17-16 overall and earned a win over Bethune-Cookman in the first round of the WNIT before falling to Middle Tennessee State to end their season. Guard Alex Sharp became the second student-athlete under Fulks to be named to the Atlantic Coast Conference All-Freshman Team, joining fellow teammate Ariel Stephenson who garnered the award a year ago from the Blue Ribbon Panel and the league's coaches.

In addition to helping the Demon Deacons to consecutive NIT appearances the last two seasons, Fulks was recognized during the 2015-16 campaign as one of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's (WBCA)

Thirty Under 30 honorees. The award is given annually to up-and-coming coaches 30 years old and younger, to recognize their involvement in community service, mentorship and impact on others' professional manner and attitude as well as association involvement.

While on the bench for head coach Hoover for five seasons, Fulks assisted in all aspects of the program, from academics to recruiting, where she served as an integral part to the Demon Deacons putting together ranked recruiting classes each year on staff.

In her first season with the Deacs, she helped guide one of the top-scoring back-courts in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Point guard Chelsea Douglas led the team in scoring at 14.6 points per game, while Lakevia Boykin was right behind her at 14.4 points. The two combined to make 134 three-pointers on the season, with Douglas' 72 ranking as the third-most for a single-season in school history.

Fulks joined the Wake Forest staff after one season as an assistant coach at UNC Greensboro in 2011-12.

Fulks broke into the coaching ranks at Longwood University, where she was on staff from 2007-11. In her first season with the Lancers, they went 16-13, notching the program's best win total in its Division I era at the time.

Prior to her first collegiate job, Fulks served as the Assistant Video Coordinator during the 2007 season for the WNBA's New York Liberty, where she assisted with scouting reports and film exchange.

A four-year letterwinner at Fairleigh Dickinson, Fulks was a co-captain and member of the Northeast Conference All-Academic squad. She graduated in 2007 with a Bachelor of Science degree in business management.





Belk Arena, which seats 5,223 for basketball, has been the Wildcats' home since they started playing again in 1992-93.

In addition to the 5,223-seat John M. Belk Arena, the complex includes the Carl and Louise Knobloch Tennis Center, Cannon Natatorium, Dickson Administrative Wing and Finley Education Center, plus the Charles W. Parker Wrestling Room, a weight room, sports medicine center, four racquetball courts and one squash court. It also houses the athletic department offices.

Named in honor of the late John M. Belk '43 — a former captain of the Wildcats' teams, a Davidson College trustee for more than 15 years and former mayor of Char-

In 2011-12, Davidson had its best season ever at home. The Wildcats went a schoolrecord 12-1 and rattled off a seven-game win streak to start the year. It marked the ninth straight winning season on their home court.

2018-19 HIGHLIGHTS

The second season under head coach Gayle Fulks saw Davidson take big steps, reaching the quarterfinals of the A-10 Tournament and advancing to postseason play for the first time since the 2012-13 campaign. A few of the highlights from the 2018-19 season are below...

Most Wins Since 2012-13, Best Finish In A-10

Davidson finished 17-15, which were the most wins since the 2012-13 season and with 10 of those wins came at home. In addition, the Wildcats recorded a 10-6 A-10 record and finished tied for fourth for its best finish since joining the league in 2014-15.

4th Postseason Trip

After a successful regular season and run in the A-10 Tournament, the Wildcats earned an invite into the Women's Basketball Invitational for the first time. They faced off against Marshall in the first round in a home game, but the 'Cats fell in a down to the wire finish, 67-64.

It was Davidson's fourth all-time postseason appearance, with the other three appearances coming in the Women's National Invitational (WNIT). The 2012-13 season was Davidson's last postseason appearance.

Three 'Cats Honored With A-10 Postseason Awards

After leading Davidson to its best finish during its time in the Atlantic 10, the trio of senior Justine Lyon, and sophomores Sarah Donovan and Katie Turner were each honored by the league's coaches. Donovan was named the league's Most Improved Player of the Year and earned a spot on the A-10 All-Second Team, while Lyon was named the A-10 Sixth Woman of the Year as well as All-Third Team. Turner joined Lyon on the league's All-Third

Homecourt Advantage

Davidson did a great job during the 2018-19 season of defending their homecourt by going 10-5 (5-3 vs. A-10). It's the best record since going 12-1 during the 2011-12 season.

This year included a season-high five-game home win streak, which was the longest since an eight-game stretch that spanned from the end of 2011-12 season into the first four games of the 2012-13 campaign.

'Cats Win First-Ever A-10 Tournament Game

Davidson opened up a 27-point advantage and would lead by as many as 32 in the fourth quarter in rolling to its first-ever Atlantic 10 Women's Basketball Championship win with a 74-49 decision over 12th-seeded St. Bonaven-

Davidson raced out to a 35-8 lead with 7:45 to go in the second quarter, nailing 12 of its first 21 field goals, including 5-of-8 from behind the arc, and 6-for-8 at the free-throw line. It went into halftime up 20 (41-21) before pulling away at the end of the third quarter and the start of the fourth with a 16-0 run to go

Five players scored in double figures, led by Justine Lyon and Kianna Speight at 17 and 16 points, respectively.

Etching Names into the Single-Season Record List

A few Wildcats put their names in the Wildcat top-10 single season record books for the 2018-19 season. Katie Turner, who set the single-season mark for triples last year with 75, finished with 138 assists for the 5th-most in a season, while Kianna Speight and her 71 made three-pointers finished third. Speight's 211 attempts finished tied for the most in a season from behind the arc and Turner's 196 was the second-most.

Sarah Donovan's 293 rebounds ranked second in the top-10, while her 170 made field goals were good for ninth-most.

Davidson Holds Off Saint Louis on Senior Day, 60-57

Senior Justine Lyon scored a game-high 19 points and Davidson came back in the second half in pulling out a tightly-contested 60-57 win on Senior Day against Saint Louis, Feb. 23. Lyon hit six field goals and swished home a season-best 6-of-8 free throws.

The 'Cats, who snapped a five-game skid vs. the Billikens in the series, sealed up the win by swishing home four straight free throws in the last eight seconds, two each by Cassidy Gould and senior Kianna Speight. Saint Louis hit a three-pointer after Gould's two free throws to make it 58-57 with six ticks left, but Speight calmly hit two free throws with one-tenth of a second left to secure the win.

A 19-1 run that spanned from the 5:43 mark of the third quarter to the 7:19 mark in the fourth quarter helped the Wildcats overcome an eight-point deficit. They would go up by 10 later in the fourth, 54-44, before battling it out down the stretch.

'Cats Overcome Slow Start, Down Fordham on the Road for First Time

Sarah Donovan (6) and Justine Lyon (9) combined for 15 points in the fourth quarter and Davidson overcame an early 15-point deficit in pulling out a 60-56 comeback win, Jan. 27. The win was the Wildcats' first on the road in the series and halted a three-game skid in the series as well.

Down 42-37 entering the fourth quarter, the Wildcats ran off a 16-4 run to grab a 53-46 lead with 2:17 left and held off a couple late threepointers from the Rams to move to 5-1 in A-10 play and 11-8 overall. Lyon and Donovan tal-lied 11 combined points during the winning


Donovan registered her eighth double-double of the year on 12 points and 12 rebounds, while adding four assists. Lyon finished with 15 points and six rebounds off the bench.

In addition, the 'Cats' defense forced 29 turnovers on the day, getting 17 steals and turning all those miscues into a season-high 35 points. They also scored a season-high 21 fastbreak points.

'Cats Hit the 80 Mark For the Fourth Time

Davidson reached the 80-point mark for the fourth time this year when it rolled to an 80-61 win at home vs. La Salle, Feb. 3. The Wildcats went 4-0 when reaching the 80-point mark. It's the most 80 point games since the 2013-14 season when the Wildcats reached the mark six times, going 5-1.

The 'Cats other 80-point games during the 2018-19 season came against Queens (W, 80-47), Clemson (90-80) and Presbyterian (W, 83-56).

Several Winning Streaks Halted by UMass

Davidson's 70-58 setback vs. UMass, Jan. 20 saw several winning streaks come to an end. The Wildcats had their season-high four-game winning streak end along with their six-game league streak dating back to the end of last season, which was a program-best since joining the A-10. The 'Cats also saw a five-game home win streak halted as well as their three-game A-10 home win streak end.

The five-game home win streak was the longest since an eight-game stretch that spanned from the end of 2011-12 season into the first four games of the 2012-13 campaign. The 'Cats six-game league streak in the A-10 was a program-best and the longest since a sixgame streak during the 2012-13 season in the Southern Conference.

Davidson Earns First-Ever A-10 Opening

Win, Downing George Mason
Davidson earned its first Atlantic 10 opening win since joining the league in 2014-15 by scoring a 67-59 win against George Mason, Jan. 6.

The Wildcats improved to 13-13 all-time in league openers, while moving to 9-6 in league home openers. They are 1-4 in A-10 openers, while going 12-9 during its 21-year run in the Southern Conference.

The win against George Mason featured 15 lead changes and eight ties, Davidson broke free by opening the fourth quarter with a 10-4 run on its way to securing a 67-59 win.

Wildcats Take on First Top-10 Team Since 2007-08

Davidson faced its first top-10 team since the 2007-08 when it faced No. 9 N.C. State, Dec. 30. The Wildcats kept it close early, going into halftime tied at 27-all and even holding a brief 30-27 lead to start the third quarter. But, the Wolfpack answered with a 19-2 run and outscored the 'Cats 24-9 in the quarter on its way to a 75-45 win.

The last top-10 team Davidson faced was No. 7 Georgia, Dec. 9, 2007.

Six in the Books For First Time Since 2009

For the first time since the 2008-09 season, Davidson put six scorers in double figures during an 83-56 win at home vs. Presbyterian, Dec. 18. Kianna Speight led the way with 18 points,

Davidson Scores Strong Road Win at Clemson, 90-80

Senior Justine Lyon scored a season-high 31 points and Davidson used an early fourthquarter run to pull away in claiming a 90-80 road win against Clemson. It was the Wildcats second straight win in the series and their first win against an ACC foe since defeating Virginia, Dec. 28, 2013. In addition, the 90 points were the most scored this season and the most since a 90-point effort in a win vs. Wofford, Dec. 13, 2009.

Down 57-56 near the end of the third quarter, Lyon nailed a buzzer-beating three-ball from deep at the top of the key for a 59-57 lead. The momentum carried into the start of the fourth quarter as Davidson opened with a 13-4 run to go up 72-61 at the 6:31 mark. It never looked back in leading by as many as 14 twice on its way to the 10-point victory.

Balanced Offense Guides 'Cats To Win vs. W&M

Davidson snapped a three-game skid with a well-balanced offense behind five double-digit scorers in taking a 76-65 victory at home against William & Mary Saturday, Nov. 24. Justine Lyon led the way with 17 points off the bench for the 'Cats (3-3), while Ally Welling

and Kianna Speight each dropped in 14 points. Sarah Donovan had her third double-double of the season with 10 points and 10 rebounds, while adding five assists and three steals. Katie Turner rounded out the five double-figure scorers with 11 points.

Speight and Turner broke up a close game with back-to-back triples to turn a 65-63 lead into a 71-63 advantage with under two minutes

2-0 Start With BIG Win at Charleston Southern

Davidson had its first 2-0 start to the season for the first time since the 2013-14 campaign after scoring a 72-34 win at Charleston South-

The 38-point win was the Wildcats biggest since a 40-point (88-48) victory against UNCG, Jan. 23, 2013. In addition, the 34 points allowed was the least given up since holding Samford to 38, Feb. 23, 2013.

'Cats Start Season With Win Over Queens, 80-47

Sophomore Katie Turner led four Wildcats in double figures with a game-high 21 points and the Davidson women's basketball team won its season opener, 80-47, for the second straight year, Nov. 7.

The 33-point win was the biggest since a 40-point triumph vs. UNCG, Jan. 23, 2013.

Joining Turner in double digits was Kianna Speight (14 points), Cassidy Gould (12) and Kelly Fitzgerald (11, career-high). Sarah Donovan crashed the boards with a game-high 12, one off her personal best. She also dished out a career-high five dimes.

It was a new era for most of Davidson College sports as it moved to the Atlantic 10 for the 2014-15 after a 74-year run in the Southern Conference (1936-88, 1991-2013).

'Davidson is thrilled to join the Atlantic 10 Conference to compete alongside some of the most dynamic Division I student-athletes in the country," Quillen said. "Our athletic teams – from men's basketball to women's lacrosse, from men's swimming to women's tennis - are ready for this new opportunity and we have the greatest confidence they will succeed."

According to most recent NCAA graduation rates, the Atlantic 10 ranked second among all Division I conferences, with 90 percent of their student-athletes graduating.

The Atlantic 10 is a conference that gives Davidson the opportunity to be associated with and compete against institutions with significant profiles, both academically and athletically, while we continue to establish our national brand. This is a great opportunity to use athletics to further the goals and objectives of the college as we enhance the experience of our students," said Director of Athletics Jim Murphy.

The geographic footprint of the Atlantic 10 Conference covers eight different states and the District of Columbia for a total population of 75.3 million people (2010 Census).

The move allows 19 of Davidson's 21 sports to compete in the A-10, with the exception of football and wrestling. Football will remain in the Pioneer Football League which hosts non-scholarship programs, while wrestling will seek to continue its affiliation with the Southern Conference.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL HALL OF FAMERS



SARAH WOMACK PARHAM, INDUCTED IN 1996-97

Parham, Director of Psychosocial Club House, Catawba County Mental Health Services, became the first women's basketball player to be inducted into the Davidson Hall of Fame. She set 18 school records in her four-year career from 1977 through 1980 and she's the only female athlete whose jersey is retired. When she graduated in 1980, Womack's school records included most career points (1,249) and rebounds (601). Ranking ninth in career points, she's the all-time leader in points per game (16.7) and is third in made field goals (556). She holds the single-game record for attempted field goals (32) and ranks third in points per game for a single season at 19.1. She received the Rebecca Stimson Award in 1980 as the college's most outstanding female athlete.

ELIZABETH A. TANNER, INDUCTED IN 1997-98

Beth Tanner was the 1978 recipient of the Rebecca Stimson Award for her accomplishments in women's basketball and field hockey. A standout guard on the basketball team, Tanner graduated in 1978 as the Wildcat's all-time leading scorer in women's basketball with 792 points. Tanner also held single-game (10 against Guilford) and season (67 in 1976) records in assists, and the season record holder for steals with 60. Tanner averaged 11.3 points per game in her career from 1974 through 1978. She also at one time shared the single-game record for field goal percentage with .818 (9 for 11) against Catawba in 1974.

JENNIFER R. ROOS, INDUCTED IN 2004-05

A three-sport athlete at Davidson, Jennifer Roos excelled at whatever she did. She was an outstanding field hockey player during some of the squad's best seasons, earning the Stimson Award as Davidson's top female athlete to cap her career. As a freshman, she was named the team's defensive MVP. The following year, only one person was honored as the team MVP, and she earned it each of her final three seasons. Roos, a defender, scored nine goals and had one assist as a sophomore, the best offensive output of her career. She was named All-Deep South each of her first three campaigns, plus was All-Southeast Region as a junior.

One of the first field hockey players to be awarded a scholarship, Roos was a member of the lacrosse club team that went 12-3 before the sport was elevated to varsity status the year after she graduated. She was also a key player for the women's basketball team in its first season back as a varsity sport during her senior year. She played the point and was one of two players to start all 22 games. Her 77 assists led the team, as did her 64 steals. She also drained a three-pointer at the buzzer to lift the Wildcats to a 64-62 win over Winthrop.

CAROLYN KIRSCH RUMPEL, INDUCTED IN 2007-08

Davidson's first women's basketball player to be named SoCon Player of the Year (1997), Kirsch ranks second all-time in rebounding (878) and ranks sixth in scoring (1,370 points). The native of Heidelberg, Germany, earned first-team All-SoCon honors in 1997 and was named second-team all-league in 1996. She was named to the conference's academic honor roll twice and was a two-time winner of the Wildcat Award, given to the team's most valuable player. Kirsch led the 'Cats to a 29-23 overall record and two top-5 SoCon finishes in her final two seasons.





JENNIFER O'BRIEN, INDUCTED IN 2010-11

Second all-time scorer in school history with 1,510 points when she graduated, Jennifer O'Brien was named first-team All-SoCon in 1998 and 2000, and earned second-team honors in 1999. She was named to the SoCon All-Tournament Team from 1998-2000. O'Brien owns Davidson single-game records in steals and assists. She owns the school all-time marks for assists (588) and steals (368), and ranks in the top-10 in points per game, field goals made, 3-point field goals, 3-point field goal percentage, free throws and rebounds. She won the Wildcat Award for team MVP honors in 1998 and 2000 and the Rebecca Stimson award in 2000. Davidson posted a record of 61-47 during her four-year career.




LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CAROLYN KIRSCH, 1996-97

Carolyn Kirsch stepped up her level of play as a senior to lead the Southern Conference in scoring (16.3 ppg) and become the first Wildcat to be named SoCon Player of the Year.

The 5-11 guard from Heidelberg, Germany, was also among the league leaders in steals (2.3 spg), field goal percentage (47.7 percent) and rebounding (7.8 rpg) in 1996-97 while guiding Davidson to a then school record 15 wins. She reached the 20-point plateau eight times as a senior, including a team season-best 26-point performance in the 'Cats' 84-65 win over Western Carolina on Jan. 11, 1997.

SOPHIA ALEKSANDRAVICIUS, 2011-12

Sophia Aleksandravicius had a stellar junior campaign, leading the league in rebounding (8.9) and blocks (2.9), while ranking fourth in scoring (13.8), as she was named the SoCon Player of the Year by the coaches. She was also voted the Defender of the Year. Twice Aleksandravicius was named the player of the month during the regular season, while garnering first-team All-SoCon honors on both the coaches and media teams.

The 6-foot-5 forward from Pound Ridge, N.Y., led the Wildcats to a 22-10 record and helped the program capture its first regular season title with a school-best mark of 17-3 in the league. She finished the season scoring in double-digits in 29 games and registering 11 double-doubles.

SOPHIA ALEKSANDRAVICIUS, 2012-13 SOCON ATHLETE OF THE YEAR, 2012-13

Sophia Aleksandravicius, a three-time All-SoCon First Team pick in her career, made program history as she became the first Wildcat to earn a second Southern Conference Player of the Year honor, while also grabbing the Defender of the Year for a second straight season as she took home both awards in 2012-13. The 6-foot-5 foward led the SoCon in scoring (16.5), rebounding (9.9) and blocks (102- 2.9 per game / 10th in the nation), all career highs.

Aleksandravicius' award-winning season was not done there as she was named the SoCon Female Athlete of the Year, becoming the first female at Davidson to earn the prestigious award and the seventh Wildcat overall. In addition, the senior was honored with Davidson College's Rebecca A. Stimson Award for being the top student female-athlete.

Other accolades during her amazing senior campaign included being named the SoCon Player of the Year by CollegeSportsMadness.com and earning first-team honors. The publication named Aleksandravicius to the All Mid-Major Second Team. The senior was also a Full Court Mid-Major All-America Honorable Mention by fullcourt.com. She was a first-team SoCon All-Tournament pick after guiding Davidson to the SoCon Championship game for just the second time in program history. During the regular season, Aleksandravicius was a three-time SoCo

ond time in program history. During the regular season, Aleksandravicius was a three-time SoCon Player of the Week honoree, and took home the league's player of the month award in January and February to give her four for her career.


It was a record-setting career for Aleksandravicius, who was a two-time SoCon Player and Defender of the Year, and a three-time All-SoCon First Team member on both the coaches and media teams. During her senior year, she set seven school records, including points (1,878), rebounds (1,143) and blocks (339), while also setting six new single-season Wildcat records. The senior is the only women's player, and just the third basketball player at Davidson, to have over 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds in a career.

The forward also set a single-game blocks record with 10 on her way to collecting the program's first triple-double, Feb. 16, with 20 points, 10 rebounds and 10 blocks in home win vs. Furman.

Aleksandravicius put her name among the greats in the SoCon women's basketball record book during her four years. She finished ranked in the top-10 all-time in: points (10th), scoring (14.8-9th), field goals (5th), field goal attempts (4th), free throws (9th), free throw attempts (10th), rebounding (4th) and blocks (10-2nd-best single game, 102-2nd-best in single season, 339-1st).

The senior forward wrapped up her stellar career by scoring in double digits 104 times, including 28 20-point outings and a pair of 30-point games. Aleksandravicius registered 56 double-digit rebounding games during her career, with 22 of those coming in the 2012-13 season.

Aleksandravicius led Davidson to its second straight postseason appearance, and third overall, with a trip to the 2013 Women's NIT, where the Wildcats netted the program's first postseason victory. The senior tallied her 50th career double-double, and 20th of the season, with 27 points and 11 rebounds in guiding the 'Cats to a first-round win at Old Dominion, March 21. Her 20 double-doubles ranked 11th in the nation during the season.

POSTSEASON HISTORY



The 2006-07 season for the Davidson women's basketball team will go down as one of the best, if not

the best ever, in program history. Twenty-three wins. A 10-game winning streak. A nine-game road winning streak. Eleven road wins in all. Ten home wins. Those were just a few of the many accomplishments that either set a new school record or tied one.

For all their hard work, Davidson put an exclamation point on their season when they found out Monday, Mar. 12, 2007 they would continue their historic season with the team's first-ever trip to postseason play when it earned an at-large bid to the Women's National Invitational Tournament.

It marked the first time ever the women's team had earned a postseason bid. They were part of WNIT history as for the first time, each of the nation's 31 conferences will be represented in the WNIT. The tournament expanded to 48 teams this year to accommodate an automatic berth for each of the conferences.

Davidson's opponent in its first trip to postseason play was the UAB Blazers. The two schools had faced each other just once, back on Dec. 16, 2001.

Playing in their first-ever postseason game, the senior trio of Jessica Mitchell, Brynn Kelly, and Tia Washington looked to give the Wildcats their first career postseason win. Mitchell did all she could to keep the Wildcats within striking distance, draining a career-high 24 points by tying her ca-

reer-best with nine field goals made and hit four of the Wildcats' 10 three-pointers. Three of her four three-balls came in the second half, including one with 14 seconds on the clock to bring the Wildcats within one, 78-77. She also matched her season-high with seven assists.

Kelly was the only other 'Cat in double figures as she registered her fourth career double-double on 12 points and 11 re-

bounds. Davidson, as a team, hauled in a game-high 46 boards to win the rebounding margin, 46-39.

Trailing by 11 (67-56) with 8:24 left in the game, Davidson started its rally with a three-pointer from Mitchell on the right wing. The shot sparked a 16-5 run over the next five and a half minutes that saw the Wildcats knot things up at 72-all on yet another three-pointer, this time from freshman Alex Thompson on the left side. Junior Danielle Hemerka also canned back-to-back shots from downtown in the run and finished the contest with eight points, four boards and three assists.

A quick 5-0 run, three of the points coming from the Blazers' Diamond Rogers, gave UAB back the lead at 77-72 with just 36 seconds on the clock.

Davidson charged right back, getting a fade-away jumper by sophomore Kelly Gassie and Mitchell's three-pointer that closed the gap to one (78-77). Rogers and Britney Jones sealed the Wildcats' hopes though, hitting three of four free throws in the closing seconds and Mitchell's last-second three-pointer was off target for the final score of 81-77.

The Wildcats did not get many calls their way all evening as the fouls were 20-11 and UAB stepped to

the charity stripe 25 times (16-for-25) compared to Davidson's six trips (5-for-6).

Davidson used the hot hand of Mitchell in the first half to jump out to an early 11-10 advantage. Mitchell was perfect in the first half, draining all five of her shots from the field, including her only shot from downtown, and had two free throws for 13-first half points. The Wildcats as a team started the contest hitting eight of their first 12 shots, including two three-pointers. They finished the half nailing 15-of-29 shots from the floor for 51.7 percent and closed out the game shooting 44.9 percent.

UAB grabbed the lead back, 12-11, on the next possession on a layup from Shimena Moore and maintained at least a one-point lead all the way into halftime for a score of 39-36.

Sophomore Mercedes Robinson assisted off the bench during the Wildcats' second-half comeback with all eight her points coming in the second period. She also hauled in nine rebounds and picked up one of Davidson's season-high five blocks.



POSTSEASON HISTORY



The Davidson women's basketball team made a return trip to the women's NÎT after a record -

setting 2011-12 campaign. The Wildcats won their first regular season Southern Conference title with a school-best mark of 17-3, earning the automatic bid into the WNIT. The squad finished with 22 wins, one off the school record, while they rattled off a ninegame winning streak, again one off the 10game set by the 2006-07 team that made the program's first postseason bid. The Wildcats also set a bench mark with a 12-1 home record at Belk Arena, including a record 9-1 record vs. the SoCon.

The 'Cats took their 22-9 record to Harrisonburg, Va., on Thursday, March 15, for a first-round matchup against the Dukes. It was the first-ever matchup against both

James Madison entered the WNIT with a 24-7 record after reaching the semifinals of the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament. It marked only the second time since 2005 that the Dukes had not advanced to the championship game after winning the last two CAA Championships.

Junior Sophia Aleksandravicius, the SoCon Player of the Year as voted on by the coaches, scored a season-best 25 points and Davidson forced 22 turnovers, but was unable to overcome a 19-7 second-half run by James Madison in falling 64-49 in the first round of the Women's NIT.

Davidson concluded it season at 22-10,

one win away from the school-record, as it made its second-ever postseason appearance. James Madison (25-7) moves on and will play Wake Forest in the second round.

Aleksandravicius finished with 25 points, 17 of them in the second-half when she kept the Wildcats in the game. She added nine rebounds, two assists and two blocks.

Down 24-20 at the break, the junior got Davidson's offense rolling by scoring seven straight points to open the new stanza, and a fastbreak bucket by Jasmine Calin after she leaked out on the break gave the 'Cats a 29-

JMU would score a quick six points and then continue their rur to 10-2 for a 38-31 advantage. The spurt continued all the way out to 19-7 giving the Dukes the lead for good at 47-36 with under five min utes to go.

Lauren Whitehurst led the rally with eight of her 14 total points in the run. The Dukes overall had three reach double figures with Tarik Hislop scoring 15 points and Kirby Burkholder 11, nine of them on treys.

The lead was cut to nine at 49-40 on a layup by Aleksandravicius with 4:23 remaining, but four straight free throws by Hislop pushed the lead back to double digits and the Wildcats got no closer than 10 the rest of the way.

Despite starting the game just 3 for-16 from the field, Davidson stayed within striking distance thanks to its solid defense. The Wildcats forced nine turnovers early and trailed just 7-6 after a driving layin by Sarah Davis.

It became 12-6 after the Dukes' Hislop hit a short jumper, forcing Davidson to call a timeout. The Wildcats though, came right back with two quick buckets from Laura Murray and Aleksandravicius. The 'Cats leading scorer Mur-

ray, who came in averaging just under 15 points, was held to seven points for the



POSTSEASON HISTORY



The Davidson women's basketball team made it back-toback postseason years with a return trip to

the women's NIT after a very strong 2012-13 campaign. The Wildcats entered the first round of the tournament fresh off reaching the Southern Conference title game and were looking to make history with their first-ever postseason win.

Senior Sophia Aleksandravicius led the charge, dominating in the paint with her 20th double-double to pace four Wildcats in double figures and Davidson won the program's first postseason game with an 82-73 victory on the road at Old Dominion in the first round of the Women's National Invitation Tournament Thursday evening at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The two-time Southern Conference Player of the Year Aleksandravicius had 27 points and pulled in 11 rebounds for her 50th career double-double. She went a career-best 11-for-14 from the charity stripe as Davidson hit 20 shots at the line.

Laura Murray (16), Dakota Dukes (season-best tying 15) and Jasmine Calin (season-high 10) also registered double figures in points as Davidson moved to 22-12 on the season.

Barbara Sitton for the second game in a row hauled in double figures in rebounds, pulling in a career-best 11 on the defensive end. She also dished out seven assists and pocketed four steals.

Davidson as a team pulled in a seasonhigh 57 rebounds, including a season-best 20 25-24 deficit with 9:44 remaining into a 41-29 lead at the break. Aleksandravicius and Calin had 11 and eights points, respectively, in the half.

Dukes helped push the lead out 16 (51-35) with six points in the first four minutes of the second half. An Aleksandravicius' andone play two minutes later gave the Wildcats its biggest lead of the game at 58-40 when she swished home the free throw.

Old Dominion went on a 15-7 run to cut the deficit to 10 (65-55) with 7:48 on the clock. Kelley scored the final seven points of the spurt.

Davidson came right back, pushing its lead out to 74-59 on a pair of free throws from Katrin Chiemeka with 4:06 left and did not allow the lead to slip below 11 the rest of the way until the final score.

NIT second round. Their opponent, cross-county rival Charlotte 49ers.

The Wildcats battled all the way to the end against its cross-county rival, but Charlotte pulled away with a 19-8 run in the final six minutes to capture a 72-60 victory in the second round of the Women's National Invitation Tournament Sunday afternoon at Halton Arena.

Davidson completed its outstanding season at 22-13, which included earning the program's first postseason win in the first round of the WNIT. Charlotte moved to 26-5 and advances to the third round of the WNIT to face the winner of the Florida/Winthrop contest.

Up 53-52, Charlotte broke free from Davidson by scoring 10 of the next 13 points during a five-minute stretch to give itself a 10-point lead with 1:10 remaining. Jennifer Hailey scored seven of those points for the 49ers on her way to a game-high 22 points.

A free throw by Sophia Aleksandravicius made it 65-56 with 59 ticks left, but the 49ers sealed up with the win by going 7-for-8 at the charity stripe in the last minute, while the Wildcats were unable to convert on offense, turning the ball over three times in the last 1:10.

Aleksandravicius capped off her amazing

four-year Wildcat career with 18 points and five rebounds. The two-time SoCon Player of the Year finished her career setting seven all-time school records, including points (1,878), rebounds (1,143) and blocks (339).

Fellow senior Jasmine Calin had one of her best games of the season, scoring a season-high 12 points, nine of them coming in the first half. Hannah Early gave Davidson another spark off the bench scoring 13 points.

Senior Barbara Sitton had four points, five rebounds, four assists and three steals in her last game, while Katrin Chiemeka had two points on a pair of free throws.

Charlotte had three other players join Hailey in double figures. Hillary Sigmon and Jai Forney finished with 13 apiece, while Ny Hammonds scored 12 points and pulled in a game-high tying nine rebounds.

The 49ers shot 47.1 percent from the floor, including 50 percent in the second half, while Davidson was at 37.1 percent. Charlotte held a 43-31 edge on the boards, with both teams each pulling in 15 offensive rebounds.

The Wildcats erased a four-point halftime deficit with an 11-6 run, capped off by an and-one play from Aleksandravicius to start the second half and they had their second lead of the game at 38-37. Charlotte countered though by breaking up a 40-all tie a few minutes later with a quick six for a 46-40 advantage at 11:02 on the clock.

The 'Cats never backed down, getting another three-point play from Calin to make it 50-49 and then when the 49ers had pushed its lead to 53-49, Early struck for a deep trey on the left wing to make it 53-52 with 6:47 left in the game.

Davidson stayed close after the opening tip, getting a driving layup on the baseline by Sitton to make it 8-7. Two triples by Hillary Sigmon doubled the 'Cats up later though at 20-10 with 12:04 left in the first half


Five straight points, including a threepoint play from Calin, cut the deficit in half a few minutes later.

Then down 28-17 after a pair of Hailey free throws, part of her 13 first-half points, the 'Cats switched to a zone-defense and charged back with a 10-0 run. Sparking the run was six straight points from Early to get within one at 28-27 and under a minute to go. Charlotte took away a little of the momentum with the final three points to end the half up 31-27.

Playing in its first postseason game since 2013, Davidson fought to the last second before seeing its season end, 67-64, against Marshall in

the first round of the Women's Basketball Invitational Wednesday evening inside John M. Belk Arena.

The Wildcats capped off a successful season with a 17-15 mark and its first postseason experience since reaching the second round of the Women's National Invitational in 2012-13. Marshall (17-14) advances to play Appalachian State in the second round of the WRI

Davidson kept within striking distance the whole second half and nearly pulled out the win. It grabbed its only lead, 64-63, on a Justine Lyon putback with 38 seconds to go. But it was quickly answered by Marshall, much as it had done each time the Wildcats were close to going ahead, with a driving layup from Taylor Pearson at 34 seconds.

Davidson took a timeout to advance the ball and out of the break, Cassidy Gould missed a layup but Lyon again got an offensive rebound and hit the putback, only to have it taken away after a questionable walking call with 15 seconds remaining.

Marshall then hit two of three free throws to make it 67-64 and Lyon's last-second three-point attempt rimmed out at the buzzer to end the game.

In her final collegiate game, Lyon scored 11 points and hauled in seven rebounds to go with two assists. Fellow classmate Kianna Speight had a solid final game as well with 14 points, draining three triples for 71 on the season which is third-most in a single season.

Gould led the 'Cats with 16 points to go with eight rebounds, while Sarah Donovan

pulled in 15 rebounds (seven on offense) and had seven points. Katie Turner finished with eight points, six assists and three steals.

The Thundering Herd were paced by Shayna Gore's 19 points, followed by Khadaijia Brooks with 15 points, and Taylor Pearson and Taylor Porter had 11 each.

Davidson erased a 44-32 deficit in the third quarter with a 17-6 run to end the quarter and get within one at 50-49. It would get back within one point three different times (57-56, 61-60 and 63-62) in the fourth quarter before taking the lead at 64-63 in the closing seconds.

Both teams used the three-point shot, each hitting 10 on the night. Marshall finished shooting 45.8 percent, with a 16-of-33 mark in the first two quarters, including 7-of-16 from three-land. The 'Cats were held just 33.3 percent (23-of-69) shooting for the game.

Marshall, which won the first quarter 17-15, used a 12-6 run to open the second quarter and go up 29-21 with under five minutes to go. 
