A-10 Tournament ♦ May 3-6, 2018 ♦ Richmond, Va.

Records: Davidson reached the A-10 Tournament by going 5-4 in league play to earn the fifth seed for the third year in a row. Overall the Wildcats went 10-7 on the year, winning their last three regular season games.

Head Coach: Davidson's Kim Wayne is in her 10th season with an overall mark of 84-91. She has guided the Wildcats' to an 18-17 record in their four years in the Atlantic 10.

The Tourney: This is Davidson's fourth year in the A-10 and is making its third appearance in the league tournament.

Last Tourn. Results: The Wildcats made the semis after a dramatic comeback vs. George Mason, 14-13, before falling to UMass 21-6.

Up Next: If the 'Cats advance, they would again play top-seeded UMass this season on Friday at 1 p.m. in the semifinals.

WILDCATS SET FOR THIRD TRIP TO ATLANTIC 10 LAX CHAMPIONSHIP

The Opening Draw Control

Davidson (10-7, 5-4 A-10) reached the A-10 Lacrosse Championship by earning the fifth seed after going 5-4 during the regular season in league play. The 'Cats won their final three games of the regular season to help reach the tournament. They will face off against fourth-seeded VCU and should the 'Cats advance, they would take on top-seeded UMass Friday.

A-10 Tournament

This is Davidson's third trip to the A-10 tournament in its fourth year in the conference. The championship was expanded to six teams in 2016 for the first time.

Last year saw the 'Cats reach the semifinals for the first time with a dramatic comeback win against George Mason, 14-13, before fall to top-seeded UMass 21-6. The Wildcats have a 1-2 record in the tournament.

The All-Time Series/Last Meeting vs. VCU & UMass

Thursday's contest vs. VCU will mark the fourth meeting all-time, with Davidson holding a 2-1 advantage. In this year's meeting, the Wildcats led 11-8 with under 16 minutes to go before the Rams scored the final four goals including the game-winner 39 seconds into overtime.

If Davidson advances to the semifinals, it will be seeking its first win in the series vs. UMass in what would be the sixth meeting. The Wildcats went on the road in this year's matchup and were held scoreless in the first half and dropped a 14-4 decision.

NEWPORT, NEWS, Va. — Entering its fourth year in the Atlantic 10, the Davidson women's lacrosse team was picked by the league's coaches to finish fifth in the preseason poll as announced recently by the league office.

The Wildcats received 57 points, getting picked behind George Mason and Saint Joseph's (74 points each) and ahead of La Salle (45).

Nine-time defending champion Massachusetts, ranked 18th in the first Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association poll, was picked to repeat as league champions for the 10th straight year with 96 points and six of the 10 first-place votes. Richmond was picked second with 94 total points and received the other four first place votes.

Davidson has faced all nine of the A-10 teams at least once during its program history, including the VCU Rams, which started their lacrosse program in 2016.

The 2018 Atlantic 10 Women's Lacrosse Championship will be held May 3-6 at Richmond's Robins Stadium. The Championship will feature an extended bracket of six teams for the third year.

Entering their 10th year under head coach Kim Wayne, the Wildcats are coming off an 8-10 campaign a year ago. They went 5-4 in league play and reached the league tournament for the second time. The 'Cats won the program's first-ever tournament game with a dramatic come-from-behind win against George Mason, 14-13. Davidson's run came to an end in the semifinals with a setback to UMass.

The Wildcats return 15 letterwinners with the addition of seven freshmen. Leading the way is the senior duo goalie Rose Woolson and defender Rachel Hianik along with junior Sarah Kopp, who were each tabbed captains for the season.

Record at Davidson: 66-74

Davidson College Athletic Director Jim Murphy announced the hiring of Kim Wayne on July 23, 2008 as the next head coach for the Wildcat women's lacrosse program. She will begin her 10th year for the 2018 season as head coach, as she looks to help the Wildcat continue their success as they enter their fourth year in the Atlantic 10.

In 2017, Wayne guided the Wildcats to an 8-10 record and a 5-4 league mark, while the program won its first-ever A-10 Tournament game with a huge 14-13 comeback victory against George Mason.

For the second year in a row, three Wildcats were honored by the A-10 with Nicole Pettiglio earning a spot on the all-second team at midfield, while Shayne Antolini earned a spot on the league's all-rookie team. Sarah Kopp was honored for her success on the field and in the classroom by being named to the all-academic team to become the first Wildcat to earn a spot on the team.

Under the guidance of Wayne, the senior duo of Pettiglio and Annie Brockett left their names in the record books. Pettiglio had a career and team-high 55 draw controls, good for sixth-most in a single season, and ended with 86 total to place her 10th all-time. Brockett, a two-time A-10 All-Tournament Team pick, left Davidson with her name in the record books, ranking seventh in career goals (102) and just outside the top-10 in points with 123. Her 50 goals this year were tied for third-most all time in a single season.

It was another solid season in 2016 for Wayne and the Wildcats, who reached the A-10 Tournament for the first time in just their second year in the league. Davidson registered a 5-4 record in A-10 play to earn the fifth seed, closing the year out strong by winning three of its final five league games. Despite falling to Saint Joseph's in the first game of the tournament, 10-7, the 'Cats had a respectable 8-9 overall record on the year to improve by two wins from the previous season.

A trio of Wildcats were honored by the A-10 with defender Holly Thomas and goalie Rose Woolson each earning a spot on the second team, and Sarah Kopp getting one of the 12 spots on the all-rookie team. It was Thomas' second time on the all-second team.

Wayne coached another one of the Wildcats' all-time program leaders as Emma Sissman graduated in 2016 as the all-time leader in draw controls with 237. Sissman, who set the single-season draw controls mark at 75 in 2014, also finished her career ranked in the top-10 all-time in goals with 133 and points at 153. In 2014, Sissman ranked third in the single-season record book with 50 goals, one of just three Wildcats to reach that mark in a season.

The 2015 season marked a new beginning for Wayne and the lacrosse program as it moved to the A-10 for its 22nd season. Davidson went 6-10 overall on the year and 3-5 in conference play during Wayne's seventh season. The Wildcats collected their first league win with a 9-7 win at home over George Mason. Of the 'Cats' five A-10 defeats in A-10, three of them were decided by a single goal.

Wayne saw four players earn all-league honors at the end of the season. Emily Rademacher and Holly Thomas were each named to the A-10 All-Second Team, while the freshmen duo of Paige Farrar and Rachel Hianik were two of the 12 first-year players to be named to the A-10 All-Rookie Team. For the second year in a row, Wayne saw one of the all-time great players in program history graduate under her leadership as Emily Cooke finished her storied career. Cooke left Davidson second all-time in points and set the career assist mark with 123. Cooke along with freshman Christine Molinari each won Davidson's first A-10 weekly awards, earning player and rookie of the week honors, Feb. 16.

It was another successful year and a memorable one in 2014 as Wayne collected her 50th career win during the season and became the program's all-time winningest coach on her way to coaching the Wildcats to a school-best 12 wins (12-7). She earned her 50th victory in 13-9 road win at Longwood, April 25. Earlier in the month, the 2013 Big South Coach of the Year won her 47th career game to set the program mark for most coaching wins, surpassing Mary Schwartz, who had collected 46 during her eight year tenure (1996-2003).

Wayne again coached one of the top players in the Big South when freshman Katherine Rueger was named the league's freshman of the year. She was also named to the All-Big South Second Team along with Ann Fucigna and Emily Cooke. Earning a spot on the first team under Wayne in 2014 was Paige Logan, Emma Sissman and Emily Rademacher. Logan was named to the Big South All-Academic Team.

The Wildcats went 6-1 in their final season in the Big South and reached the championship game for the second year in a row, before falling to High Point. In addition to the school-record 12 wins, Davidson rattled off a new school-best nine-game win streak, topping the seven set a year ago. It also set a single-season record for draw controls (247) to surpass the previous mark of 235 set in 2011. Individually, Wayne saw Sissman set the all-time record for draw controls in just two years and set a new single season mark with 75.

Wayne saw three players earn Big South Weekly awards with Rueger taking home the rookie of the week twice, Fucigna and Sissman earning the offensive player of the week once each and Logan earning a defender of the week award.

Wayne had the privilege to coach one of the program's all-time best players in Fucigna. The senior graduated from Davidson holding the all-time records for goals (192) and points (261), while ranking third in career assists with 69.

Wayne's fifth season in 2013 was one of the best in program history. She guided the Wildcats to the inaugural Big South Regular Season Title with a perfect 7-0 mark in league play and they finished with an 11-7 overall record, tying for most wins in a year. Davidson also set at the time a program-best with a seven-game win streak during the season. For her great accomplishments, Wayne was named the Big South Coach of the Year, the first coach's honor of her career. She coached the Big South Offensive Player of the Year Emily Cooke, while seeing seven 'Cats earn first or second team honors. Davidson advanced to the Big South Championship game before falling in a closely-battled contest to High Point, 9-7. Three Wildcats were named to the all-tournament team.

In addition, a few other records fell during Wayne's fifth campaign. Davidson tied a school bench mark for home wins with eight and broke the single-season record for goals with 229, which had been set in 2012 with 222. Wayne saw Cooke set the
